My dear Rabbi Silver:

ESTABLISHED 1905

Recently a joint meeting of the Executive Committees of the Cleveland Zionist District and the United Palestine Appeal was held for the purpose of effecting a possible consolidation of all our fiscal, administrative and educational efforts on behalf of Zionism and Palestine. As a result of the discussion that took place at the Conference, we arrived at the following plan to re-organize our various activities:

All functioning Zionist Agencies will remain autonomous as they have been hitherto. The Zionist District will be re-organized in Cleveland. It will function through the following five committees:

- (a) Committee on Education
- (b) Committee on Zionist membership
- (c) Committee on Hadassah and Junior Hadassah
- (d) Committee on Jewish National Fund
- (e) Committee on U. P. A.

Under this new plan, eac committee will have a chairman and a secretary, and all committees together will constitute the Executive Board of the new Cleveland Zionist District.

The Chairmen of the five committees will also act as Vice-Presidnets of the entire District, which will also have a president, secretary and treasurer. At each Executive Board meeting, probably to be held monthly, and preferably during the day, all of the five chairmen wil report on the activities of their committees and will there receive the co-operation of the entire board in the accomplishment of all the tasks as they come up. Each Committee would, of course, be free to co-opt outside people who would be desirous of assisting in their tasks. No person will become a member of the Executive Board unless he first accepts a definite task on one of these five functional committees.



These Committees, however, should not be looked upon as delegations to the District from existing agencies or as delegations from the District to the Agencies, but rather as committees appointed by the District for the carrying through of certain specific Zionist tasks in co-operation with and under the supervision of the entire Executive Board of the Cleveland Zionist District.

The Nominating Committee, of which I have been appointed chairman, met twice to consider carefully the personnel of all the five committees. We have decided that you could serve Zionism best during the next year by serving on the Committee on Education. I should, therefore, appreciate it if you would send me your acceptance of this office by return mail. American Jewry is on trial. We dare not let this Palestine Colonization effort fail. Every Zionist must cooperate.

We are, therefore, very anxious to have each member of the Executive Board accept his or her obligations so that we may know what can be expected for fruitful Zionist activities in Cleveland during the ensuing year.

We are planning to have the first meeting of this new Board early in December, and I should therefore, consider it a special favor if you would return the enclosed postcard immediately upon receipt of this letter.
