My dear Mr. Silver:

You may not be aware of the fact that the Cleve land Institute of Music, of which Mr. Ernest Bloch has been made Director, is open for enrollment.

We have a program for Mr. Bloch to deliver a certain number of lectures in the city, gratis, of course, and I believe that it will be a great event for you, if you can arrange for one of these lectures in a course that you may have, or whenever you may find it possible so to do. Mr. Bloch's time is going to be taken up rather closely in these lectures, and I want you to get in as early as possible.

You met him and no doubt know all about him; so it is unnecessary for me to say anything in his behalf.

Today I was notified that he was asked to speak before the Book & Play Club, of Chicago, on December twenty-third, on the subject of "Jewish Music".

You are aware, of course, that he has composed compositions, among which are Jewish poems, which have been played by the leading orchestras of this country, and will be played by the great Toscanini orchestra when it comes here this season.

I knew you would be interested in this, and hope to receive an early reply.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I feel that an explanation is owing to you regarding the date of the formal opening of the Institute on 30 September. I am very much distressed that this date is also the eve of Rosh Hashonnah.

Our original date for the opening had been the twenty-ninth. Certain subsequent developments, however, made it necessary for us to have it on the thirtieth; nor was it possible for us to have this date put forward.
