Efforts of various types are being made by this country to make permanent and effective contributions to the recovery of Korea and in so doing to strengthen democracy in Asia and world peace. A national organization known as the American-Korean Foundation was established last year to raise funds throughout the country in order to ease the hardships and suffering of the Korean people and to help Korea demonstrate the democratic way of life in Asia. The assistance given from its fund raising campaign of last year was so beneficial that once again it is conducting a campaign to raise \$3,900,000 from fifty cities in the country. Cleveland's quota has been established as \$100,000.00. President Eisenhower has appointed Henry C. Alexander, President of J. P. Morgan and Company, to act as national chairman. Mr. Alexander has asked me to serve as the Cleveland chairman, which I have accepted. A previous campaign was conducted in 1953 with Walter Tuohy, President of C. & O., as chairman. The honor of enlisting a group of representative citizens to assist in the direction of the local effort has been accorded me. I am inviting you to join with me in this vital and commendable cause. It is planned to use professional help and we will have a small advance from the National Office to be charged against the first proceeds of the campaign. A modest budget will be prepared for carrying on the campaign, but it is not anticipated that any expenditures outside of rent and professional help, postage, stenographic help and other such expenses will be incurred.

I am certain that you are aware of the urgency for this country to do everything possible to let our Korean allies know how deeply we feel towards them and that in a democracy we stand by those who fight with us to resist Communist aggression. The Foundation is serving our national interest. President Eisenhower is fully behind the effort and we are informed that we may count upon his support.

I am most hopeful that you will call or send me a note of acceptance at your earliest convenience to serve with me in this effort.
