Dear Dr. Silver:

At the September 27th meeting of the Executive Committee of the Christian Council on Palestine, a unanimous resolution instructed us to send you warmest greetings on the occasion of the Holiday Season. We express to you our high hopes that this message will manifest our oneness with the Jewish people in all their aspirations.

Throughout the entire Christian world there are countless co-religionists who, with us, will stand before God in supplication that the horrible brutalities visited upon your people will cease and justice again reign supreme.

We are doing our utmost to arouse the concern of our Christian clergy and laity so that an equitable solution may speedily be found to grant a refuge to the great people who wander homeless and stateless across the wartorn continent of Europe. This is one way in which Christian churches and their constituency may bear the responsibility and unwillingness to act promptly.

We shall do all we can in these coming months and years to stem the tides of anti-Semitism. Furthermore, we shall throw all our efforts into the struggle for a homeland where your stricken millions may again find the dignity and stature which are so rightfully theirs. This action is in obedience to the religious imperatives of the Judaeo-Christian tradition, but it is more than that - it is our partial payment to you of the enormous debt we owe for the priceless contributions of Judaism to our Christian heritage.

On these High Holy Days, we send our sincere good wishes to all our Jewish brothers here in America and throughout the world. We join hands with you in proclaiming our common faith in the destruction of the evil forces which swarm over the world today, and we anticipate ultimate victory for justice and truth.

This means that millions of homeless and hunted Jews in Nazi-dominated Europe have no place to which they may escape from the ravages of Hitleriam. We of the Christian Council on Palestine are so deeply concerned about this matter that we are urging action on the part of our members. We know that you want the facts. In order to make our members aware of the problem, we are sending you this pamphlet entitled "Shall the Door Be Shut?" I trust you will read this brochure carefully and determine upon a course of action which seems most appropriate for your community. We shall communicate with you later to enlist your aid in a campaign for the abrogation of the White Paper of 1939. If you have any questions concerning these issues. or if we can be of any aid to you in arousing public opinion in your local community, both Dr. Atkinson and I would appreciate hearing from you. Dear Mr. Hoffmann:

We have no opinion that we can give you on the question that you have put in your letter of April 27 with reference to American church sponsorship of political Zionism and its potential dangers to the missionary approach of said churches to the Moslem world. As far as we have any idea on the subject it is the feeling that missionary efforts will in no way be affected.

If we may use an analogy, when the American troops overcame Vichy control in Algiers the problem was presented for the restoration of citizenship for the Jews in that country, which the Cremieux becree had granted them in the 1850s. The Vichy Government had revoked this Decree and had put in a modification of the German Nuremberg law which made outlaws of the Jewish citizens in that country. Strenuous objections were raised to restoring the Jewish rights as they existed under the Cremieux Decree on the ground that this would create a revolt among the Arabs. However, when our Covernment did act favorably and the Cremieux Decree was restored, there was no rouble of any sort.

A similar situation, we feel, exists with respect to the threats of trouble in Palestine. It is our impression that the rank and file of the Arabs in Palestine are far less disturbed about the prospects of Jewish settlement than many of their leaders want the world to believe. Because of this we feel, therefore, that whatever action is taken it will not seriously disturb the good relations which missionaries have established throughout the Near East. The aims of the Zionists are not imperialistic and we only seek to obtain elementary justice for our stricken people.

Our leaders are particularly favorable to the plan for an informal non-public conference with some of the foreign mission representatives of your churches who carry on the work in Moslem lands and our organization. I am in a position to assure you that if a date is set some of our outstanding leaders will be quite ready to meet with you for the purpose of a frank and open discussion, which undoubtedly will prove helpful.

What do you think of such a proposal? It would at least afford opportunity for informal exchange on opinions and might serve to eliminate some of the prevalent anxiety regarding the matter.
