My dear Pete: I was waiting until I knew that you had returned to your desk before writing you more formally, knowing that Herbert Mayer has contacted you by telephone. Here is the story: At the Post-Conference meeting of the Executive Board, at which I presided in the absence of Rabbi Silver, it became evident to us that Harry Margolis might not be able to carry on effectively. There was some discussion of appointing an assistant to the Treasurer, and I suggested your name. This suggestion was unanimously and enthusiastically approved by the members of the Board. In the meantime, when Harry died and Mayer telephoned to me, I immediately designated you as acting Treasurer. When Mayer telephoned Marcuson, Marcuson informed him of the decision of the Executive Board to ask you to become assistant to the Treasurer This I interpreted to be a mandate from the Executive Board authorizing your appointment as acting Treasurer in the emergency. Mayer in the meantime urged me to inform the bank, authorizing you to act in that office, which I did, as per the letter of July 22, copy of which you have. After some difficulty in reaching him, Mayer finally contacted Rabbi Silver, who have his entire approval to the action that had been taken. Sa you might consider this a formal notification and request for you to act as Treasurer, and you may feel free to act accordingly. Knowing your spirit and your readiness to serve, I felt confident that we may have your wholehearted cooperation. We had to act quickly, as you are well aware, and there was no naed duplicating telephone calls when Herbert Mayer informed me that he had spoken with you over the long distance phone and secured your gracious acceptance. I have requested the auditor of the Conference to make a complete audit of the finances of the Conference as of October 1st and to make same available to you, Abraham Feldman, Sidney Regner and Isaac Marcuson, in preparation for the Executive Committee Meeting which is to be held later in the month. The finances of the Conference have in recent months become quite involved.



Dear Ikes

You have seen George Zeppin's humorous (???) and lengthy reply to me in answer to my letter of January 27th raising "moral" and "legal" issues. I just don't understand his reaction and before I answer him, I want to cool off for about a week or so. Thank you very much for your letter of January 29th.

It seems to me that somebody ought to take the bull by the horns and raise hell about the misunderstandings which exist between the CCAR and the Rabbinical Pension Board. Don't our representatives on that board know what it is all about? Or is it that only I am confused? Here we have several controversial matters pending: (1) The board claims that we owe it interest on the \$150,000's worth of bonds which we turned over to them; (2) The board claims that we must contribute certain annual sums for the maintenance of the office plus the annual contribution to it for capital funds and there has been a dispute about these amounts; (3) According to Zeppin's reply to my letter, he is evidently under the impression that certain checks which some of us are convinced should go to the account of the Solicitation Funds Committee and which come to us as a result of the activities of that committee belong to it, etc. etc. I believe that a small committee representing the conference and an equal committee representing the MAHC and the Rabbinical Pension Board ought to sit down and postage decreve and remiew the situation and clear up all existing misunderstandings. I for one, and I believe that I share the view of the members of the Conference, do not want to rob the Union and I am sure that the Union does not want to take monies from us that do not belong to it. These transactions are not complicated except insofar as they are now snarrowed Snarles up by minunderstandings. Please let me have your reaction to this suggestion.

Pending action by the Executive Board which should discuss the issues involved in this change of correspondence between Zeppin and myself, I am inclined to forward the \$25.00 check from Columbus, Georgia to Zeppin and let him dispose of it in any way that he believes is right. If ultimately, that check should have gone into our treasury, I have confidence that the Rabbinical Board will make it good. In the meantime, let make an "ochez b'yad" and according to the Talmudic law "olov harayah" which when translated in hillbilly inglish, which I remember from my Joplin days, simply give them enough rope to.... Rabbi Aryeh Lev has transmitted to me your request for a copy of the resolutions adopted by the Association of Jewish Chaplains in reference to the National Jewish Welfare Board, and I am pleased to give them to you as follows:

- "I. Be it resolved that the Secretary be directed to convey to the Committee on Army and Navy Religious Activities of the National Jewish Welfare Board our expression of gratitude for the splendid cooperation which we received from CANRA in our chaplaincy work through its publications, through its general services, and above all in the comradeship and fellowship which we enjoyed together.
- II. Be it resolved that the Secretary be directed to communicate to the National Jewish Welfare Board our sincere appreciation for its work of providing us with supplies, with material assistance, and for its efforts in assisting us in our work with Jewish men during World War II and in the general cooperation which its offices afforded us.
- III. Be it resolved that the Association of Jewish Chaplains, in convention assembled, call upon the national Rabbinical Associations to reorganize the work of the CANRA so as to bring it under the exclusive jurisdiction of rabbinical bodies. The Association pledges its wholehearted support to the rabbinical associations and to the reorganized CANRA in their work for the religious needs and spiritual ministrations of our men in the armed forces.

Be it further resolved that the membership in CANRA be limited exclusively to Rabbis; that the members thereof shall be appointed by the three Rabbinical bodies only; that the CANRA be responsible in its activities to its rabbinical parent bodies and have full charge of all phases of chaplains' activities, as recognized by the Army and Navy, Veterans Administration and National Guard. We urge upon CANRA to take all possible steps to carry out this resolution and we pledge our wholehearted support in this direction."

Cleveland, 6, Ohio Dear Doctor: Dr. Linfield of the Jewish Statistical Bureau phoned me from New York to ask me to substitute for you, at your request, as the representative of the C.C.A.R., at a conference with directors of the Federal Census Bureau. I attended that meeting in Washington yesterday. In addition to Dr. Linfield, the following attended: Dr. Hugo Schiff of Alexandria, representing Eisendrath and the U.A.H.C. Rabbi Uri Miller of Baltimore, president of the Rabbinical Council of America. Rabbi Bernard Segal of the Rabbinical Assembly Rabbi S. H. Markowitz, representing Mr. Roger W. Straus and the Statistical Bureau. Isaac Frank of the Brooklyn Jewish Community Council. These gentlemen, at a preliminary meeting, designated me as their spokesman. Also in attendance at the later session as an auditor was Marcus Cohn, representing Judge Proskauer. We met at the Commerce Bldg. with five or six officials of the Census Bureau, among them Mr. Capt, Gensus Director, Dr. Philip Hauser, the Deputy Director, and Dr. Truesdale, Chief of the Population Division. I presented the statement you and the other leaders of our religious bodies drew up and tried to make clear why nothing should be done to differentiate in the census between "religious" Jews and those who are not nominally affiliated with Congregations. On the basis of the final summary by Mr. Capt, Census Director, I think we succeeded in convincing him and his committeethat, (a) The whole number of Jews should be included in the census of the Jewish Religious Group; and that (b) The objections raised by Dr. Lurie of the Jewish Demographic Society and the Council of Federations and Welfare Funds and Dr. Dublin of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company should be disregarded, since we as representatives of religious bodies (and not they who speak solely for themselves or for secular agencies) have the right to say how Jewish religious membership should be determined. At the close of the session

Mr. Capt assured us that our "traditional criteria of membership" would again be the basis of counting.
