My dear Mr. Shapiro:

I am enclosing herewith the letter of resignation of Arthur Lourie which is to be presented to the meeting of the Executive on Wednesday. I am also enclosing copy of a letter which I received from the British Ambassador. You may wish to show it to Mr. Tuvim.

The pamphlet on the Arab participation in the World War is an effective one. What distribution are you giving to it? A substantial number should also be sent immediately to London for distribution by Manson to the proper people in the British Government and others.

You ought to be drafting an Ad along the lines we discussed. We may wish to have such an Ad appear in the principal papers of the country within a week or ten days as the London Conference gets moving. The central idea should be; a Conference is now being held to ostensibly settle the problem of Palestine. The problem of Palestine could have been settled a long time ago if Great Britain had lived up to its obligations, etc. etc. Failure to do so has caused the Jewish people hundreds of thousands of lives and has brought about the tragic conditions which now prevail in Palestine. What is Great Britain planning to do now? Will it devise a plan which will live up to the obligations which it voluntarily assumed when it took over the mandate for Palestine, etc. etc.? Will it follow the vision which inspired its own statesman during the First World War, who visioned the establishment of a Jewish State in Palestine, to help solve the problem of Jewish national homelessness . . . Will it now rise to a similar high level of statesmanship and complete what was then so nobly begun . . . All the promises which were made to the Arabs have been fulfilled. Five Arab states have been established since the last World War, with the aid of Great Britain and the Allies, in an area of 1,200,000 square miles. Will the promises made to the Jewish people be now fulfilled in that "little notch" of 10,000 square miles, etc.? The Ad should be written on a high plane—dignified, impressive; not querulous or bitter, not with the intention of denouncing but of demanding justice and of appealing to reason and conscience.

Perhaps we should try a fresh hand at writing this Ad. James G. McDonald may be a good man, or Marvin Lowenthal or Milton Steinberg. It might

perhaps be well to give the assignment to all three and then select the best of the three. Please attend to this at once.

Such an Ad may serve as a background and the "go signal" for the editorials which we are trying to have appear in American papers.

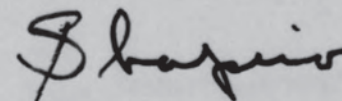

MEMORANDUM

To Dr. Abba Hillel Silver

Date September 5, 1946

From Harry Shapiro

Attached are the minutes of the meeting of the Executive held in Washington--August 7, 1946--as prepared by Mr. Lourie. I did not want to have these minutes circulated without you having the opportunity of seeing them. The minutes are a very fair resume of the transcript of the meeting as taken in Washington.

It was my personal contention that this transcript was incomplete because I recalled that N.G. was asked the question, "Did you see any government official yet?" His reply was, "No." I felt that this should be included in the minutes to indicate that Goldmann not only violated his agreement, but to add to the bargain he failed to tell the truth.

Of course the minutes as written completely condemn Goldmann's actions and if it is agreeable to you we will send out these minutes as they are written. If there are any changes you desire, we shall be glad to have your reaction.

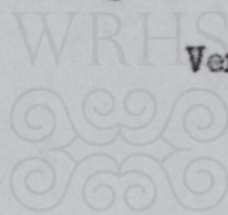

We wish to thank you for your letter to the American Zionist Emergency Council Chapter of the Social Service Employees Union and express our appreciation for the interest you have shown in our negotiations. With reference to this Chapter's letter to you, the following clarification of information contained therein is submitted.

Before Mr. Harry L. Shapiro's departure for Basle in November, 1946, he offered to this chapter increases which the staff felt were unacceptable in view of the tremendous increases in the cost of living. Mr. Shapiro then, in the course of future negotiations, mentioned the possibility of negotiating with some one other than himself in his absence, implying, however, that increases closer to those requested by the union chapter could not be obtained until after the Zionist Congress. In view of this situation, the staff decided not to take any action until Mr. Shapiro's return.

In reference to the third paragraph of the previous letter, which states that management offered "approximately 11 percent for twenty of its oldest employees and nothing for the others," this statement was intended to mean that nothing for the others was offered as of contract date. Mr. Shapiro did offer a wage increase for the other members on staff upon their anniversary date of one year's service with the organization.

At the time that negotiations reached a difficult stage, Mr. Shapiro did offer arbitration of the dispute. It was the belief of this chapter that it was not necessary to invite outside arbitration, but that in view of the past history of good relations between the S.S.E.U. and the Council, an amicable and satisfactory agreement should be a possibility between the two parties.

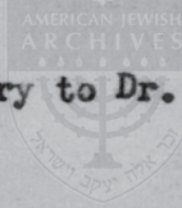
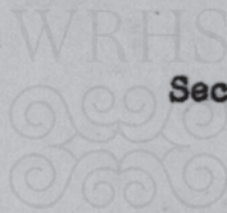
