

My dear Dr. Silver:

I have spent the weekend at our National Executive Meeting and came into the office today to check into the overall American Zionist Fund picture.

I was very thrilled when the first item which greeted me was a \$1000 check from the Cleveland Zionist Society earmarked for Kfar Silver.

At yesterday's Executive Meeting it was finally agreed to go out for \$250,000 to \$300,000 in loans, so that we may expedite the building program in Kfar Silver andbring it up to its anticipated 320 student budget much sooner than would be possible if we were to wait for the contributions to come in. Of course, we have to increase our AZF receipts in order to pay off these loans over the next five years, but it is heartening to realize that the ZOA is still capable of mustering real effort when needed. As of this writing, a substantial amount has been pledged and some few thousands have already been realized.

It is indeed most heartening to know that you yourself are taking part in this drive.

JOINT STATEMENT OF

ISRAEL GOVERNMENT TOURIST CORP. AND AMERICAN EXPRESS CO.

The Israel Government Tourist Corporation and American Express Company representatives have had discussions in Jerusalem resulting in a program for joint promotion of travel to Israel. American Express undertook to reorganize and improve its representation in Israel. Its agencies will be enlarged and modernized in order to provide full range of services to an increased number of both local and foreign customers.

The Israel Government Tourist Corporation stated: "We are pleased with the constructive outcome of these recent discussions. American Express is promoting travel to Israel, and we are confident that as a result of this new promotion effort and the improved representation of American Express in Israel, results greater than heretofore will be accomplished."

The joint promotion campaign will include advertising, window displays in American Express offices in the United States and around the world, posters, publicity and a variety of other promotion activities jointly financed by the Tourist Corporation and American Express. This campaign will stress both the traditional values of Israel as the Land of the Bible and the new sun and sea vacation attractions which are being developed in Israel. The Tenth Anniversary celebrations have proved to be a strong stimulus to Israel tourism.

STATEMENT OF CONFERENCE OF PRESIDENTS

After reading the joint statement of the American Express Company and the Israel Government Tourist Corporation issued earlier today in Jerusalem, the presidents of the 17 major American Jewish organizations, who several months ago mentioned American Express in their pamphlet "A Report on the Arab Boycott Against Americans" made the following comment today:

"It is a happy outcome. We are confident that the new joint plans of the Israel Government Tourist Corporation and the American Express Company will be as beneficial to American Express as it will to the development of Israel tourism.

"The action of American Express exemplifies the best traditions of the American business community. It strengthens the unhampered flow of international trade and commerce, free of any extreneous considerations."
