My dear Rabbi Silver:

The proposed Federal Child Labor Amendment, which would enable Congress to pass laws regulating child labor throughout the country, will be presented to the Ohio 'Legislature early this session for ratification.

A committee of citizens of Cuyahoga County to support the ratification is now being formed; it will be composed of representatives of all organizations in favor of the Amendment, and individual citizens interested in eradicating child labor by this means.

You are most cordially invited to become a member of this committee and are further urged to do so for the reason that the Amendment is likely to be defeated unless all of its friends come to its support.

The duties of the committee members will not be arduous; we wish most to have the privilege of using your name as favoring the Amendment, and would later wish to ask for a statement from you for publication. It is your moral support which the proposed Amendment needs and your ready willingness to make friendly comment on it to your acquaintances.

We enclose a pamphlet of information and trust that you will send us your acceptance by January 1st.

My dear Rabbi Silver:

A Cuyahoga County Committee has been organized, composed of citizens and representatives of national organizations interested in the ratification of the Federal Enabling Act known as the Children's Amendment.

This committee hopes that during the next few weeks it may aid the fight to protect the exploited children of the nation by presenting to the community their side of the question which has been so widely misrepresented.

We believe that child labor is a national problem; that state laws alone have proved inadequate. We believe that if the citizens of Ohio have a fair chance at the facts and an opportunity to consider the case of the children on its merits they will demand favorable action on the part of the legislature.

We are, therefore, writing to ask you if you will not be willing to send to our committee very promptly a check, large or small, which will enable us to place before the citizens of this county adequate and disinterested information and also contribute our share toward a state-wide campaign. Immediate action is essential and we shall be grateful indeed for whatever support you can give us.
