My dear Rabbi Silver:

I have written to Carmel directing him to make clear his absolute neutrality on the differences that have arisen in Cleveland and have also told him to get out of Cleveland at once to do some Palestine Restoration Fund work in other parts of the State, preliminary to his withdrawal entirely from the State. This is as drastic a step as can be taken at this time without making Carmel's position in the Organization for the future utterly impossible, because if he were to be withdrawn just now in the face of the difference of opinion, it would necessitate his withdrawal from the Organization for in the new residence he would take up his usefulness would be greatly impaired by his apparent reprimand or rebuke involved in his withdrawal.

I hope to see you on Sunday at the Executive Committee meeting.



My dear Mr. Lipsky,

I have just received your letter of the sixth. I note with pleasure the committees on Palestine and on Reorganization which have been appointed.

I note also what you say with reference to Mr. Carmel - that it will take several weeks more before action can be taken. I wish to impress upon you, my dear Mr. Lipsky, the importance of Mr. Carmel's immediate withdrawal from Cleveland. You have by now received a copy of Rabbi Goldman's and my letter, published in the press.

On Wednesday evening, October 6th, at a Zionist meeting arranged to hear a report from Goldberg, Benjamin, President of the Local Organization, in his characteristic style, made a bitter attack on Reform Jews and on me personally.

You have by now received his letter, which for "Chutz pa" excels anything that I have heard of, even in the annals of American Zionist organizations. The situation is becoming very difficult and, to my mind, critical. The first act in clearing the situation must be the immediate withdrawal of Carmel from Cleveland.

Personally, I feel that I shall be compelled to abstain from all activities in behalf of the Organiza-

tion, if the Organization insists upon keeping
a paid official here in Cleveland whose
presence is obnoxious. The local Zionist
Executive will take care of Benjamin in
due time.

My dear Mr. Lipsky,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 11th. I regret to say that the arrangements which you suggest are not satisfactory. To have Carmel travel in other parts of the State and remain in control of the local office is not a solution of our difficulties. Mr. Carmel should be recalled to New York at once, and the reasons may as well be such as will allay fear of a reprimand and rebuke. I feel that Mr. Carmel should be justly rebuked by the Organization for his impertinent meddling in matters which do not concern him.

I fear, my dear Mr. Lipsky, that you are, perhaps, a bit more concerned about the feelings of Mr. Carmel than you are with the main difficulties of the local situation. May I urge upon you again the importance of his immediate recall from Cleveland. I shall be compelled to cancel my St. Louis engagement for the 19th, and all subsequent engagements, for the Organization, unless immediate action

be taken in this matter. I think it is unfair to ask a man to work for an Organization while, at the same time, having a paid official of that Organization interfering with his work.



Your letter to Mr. Lipsky has reached the office this afternoon when Mr. Lipsky had left for Washington to address two meetings, one to-night and one to-morrow night, which means that he will not return to the office until Monday morning, as an Executive Committee meeting will be held on Sunday morning.

Before Mr. Lipsky left the office he handed over to me the correspondence relative to the Carmel matter. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, I thought I would write to you and incidentally enclose the letters Mr. Lipsky wrote to Benjamin and Carmel. Of course, I would not venture to predict any action on the part of Mr. Lipsky when he returns, but the tenor of his letters both to Benjamin and Carmel clearly indicates his intention.

DR. RAPPAPORT

Committee discussed Dr. Rappaport's future work among Hungarian Jews and plan of collecting funds from them to settle Jews now in Hungary in Palestine. Committee decided that it was too early to make any definite plans along these lines but authorized Dr. Rappaport to obtain through letters and personal interviews general information which will be of use when Dr. Rappaport's definite work is begun. (Aug. 31)

ZION COMMONWEALTH

Letter read from Mr. Rosenblatt as to campaign for Zion Commonwealth. After full discussion, the Committee agreed and decided to report to the National Executive Committee.

- a) That the Zion Commonwealth will manage its own campaign.
- b) That the campaign take place from November 1st to November 30th.
- c) That a meeting of the Administrative Committee be held on November 15th to decide whether or not circumstances would warrant the continuance of the campaign beyond November 30th.
- d) The publicity of the campaign should be issued by the Publicity Department but that extra expense entailed therein, such as postage, printing and hire of extra help, should be paid by the Zion Commonwealth.
- e) That the campaign should take the form of employing solicitors to sell stock -- to avoid mass meetings and the like..
- f) That the Organization agree to make temporary transfer of individuals to the Zion Commonwealth, each case to be discussed on its own merits.
- g) A draft to be prepared of the general argument to be used for the selling of the stock, and the same to be passed by the Administrative Committee. (Oct. 13)

Letter from Mr. Carmel of September 1st to Mr. Lipsky requesting the Administrative Committee's approval on application made by him to the Zion Commonwealth to act as their agent in Ohio. Committee objected as a matter of principle that it could not agree to organizers of the organization on fixed salary acting for the Zion Commonwealth. (Sept. 8).





Will you please draw Mr. Mack's attention to the interesting meeting held in the "First Baptist Church of Rochester" in December which was shared by Dr. Hanley and Rabbi Wolf, the chair being taken by President Rush Rhees of the University of Rochester. It was of such a nature as to entirely neutralise Mr. Ford's ignorant propaganda.

ARCHIVES

After hearing Rabbi Silver at the great closing meeting in Buffalo I submitted his name to President Clarence A. Barbour D.D. of the Rochester Theological Seminary with the suggestion that he be considered for the special winter course of Public Lectures given at the Seminary. I have since received a very responsive letter from Dr. Barbour and hope very much that this will be arranged during the winter.


Dear Rabbi Silver:





You will have received by this time the results of the Cleveland election. The candidates elected were - Silver 379 votes; Goldman 264 votes; Benjamin 198 votes and Bernon 177 votes. The election was conducted in a perfectly legal and fair manner.

Concerning your objections to our numbering the ballots, we met that objection by having the numbers clipped from the ballots in the presence of all the candidates before the ballots were counted.

Concerning your objection to having on the ballot the clause that one must vote for three, we at once advertised through the press, prominently on the front page, that one could vote for one or any part of any number below three.

I have already told you about the matter of showing the membership lists to men who wished to be nominated by petition. The two who requested the list were shown it. The men who were on the Nominating Committee and on the Election Committee are old-time Zionists and men of repute.

Mr. Carmel and one or two disgruntled individuals have undoubtedly carried on a great deal of

correspondence with New York, conveying a good deal of misinformation. They have, furthermore, on their own responsibility, carried through a sort of a mock election here in the city, which is, of course, perfectly ridiculous.

We shall be glad to go before the Credentials Committee of the Convention and present the facts as they are.
