There is no doubt in my mind that perfidious Albion is out to destroy the Jewish National Home once and for all. In this grave emergency I consider it my duty to offer to the Zionist Organization my services in whatever capacity you may deem advisable. I intend to return to Toledo Tuesday evening. I can be reached there at the address given below. Dear Sir:

May I express my personal gratification - and the appreciation of my colleagues - for the most excellent editorials which have been appearing in your newspaper recently on the subject of Palestine. A great many newspapers in this country feel very much the same as you do, for editorials in the same vein as yours have been appearing in the nation's press these past few weeks.

I know you will be interested to know that your editorial of February 7 (Ireland of 1947?) was reproduced in a folder recently published by this office. This folder was given a wide circulation which included members of Congress, newspaper and radio commentators and other molders of public opinion in the United States. I am enclosing a copy for your information.

In your editorial "Ireland of 1947" you quoted a cable dated May 24, 1920, relevant to the situation in Ireland, which, making a substitution in names, might have been sent out today from Palestine. In the same vein, may I quote the following passage from the Declaration of Independence:

"Refusing to encourage immigration, sending swarms of officers to harass our people, keeping standing armies in times of peace, and rendering the military superior to the civil power, quartering large bodies of troops among us, protecting them from punishment when they commit marder against our inhabitants; for abolishing the free system of English laws, for burning our towns and destroying the lives of our people, for inciting domestic insurrection among us."

The similarity to present-day events in Palestine is inescapable. "The more the world changes, the more it is the same thing" - is no idle proverb. Again may I reiterate my gratitude for your able and just comments. I am Respectfully yours, William D. Kaufman dk
