Dear Sir:-

You have been appointed one of a Special Committee to assist in organizing the Jewish Community for its part in the raising of Cleveland's "VICTORY" Fund.

You are requested to please attend a meeting for this purpose on Sunday afternoon, May 12, at 4.00 o'clock in the Auditorium of the Hebrew Free School and Institute, corner Portland and East 55th Streets.

The needs of our Jewish War Relief Fund to the extent of \$300,000 and our Welfare Fund for Jewish Soldiers and Sailors, amounting to \$35,000, will be taken care of out of the "VICTORY" Fund of \$6,000,000 which it is proposed to raise in Cleveland during the week of May 20th.

The co-operation of representative men in our Community is essential if we are to do our full duty both to our stricken brethren and to our Country.



#### MOTICE

The women of this congregation are requested by the officers of the Cleveland War Fund Campaign to join in a patriotic parade to be composed largely of the mothers, wives, and sisters of the boys who have gone into the Army Service of the United States. The parade is to be held in Gleveland on Saturday afternoon, May 18th.

Every soman of this congregation, who has sent a husband, son or brother to the war, is asked to participate in the parade and to carry a service flag with the appropriate number of stars.

Each unit of the parade will be requested to carry a banner identifying it with each of the various congregations or societies invited to participate. In addition to the thousands of wives, mothers and sisters who will make up the bulk of the parade, there will be military units, and the officers, captains, and members of the campaign teams, which are to raise the money, will also march. Each unit will march under the leadership of the proper officers of the women's societies of each congregation or patriotic order. No men will carry service flags.

The campaign which is to follow will be for the nationally accredited war service organizations, such as the Jewish War Relief Fund, the Red Cross, the Army YMCA, the Knights of Columbus, and other such organizations.

This parade will be a challenge to the men of the community to do their part by giving liberally to this War Fund Campaign.

To the Jewish Congregations and Societies of Cleveland:

The Cleveland War Council, of which Mr. Samuel Mather is Chairman, has in charge the Campaign for Cleveland's War Chest, from which the needs of the Jewish War Relief Fund and the fund for Welfare Work among Jewish Soldiers and Sailors, as well as the needs for Red Cross, Y.M.C.A., Armenian Relief and other similar War Purposes, will be met during 1918.

This Campaign is to take place during the week of May 20th.

- The Campaign will be inaugurated with a Patriotic Parade made up largely of the Mothers, Wives, and Sisters of the men in Service. There are 30,000 Cleveland boys in Service; each boy will be represented in the parade by one or more women with service flags. This great outpouring of thousands of women who have given their all to their country's cause, will be the inspiration and the challenge to the men to give liberally of their money for these war purposes.
- The Patriotic Parade will take place on Saturday afternoon, May 18th at 1.30 o'clock. In addition to the women, the men who are to take an active part in the Campaign will also march, and there will be Military Units, bands, etc. The line of march will be down a section of Euclid Avenue, and will not be so long as to be tiresome to the women.
- The co-operation of every Society and Church in the City is being requested to the end that every family in Cleveland that has someone in Service, shall be represented in the Parade.

### WILL YOU PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS?

- 1. Please appoint at once a Committee and apportion to its members the work of communicating immediately by phone with the families who have boys in Service. They must secure the promise of every Mother, Wife, and Sister of the Boys to participate in the parade. They must also find out how many service flags will be needed, so that the women who have no flags may be supplied with them by the Campaign Committee.
- 2. OHLY MOTHERS, WIVES AND SISTERS OF THOSE IN SERVICE, MAY MARCH.
- 3. Each Congregational or Society group will be captained by one of the ladies who may be seected by the Organization itself, and who will carry the Organization Banner or other identifying flag.
- 4/ Following will come the Congregation's or Society's Service flag, borne by four or six girls.
- 5. Then will come the women, each bearing a Service flag with the proper number of stars; the service flags should be attached to a cane or staff, and the flags supplied by the Campaign Committee will be already mounted on staffs.
- 6. No uniforms will be worn by any of the women; and no one will ride in conveyances of any kind. EVERYBODY WALKS.
- 7. Though the line of march will be as short as possible, the women should be advised to wear comfortable walking shoes.

- 8. The Jewish newspapers are being asked to copoperate in this work. They will announce the facts here given, and will urge those families which are not affiliated with any Church or Society to be represented in the parade, and to communicate with any one of the groups with which the women desire to march.
- 9. Churches or Societies having a very limited representation may group together with other Churches or Societies, to make a proper showing in the line of march.
- 10. Information as to the number who will march and the number and kind of service flags required from the Campaign Committee, should be communicated to CAPTAIN SHUPE, MARSHALL OF THE PARADE, AT-WAXN- PROSPECT 2200, ON SATURDAY, MAY 11th; ANY CHANGES OR CORRECTIONS OF THIS INFORMATION MAY BE MADE ON MONDAY MORNING, MAY 13th, BUT NOT LATER THAN THAT. His Headquarters are at the Y.M.C.A. Building, Prospect and East 22nd Street, and all further instructions and information necessary will be issued from there.
- 11. PLEASE GIVE THIS YOUR HELPFUL AND PROMPT CO-OPERATION AT ONCE.
