Dear Hiram: I sent you a wire yesterday advising you that Governor Lehman called me in regard to my letter with reference to Dr. Silver. The Governor says it would be a mistake to have anyone see President Roosevelt at this time as several of our people have already talked to him on this subject and something is being done. Governor Lehman says he would be very happy to see Rabbi Silver at any time, but he thinks it would be more advisable for him to see his brother, Judge Lehman who is following up this situation very closely and is vitally interested in the matter. The Governor says the Judge knows Rabbi Silver very well and has a great deal of regard for him. He thinks it would be advisable for Silver to get in touch with the Judge and arrange to see him at his convenience. The Governor is quite interested and wants to do everything he possibly can for the interest of the cause. Please get in touch with Dr. Silver and ask him to write to Judge Lehman and arrange for a meeting with him. If he prefers that I make the errangements I shall be glad to do so, although I am not acquainted with the Judge but know his brothers. If he wants me to make the arrangements, I shall have to do so through the Governor or someone who knows him very well. A shall await further advice from you in the matter. UNTERWYER DEMANDS LEGAL ACTION AGAINST SALE OF GERMAN MERCHANDISE ILLEGIBLY STARPED

Legal action against the sale of merchandise imported from Germany with the stamp of the country of origin obliterated or made illegible in violation of the laws of the United States for the purpose of overcome gethe increasing sales resistance to the products of the Reich, is demanded by Samuel Untermyer, leader of the world boycott movement against Germany and Honorary President of the Rational Boycott Committee of the American League for the Defence of Jewish Rights, in a letter to Philip Eltinge, Collector of Customs of the Port of New York. The Letter was made public by Ezekiel Rabinowitz, Secretary of the American League, which is the American branch of the international Jewish Conference at Amsterdam, Holland, fro the enforcement of a world-wide boycott against Germany.

hr. Untermyer wrates as fallows:

"As President of the World Jewish Economic Federation that was organized a few weeks ago in Amsterdam and as Honorary President of the Boycott Committee of the American Leagu for the Defense of Jewish Rights, my attention has just beencalled by a lady to a recently made purchase of gloves from Gimbels. The gloves were made in Germany and are required by Law to be <u>legible</u> stamped with the name of the country of manufacture. They are being so stamped that it is impossible for the purchaser to know what they are buying.

"I enclose one of the gloves, and am asking that the law be enforced so that purchasers shall not be further deceived.

"Unless relief can be secured through you against this manifest fraud upon the Gorernment and thepeople of this country, we shall have no other alternative than to place the situation before the presecuting authorities at Washington and New

York."

Following is the letter addressed by Mr. Untermyer to Gimbel Brothers:

"I am herewith enclosing copy of a letter I have today written to the Collector of Customes of the Port of New York.

"The sale by you of gloves made in Germany without being properly marked is as you know a violation of the Federal law, punishable by heavy fines and long term imprisonment. If your Company insists on continuing to sell goods made in Germany you should at least comply with the law.

"I Greatly regret to have to write in these terms but it must have been evident to your Buyer and others in your business that these unreadable marks - even with the aid of a magnifying glass - are not a compliance with the law.

"I am not now discussing the ethics of your Company in selling goods made in Germany under existing conditions, or the effect it may have upon your general business when the World Jewish Economic F deration, recently organized in Amsterdam, perfects its machinery in this country, that is somethig for you to decide. As before stated, however, I strongly protest against the violations of the law invoved, and will do my best to see that public attention is directed toward them."

August 11, 1933. Mr. Ezekiel Rabinowitz. 729 Seventh Ave., New York, N.Y. My dear Mr. Rabinowitz: In reply to your telegram permit me to say that either September 7 or September 12 is an acceptable date for me. Sunday, September 10 is a difficult date as our School and Temple activities go on at that date. You ought to consider, however, weether Sunday is a better day for a conference, whether it is not a more convenient day for out of town people who may want to attend the conference, and whether Sunday evening is not a better time for a mass meeting. I would make every effort to attend this Sunday conference. You would then hold the conference on Sunday morning or afternoon, or both, and the mass meeting in the evening. Please consult with Mr. Untermyer, make the final decision on the date and let me know. With all good wishes, I remain Very sincerely yours. AHS: BK

August 14, 1944. Mr. Ezekiel Rabinowitz, 729 Seventh Ave. . New York, N.Y. My dear Mr. Rabinowitz: Permit me to acknowledge receipt of your letter and telegram. Have you definitely scheduled the conference for September 12th? A letter from Mr. Untermyer and a statement in the J.D.B. leads me to think so. I hope to be present. I am glad that Dr. Margoches has begun his publicity on Macy's. I wonder if Mr. Untermyer has already spoken to Mr. Straus. The attack should be kept up vigorously. If Macy's yields, other organizations of its character will follow suit. You should invite to our conference, representatives of all Jewish trade organizations, of employers and employees. I wish that you would talk over with Mr. Untermyer the advisability of getting the orthodox rabbis of America to pronounce an official ban upon German made goods. This would have a tremendous psychological effect. I am glad to know that you are going to make a visit to several cities in order to organize delegations for the conference. I wired you this morning that while I wrote to a few people in Buffalo, Pittsburgh, Columbus and Chicago, it would nevertheless be advisable for you to visit these cities. It will not be necessary for you to come to Cleveland as I am organizing a delegation here myself. In Buffalo,

Rabbi Fink is in complete sympathy with the cause, wants to attend the conference and will bring some business men with him. That is true also of Dr. Louis Mann of Chicago. I wrote to Mr. Fred Lazarus of Columbus, but have not, as yet, heard from him. I plan to be in Chicago around September 3rd and will get in touch with a few business men their in person.

Mr. Samuel Untermyer, President of the World Jewish Economic Federation, recently organized in Amsterdam to promote the boycott against German goods, ships and shipping, and which is being organized in every country in the world, when asked today to comment on the cabled report of the speech of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise at Prague before the American Jewish Congress, in which Dr. Wise announces himself in favor of the boycott, said:

"The announcement comes better late than never. It is gratifying to learn that Rabbi Wise has at last decided to support the boycott that was inaugurated and is being prospecuted by the cur Federation and to enlist the American Jewish Congress under cur boycott banner. He, with his American following, can become an important factor, and it is hoped that he will now direct his energies in assisting our Federation toward that end.

Mr. Deutsch, the President of the American Jewish Congress, has from the outset favored the boycott, which is supported by 99% of the members of the Congress but has thus far withheld his open support doubtless cut of deference to Rabbi Wise, who at one time seemed opposed to it.

I suspect that when Dr. Wise met at Prague the delegates from other countries and found that World Jewry as well as non-Jews unanimously favorant the boycott as the only effective weapon, the pressure became too strong for him to withstand.

the leadership of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights, which inaugurated and is prosecuting the boycott, the voice of American Jewry will be unanimous, as it should be. Whether they do so, or continue to hold back as did the American Jewish

ongress, until now, the movement will go forward all the same, but we shall hope for and expect, from now on, an aggressive united front against the common enemy.

My dear Sir:

My attention has just been called to a statement from this morning's Jewish Morning Journal to the effect that there is to be an emergency meeting of the National Executive Committee of the American Jewish Congress on Sunday August 20th at the Hotel New Yorker, over which you are to preside, and that, in addition to the Boycott, this meeting will take up a series of measures in connection with the struggle against Nazi Germany, including an appeal to the League of Nations.

My deep interest in this movement, which was originated by the American League for the defense of Jewish Rights and has now been extended, as the result of the World Conference in Amsterdam, to the World Jewish Economic Federation with a bureau in London, is, inmy judgment, in danger of being greatly injured by the activities of independent and conflicting organizations and interests, all having in view the same result but lacking co-ordination and cohesion.

At the outset of our movement, I tried to induce Rabbi Wise to cooperate with us, but without satisfactory result. The conference at Amsterdam was, on the contrary, greatly embarrassed by an interview that was given out by Prof. Cohn of the University of Amsterdam, who gave Dr. Wise as authority for his statement that our movement was negligivle and that I represented nobody but myself. This interview was widely published in Germany as showing that discord had already broken out among the ranks of the American Jews.

If we are to succeed, this sort of thing should be stopped and I had understood from Mr. Deutsch and Dr. Margoshes, in an interview at my office, that the American Jewish Congress would coordinate its activities with ours as the pioneers in this field. I hope that this will be done and that all attempts at rivalry will be ended for the sake of the cause in which we are so deeply concerned.

Weeks ago, in public addresses and elsewhere, I announced that we were formulating an appeal to the League of Nations, and stated specifically the grounds of our proposed action. Prior to that time I had discussed the subject in London with our Secretary-General of the League of Nations. Here again there is danger of scattering our forces, which must at all costs be avoided.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have your letter of August 14th.

We took into consideration your suggestion that it will be easier for out of town delegates to attend the conference on a week end instead of a week day. The date of the conference is definitely set for Sunday, September 10th. It will be held at the Hotel Astor and we plan to have two sessions. One from 11 to 2 and one from 3 to 6. The conference will be wound up with a Testimonial Dinner in honor of Untermyer on the occasion of his becoming president of the World Jewish Econmic Federation. Needless to say, we count on you as the main speaker.

We had to decide on a dinner instead of a massmeeting, because the latter would have had to be held at the Madison Square Garden and that would have led us into an expense of at least \$3500.00, which we haven't.

You write in your letter "I hope to be present". You are 'frightening me to death'. What do you mean by "you hope to be present". The conference was your suggestion and in order to make it a real success you will have to be in New York at least one day in advance. Which means, on Saturday.

Mr. Stern of Philadelphia insists that prior to the conference on Sunday, you, he, Untermyer and one or two more shall meet and go over the plans and map out the program, the budget and the necessary resolutions which we want the conference to pass upon and accept. Of course, by that time the office will have ready all the estimates you asked for.

If you want your group, which you will bring along with you, to receive official invitations signed by Untermyer, let me have their names and addresses, and they will receive them.

I am enclosing herewith copy of a letter which was written by Mr. Untermyer to Gimbel Bros. He is also negotiating with Mr. Straus of Macy's.
