My Dear Mr. Silver:

The Citizens League of Cleveland, as you probably know, was recently organized for the promotion of efficient government in Cleveland and Cuyahoga county. The constitution of the new organization provides for an Executive Board which is the governing body; and a larger Advisory Committee which advises with the Executive Board.

The Advisory Committee is to be composed of representative citizens from all sections and interests of the city and county. It will meet once every three months, and as much oftener as it may deem advisable, to consider questions of League policy and the position which the League should take on public issues.

Your name has been unanimously approved by the Executive Board for service on the Advisory Committee. The duties will not be, in any sense, onerous but your judgment from time to time on these important questions and issues will be very helpful.

I hope you will accept the appointment. By so doing you will manifest to the entire community your interest in the affairs of the city and county, and will render a real public service.
