My dear Mr. Goldhamer:

In connection with the projected survey of the Cleveland Hebrew Schools -- I am of the opinion that the work should be divided into two departments.

(a) An examination of the physical set-up of the institutions -- finances, budgets, salaries, enrollment, attendance, trends of growth and decline, etc. This factual inquiry which is of great importance may, in my judgment, be best carried out by Mr. Bernstein who should be loaned by the Federation to this work for a period of four or six weeks. I do not think that it is necessary to bring a man from out of town to do this part of the work. This work can begin almost immediately.

(b) A study of the curriculum and a comparison with that of similar schools in other cities and with other systems of Jewish education. For this purpose it might be desirable to bring some one from out of town. It might take some time before we find the desired person. We should be careful not to engage the services of anyone who is out of sympathy with the point of view which many of us hold. I will be able to suggest some names to you in the next week or ten days.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

Our records show that on June 12th the members of your District in good standing numbered 428 .

I am appealing to you to utilize for an intensive membership campaign the limited time left before the Thirty-eighth Annual Zionist Convention convenes at Atlantic City on June 30th to July 2nd, inclusive. It is important that at this Convention we demonstrate that at least in a measure the numerical strength of American Zionism has kept pace with the remarkable development in Palestine. Furthermore, an increase in Zionist man-power is essential not only from the point of view of America, but also because of what it means as the motive power behind the building of the Jewish Homeland.

There is still one other phase to be considered -- this is a World Zionist Congress year and one of the parties in Zionism, the Revisionists, has since the beginning of this year seceded from the World Zionist Organization. The welfare of the Zionist movement demands that the absence of the Revisionists should not affect the numerical strength of the Zionist Organization nor injure its prestige with the British Government. The deflection caused by this withdrawal has to be made up through an increase in the ranks of those who have remained loyal to the Organization that Theodor Herzl founded.

Finally, the fact should be borne in mind that representation at Zionist Conventions is on the basis of one delegate for every fifty members in good standing. Will you not, therefore, secure at least the additional members necessary to complete a delegateship unit.





1. I make this final appeal that you take personal responsibility for the arrangements in connection with the World Zionist Congress Elections, next Sunday, June 23rd, to the end that a maximum vote be cast for Ticket No. 1, the Ticket of the Zionist Organization of America, Hadassah and the Order Sons of Zion.

The Zionist Organization today is the chief instrumentality for saving a large part of the Jewish People from the wreckage which engulfs it. It is of the utmost importance therefore that the policies of the Zionist movement be such as to conform to basic Zionist ideals, and that the execution of such policies be entrusted to a leadership that will not be diverted by partisan point of view from the central goal of safeguarding the interests of the whole Jewish People in the upbuilding of the National Home. Ticket No. 1 represents a Delegation deserving of the fullest confidence of the Zionists of America in the furtherance of these aims.

Apart from the reasons given, the prestige of the Zionist Organization of America, the body carrying the major responsibility for Zionist activities in this country, requires that our Ticket be victorious in the Elections.

I appeal to you with all the earnestness at my command to see to it that every available vote be secured for Ticket No. 1, and that the Election Returns are sent in to the Central Election Board at 111 Fifth Avenue immediately after the counting of the ballots. Every Zionist entitled to a vote has received his or her Shekel by mail and this Shekel must be brought to the Polling Station.

2. I ask for another act on your part: The 38th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will take place one week after the Elections, that is, Sunday, June 30th, at the Ritz Carlton Hotel, Atlantic City, N.J. This Convention should reflect the full force of American Zionism, so that we may adequately deal with the pressing problems confronting us. Immediately after the Elections are over, please take steps to elect delegates from your District to the Convention, and send their names to our office. The District is entitled to one delegate for every fifty members.

The following reply was sent:

"CENTRAL BOARD CANNOT INTERFERE IN LOCAL CONDITIONS AS LONG AS PROPORTIONS OF REPRESENTATION OF THE THREE PARTIES ARE IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULES STOP TWO TWO ONE IS SAME PROPORTION AS FOUR FOUR TWO DECISION ENTIRELY UP TO LOCAL GROUPS"

Without attempting to interfere in your local condition, I desire to say to you that the Board has made every possible effort to carry through this election with the utmost harmony between all parties and factions. We have succeeded everywhere throughout the United States, including the city of New York, except in your city.

While the Board does not desire to interfere with your local autonomy, it feels that you ought to aid it in its efforts to carry through the election without protest, bitterness and intense partisanship.

The Board suggests and would appreciate your complying with ~~this~~ request that you accept representatives of the Cleveland Zionist Society on your local Board. This will obviate a great deal of trouble in connection with the returns.

Believe me, my dear Mr. Garber, that this has been a difficult job, and we would appreciate it if you would assist in making our burden just a bit lighter by agreeing with our suggestion. In a spirit of sportsmanship, the Board appeals to you to avoid unnecessary

difficulties.







I. REGISTRATION OF DELEGATES AND ALTERNATES

Registration of Delegates and Alternates to the Convention will commence Saturday evening, June 29th at the Convention Headquarters, Ritz Carlton Hotel and continue Sunday morning, June 30th.

The registration fee for Delegates is \$2.00; for Alternates \$1.00. Upon receipt of payment of registration fee, the Delegates and Alternates will receive an official badge, Convention literature, including report, etc.

The opening session of the Convention will take place Sunday morning, June 30th.

II. REDUCED RAILROAD FARES

Arrangements have been made for reduced return fares on the Central Passenger and Trunk Line Associations, the New England Passenger Association, Southeastern Passenger Association, Southwestern Passenger Association and Trans-Continental Passenger Association, for those travelling to attend the Zionist Convention in Atlantic City. The following regulations should be observed in order to avail yourself of the reduced fare privilege on the CONVENTION CERTIFICATE PLAN.

a) Upon purchasing railroad tickets to the Convention, pay full fare and ask the ticket-agent for a Convention Certificate (not a receipt) for the Zionist Convention at Atlantic City, N.J.

b) In order to obtain the reduced fare, a minimum of 100 certificates is required.

You will please hand in your railroad certificate immediately upon registering at the Convention Headquarters, for validation by railroad company. The certificate will be validated and ready to be returned to you by Tuesday, July 2nd.

c) All return tickets must be purchased before July 5th. However, they are good for thirty (30) days from the starting date. In buying your return tickets, present your Convention Certificate to the ticket-agent and you will be charged only one-third of the return fare.

III. HOTEL ACCOMODATIONS

Special arrangements have been made with the Ritz Carlton Hotel to accomodate all Delegates, Alternates and visitors attending the Convention. Room reservations should be made directly with the Hotel on the enclosed card. Make your reservations early and when registering at the Hotel, please state that you are attending the Zionist Convention.

FINAL INSTRUCTIONS TO LOCAL ELECTION COMMITTEES

- 1 - Make sure that you have a sufficient supply of the following items for each polling station.

A - Items supplied by the Central Election Board.

- a - Ballots
- b - Record sheets for voters
- c - Election return blanks
- d - Official registers with numbers of paid Shekel receipts
- e - Stamp for making Shekel receipts which are surrendered by voters as "voted"

(Note) Notify the U.S. Central Election Board immediately, how many of each of the above items you desire, also the name and address to whom such supplies are to be forwarded.

B - Items to be supplied by Local Election Committees.

- a - Sealed boxes with slit for the insertion of ballots when voted
- b - Large envelopes where questioned ballots may be placed

- 2 - Polling stations and day and time of election, must be publicized either through newspaper announcements, show cards, posters, or other means which the Local Committee may find desirable. This publicity must be issued at least three days in advance of Election Day.
- 3 - Election returns must be made up in three copies on forms supplied by the U.S. Central Election Board for every polling place, one copy to be retained by the Local Committee and two copies to be forwarded to the U.S. Central Election Board.

- A - A Summary return of results of all polling stations in any one city, should also be made out in triplicate and two copies to be forwarded to the U.S. Central Election Board.

All reports should be signed by the Chairman of the Committee, or returning officer and two other members of the Committee.

The election return reports, surrendered Shekel receipts, record sheets with the names and addresses of the voters, together with envelopes containing questioned or doubted ballots should be forwarded to the U.S. Central Election Board without delay and must be postmarked, or expressed, not later than midnight June 25th, in order to be considered by the U.S. Central Election Board.

- B - The voted ballots are to be kept in custody with the returning officer, or Chairman of the Local Committee.

- 4 - The polling places are to be open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M.
- 5 - Propely accredited representatives of the various parties in the Zionist Movement have the right to be watchers at all polling places, but they must not interfere with the voting. There is to be no electioneering in the polling places.
- 6 - Voting must be direct and secret - - no one may vote on behalf of another - - there is no voting by mail.
- 7 - Each voter, after receiving the ballot, must mark it and place it personally into the ballot box. Every voter's name, address and number of Shekel receipt must be entered upon special record sheets of voters supplied by the U.S. Central Election Board.
- 8 - Only persons, the number of whose Shekel receipt appears on the official register have the right to vote.
- 9 - When a person's vote is challenged, or his right to vote is doubted, he may be given a ballot, but his marked ballot should not be placed in the ballot box but should be placed in a separate envelope which together with the Shekel receipt is to be forwarded to the Central Election Board with the rest of the ballots accompanied by a note of explanation.

EXECUTIVE MEETING

Rabbi and Mrs. Abba Hillel Silver were hosts to the Executive Committee of the Cleveland Zionist Society and their wives in a combined business meeting and social function of the group at the Silver residence, Saturday evening, June 8.

Approximately 100 guests were entertained. The business meeting was devoted to a discussion of the Z.O.A. convention and the forthcoming World Zionist Congress. Plans were formulated for a well-rounded activities program for the Society in preparation for the Fall season.

A beach party followed the business session.

MONTHLY PROGRAMS

Such have been the programs of the Cleveland Zionist Society that they have become rapidly the cultural center for Cleveland Jewry seeking inspiration and information. Though the Society has been organized but a few months, the average attendance at the monthly meetings, open to the public, has exceeded 1000.

The most recent meeting, Tuesday evening, May 28, featured a joint discussion by Rabbi Edward Israel of Baltimore, president of the Seaboard Zionist Region, and Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, president of the Cleveland Zionist Society. These two noted Zionist leaders presented the topic: "The Problems of Zionism Today:" Centering their attention upon the problems confronting the forthcoming World Zionist Congress, the two orators pointed out the place of a General Zionist Party as a mediator and balance wheel amidst a Zionism fraught with dissension and party bickerings.

Said Rabbi Israel, "The General Zionist Party must be the body that controls the limbs. If the right limb is apt to do that which is harmful or rash, the body must exercise its control and check it. Likewise if it wishes to do something constructive, the body must furnish the energy to facilitate its performance." Using this analogy, Rabbi Israel thus pointed to the function of the General Zionist Party in relation to the left and right factions of Zionism today.

The April meeting of the Cleveland Zionist Society featured Dr. Jacob R. Marcus, professor of History at Hebrew Union College of Cincinnati, and author of the widely acclaimed volume, "The Rise and Destiny of the German Jew." A musical program was rendered by the Cleveland Jewish Singing Society under the direction of Charles Dawe.

Using his book as his theme, Dr. Marcus pointed out the plight of Jewry in Germany today. "Adolf Hitler is both a genius and a monomaniac," stated the author. He then proceeded to indicate the persecution which the Jews of Germany have undergone, and the steps which German Jewry is taking to adjust itself.

"Germany has produced many Nobel prize winners, many of whom are Jews. It seemed improbable that in one of the most cultured nations in the world, such devastation as befell the Jews could occur. But we must remember that culture and tolerance are not synonymous," said Dr. Marcus.

An interesting lecture for the February meeting was presented by Dr. Nelson Gleuck, who explained his archeological experiences in Palestine. Dr. Gleuck illustrated his talk with slides depicting sites of historical import in the Holy Land. Mr. Charles De Harrack, noted pianist, and Mr. Josef Fuchs, concertmeister of the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra entertained with solos.

Each successive meeting of the Cleveland Zionist Society has resulted in a real boost in membership. The programs have attracted people who heretofore have never interested themselves in Zionist activity. The caliber of the musical presentations have attracted many music lovers who stayed to become Zionists,

while the varied topics under discussion have exerted their appeal upon the Cleveland community as a whole.

Nelson Glueck ~~was~~, returned in September after a six months' period of service as Annual Professor in charge of the American School of Oriental Research at Baghdad. During this period he conducted a joint archaeological expedition under the auspices of the H.U.C., the American Schools of Oriental Research and the Department of Antiquities of Transjordan, which completed the work inaugurated by him in the preceding year, in which he served as Director of the American School of Oriental Research in Jerusalem. In this last expedition, Glueck succeeded in definitely establishing the boundaries of the ancient Edomite Kingdom and determining the sites of its most important cities, and perhaps most important of all, in discovering and determining the economic history of the copper mines which were worked in the days of Solomon and in the period following thereupon, and which provided one of the chief materials of export both of Solomon and of the Edomite rulers. Full reports of this expedition and its significant discoveries will be presented in due time in the Annual of the American Schools of Oriental Research.

The Executive Committee of the new Zionist organization of Cleveland deeply resents the hasty action of the Administrative Committee in New York in arriving at conclusions ^{without first apprising us that the matter was to be considered} without first receiving all the evidence, and without waiting for the formal application from the new organization before it passed any judgment.

The resolutions of the National Convention of the Zionist Organization of America of last year state that if there is any objection to the organization of a new Zionist unit on the part of the existing district, the National Administration "shall upon thorough investigation be vested with an authority of final decision." Knowing of the opposition of the old District, it was the intent of the Executive Committee, after its first organization meeting, to present the entire matter to the National Administration. The hasty and unwarranted action of New York headquarters will in no way change this proper and prescribed procedure for our organization.

We particularly resent the long distance white-wash which was administered by the New York Office to the local officers without first thoroughly investigating the reasons which have prompted hundreds of men and women in the city, many of them old time Zionists and active workers in the cause, to join a new Zionist unit -- many of them resigning from the old District and joining the new organization.

The movement to create a new Zionist organization in this city was not initiated by Rabbi Silver. The opposition has sought to make this entirely a personal issue between Rabbi Silver and themselves. This is ridiculously unreal. For years now there has been wide-spread dissatisfaction with the ~~incompetence and~~ inefficiency of the old District which

at this date numbers ^{a negligible number} ~~less than one hundred paid up~~ members. ~~The District~~
~~has had no meetings in a year.~~ A few people have consistently presumed to
speak and act for it. Two years ago, an attempt was made to organize a
new District but the attempt was scuttled by the same clique which is now
trying so hard to interfere with the new organization. The infamous attack
upon Rabbi Silver by the officers of the local Zionist district in sending
of a defamatory pasquille to Zionist headquarters, asking for the recall
of an invitation which had previously been extended to Rabbi Silver to
address the Palestine rally in Washington -- a message never authorized
by their own Executive Board but sent surreptitiously by five men -- was
merely the signal for the rallying of the forces which have been waiting
for an opportunity to destroy that kind of Zionist control in the city.

We furthermore resent the pompous laudation of the so-called
achievements and contributions of the officers of the old District while
ignoring the quarter of a century of outstanding service which Rabbi Silver
has rendered to the cause of Zionism, nationally and internationally, and
the pioneering work which he did for the cause in the City of Cleveland.
Had the national officers looked into their own files, they would have
come upon the record of his great services which they themselves in the
past had frequently praised -- and concerning which they are now so str~~angely~~ly
silent.

The Executive Committee takes this opportunity to voice its complete
confidence in the leadership of Rabbi Silver and pledges its whole-hearted
loyalty to him. It calls upon all those who desire to do earnest and sincere
Zionist work and who believe in the leadership of Rabbi Silver to join the
new organization.

The establishment of a new Zionist unit in Cleveland need^d
in no way interfere with the work of any existing organizations.
We shall be very happy to cooperate in all common endeavors in behalf
of the common cause. We are not interested in prolonging this unfortunate
controversy.

✓ NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT This organization, dedicating itself to the active promotion of the noblest ideals of Zionism and the permanent effort to inculcate those ideals into the minds and souls of American Jewish youth, pledges itself to complete cooperation with Rabbi ABBA HILLEL SILVER in his effort to create a spirit of honest Zionism, rising above all partisan bias, in this community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT This organization expresses its deep regret that an ^{unauthorized} impression has been conveyed to this Community that the leadership of this organization does not truly represent the highest ideals of the great ^{man} bulk of Cleveland Jewry and the noblest professions of the Zionist faith.

CONSTITUTION OF THE JEWISH COMMUNITY COUNCIL OF CLEVELAND

NAME:

ARTICLE I

Section 1.

The name of this Organization shall be The Jewish Community Council of Cleveland.

PURPOSE:

ARTICLE II

Section 1.

It shall be the purpose of this Organization to deal with matters of general concern to the Jewish Community of Cleveland.

DEFINITION
OF TERMS:

ARTICLE III

Section 1.

Member shall mean an organization which has accepted and continues its membership in The Jewish Community Council.

Council means The Jewish Community Council of Cleveland, which shall consist of the representatives of members.

Representative means a person selected by a member to sit in the Council.

MEMBERSHIP AND
REPRESENTATION:

ARTICLE IV

Section 1.

Any Jewish organization of Metropolitan Cleveland which is concerned with some aspect of Jewish communal, cultural, civic, fraternal, social, economic, or religious life, shall be eligible for membership in the Council.

Section 2.

The organizations whose names are listed in Schedule A appended hereto shall be members of the Council upon their respective acceptance of this Constitution.

Section 3.

All other organizations which desire to become members shall make application therefor on forms and in the manner to be prescribed by the Executive Committee. Such applications shall be transmitted to the Secretary of the Council and shall be submitted to the Council together with the recommendation of the Executive Committee thereon, for approval or rejection by the Council.

Section 4.

The basis for determining the number of representatives to be selected by each member shall be the dues-paying and/or voting individual membership of such member on the 1st day of May preceding the call for election of such representatives.

Section 5.

The representatives shall be apportioned among the members, subject to the provisions contained in Section 7 of this Article, as follows: each member having seventy-five to two hundred and fifty dues-paying and/or voting individual members, shall be entitled to select one representative; each member having a dues-paying and/or voting individual membership in excess of two hundred and fifty in number shall be entitled to select one representative for every two hundred fifty of such individual members or a major fraction thereof. No member, irrespective of the size of its individual membership, shall select more than four representatives.

Section 6.

A member which has no dues-paying and/or voting individual membership, or has fewer than seventy-five dues-paying and/or voting individual members may be permitted to select one representative with the consent of the Council and upon such plan as it may require.

Section 7.

Any member which has a dues-paying and/or voting individual membership of not less than seventy-five individual members, and which is a branch auxiliary or affiliate, but not an integral part, of another member which has a dues-paying and/or voting individual membership and which selects representatives to the Council, or which is an organization within a congregation, shall be entitled to select one representative.

Section 8.

The American Jewish Congress, The Anti-Defamation Committee and The American Jewish Committee, because of their purpose, position and activity in Jewish life, shall each be entitled, upon application to the Council, to four representatives in the Council.

FUNCTION OF COUNCIL:

ARTICLE V

Section 1.

The Council shall consist of the representatives selected by the members for terms of one year and until their respective successors are elected and qualified.

Section 2.

The Council shall have power to deal with all matters of general concern to the Jewish Community. It shall have power to adopt such rules and regulations for its conduct and for the carrying out of the purposes of this Constitution as shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this Constitution. It shall elect the officers of the Council and the members of the Executive Committee for terms of one year and until their respective successors are elected and qualified.

Section 3.

Each representative in the Council shall have one vote. His action shall be construed as reflecting his personal opinion as a representative of the community, as well as the belief of the member which he represents, but shall not necessarily be binding upon this member.

Section 4.

Upon the affirmative vote of not less than one-third of the representatives present, the voting on any matter not listed in the call for the meeting, shall be postponed until the next succeeding meeting of the Council.

Section 5.

Meetings of the Council shall be held quarterly and the first quarterly meeting shall be in February of each year. Other meetings shall be held at the call of the President or of the Executive Committee, or upon written request signed by twenty or more representatives, stating in such request the reason therefor and the matters to be considered at such requested meeting.

Section 6.

If any representative shall die, resign, or otherwise be unable to continue in his duties his place shall be filled for the unexpired term by the member which selected him.

Section 7.

A quorum of the Council shall consist of forty representatives.

EXECUTIVE
COMMITTEE:

ARTICLE VI

Section 1.

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Council and thirty members to be elected by the Council. The officers of the Council shall serve as the officers of the Executive Committee.

Section 2.

The Executive Committee shall prepare the agenda for each meeting of the Council and shall cause reasonable notice of such agenda to be mailed to each representative in advance of each such meeting. The Council may consider matters not on the agenda prepared by the Executive Committee, except as limited by Article V, Section 4.

Section 3.

The Executive Committee in addition to the powers and duties given it by this Constitution shall have such other powers and duties as may from time to time be delegated to it by the Council.

Section 4.

The Executive Committee shall have power to adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of its business and for carrying out its powers and duties as shall not be inconsistent with this Constitution or with the decisions of the Council.

Section 5.

The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancies which may occur in any office, in the Executive Committee or in the Nominating Committee for the unexpired term.

Section 6.

Fifteen members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7.

The Executive Committee shall meet at least once before each of the quarterly meetings of the Council. It shall have such other meetings as it may prescribe and it shall meet on the call of the President or at the request in writing of seven members of the Executive Committee.

Section 8.

The Executive Committee shall determine the number of representatives each member is entitled to select under the provisions of this Constitution before the time for the call provided for in Article VIII, Section 2 hereof.

OFFICERS:

ARTICLE VII

Section 1.

The officers of the Council shall be a President, a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President and a Third Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The officers shall have such powers and duties as generally appertain to their respective offices and such other powers and duties as may be assigned them by the Council or the Executive Committee.

ELECTIONS:

ARTICLE VIII

Section 1.

The quarterly meeting in February of each year shall be the annual meeting. At this meeting the officers of the Council and the members of the Executive Committee shall be elected.

Section 2.

Within ten days after October 1st of each year the Secretary shall issue a call to the members to select representatives to the Council. The call shall state the number of representatives the member is entitled to select as determined by the Executive Committee under the provisions of Article VI, Section 8 hereof. No person shall be selected as a representative by more than one member. The Executive Committee shall adopt rules for the certification of the selection of representatives by the members.

Section 3.

At the last quarterly meeting in every year, the Executive Committee shall submit a list of seven suggested names for a Nominating Committee. At this meeting the Council shall elect a Nominating Committee of seven representatives.

Section 4.

At least fifteen days before each annual meeting the list of nominations for officers and members of the Executive Committee made by the Nominating Committee shall be mailed to each representative. Such nominations together with any additional written nominations, signed by fifteen representatives and submitted to the chairman of the Nominating Committee or to the Secretary of the Council not later than three days before the annual meeting, shall be presented to the annual meeting. Only from the names so nominated shall be elected the officers and members of the Executive Committee.

Section 5.

The provisions of this Constitution as to time elements in the election of representatives, officers and members of the Executive Committee shall apply only so far as is reasonably convenient and possible to the first such elections to be held hereunder. The representatives, officers, and members of the Executive Committee first elected under this Constitution shall serve until the annual meeting in February of 1937 and until their respective successors are elected and qualified.

FINANCE;
DECISIONS:

ARTICLE IX

Section 1.

The expenses of the Council shall be borne in such manner as may be determined by the Council.

Section 2.

A member may choose not to be bound by any particular decision of the Council. It shall, however, give notice of its decision not to be so bound.

AMENDMENT:

ARTICLE X

Section 1.

Amendments to this Constitution may be made by a two-thirds vote at any meeting, provided written notice of said proposed amendment is sent to the representatives at least ten days before the meeting at which it is to be acted on. Amendments may be initiated by the Executive Committee or by fifteen members of the Council who shall present the proposed amendment in writing to the Secretary for notification.

RATIFICATION:

ARTICLE XI

Section 1.

This Constitution shall become effective from the time that at least one-third of the organizations listed in Schedule A have signified in writing to the Temporary Organization Committee which has presented this Constitution that they have accepted this Constitution and have thereby become members. Thereupon the Temporary Organization Committee shall provide for the selection of representatives by the members and for the holding of the first meeting of the Council.

As you know, the Constitution has been drafted by the Organization Committee, which consists of 26 members representative of the Community. It is the result of very careful consideration over a period of several weeks, and we believe that it embodies the principles agreed upon at our preliminary discussions, and will lay a solid foundation upon which the Council can build in the years to come.

We believe that this should be developed in accordance with the needs as they appear, by the Council itself--your organization and others. We have therefore confined the Constitution to a framework within which the Council can function broadly and effectively.


We hope that it will meet with your approval. In submitting a Constitution to 100 organizations, it is conceivable that some sections may be interpreted in a variety of ways. We should like to point out that changes can be made from time to time by the Council after it has begun to function, and any desire on the part of an organization for revision of the Constitution can logically and appropriately be considered at future Council sessions.

A word about the financial arrangement for bearing the expenses of the Council, since we know that this question will come up in every organization. We expect that the expenses of the Council will be small and the Constitution merely provides that they shall be borne in such manner as the Council may itself determine. Should the organizations comprising the Council decide to assess themselves, this would be so small as to be of little or no importance.

We are enclosing a brief draft summarizing the discussions which led to the formation of the Council. You may find this helpful in explaining its purposes to your group.

It would assist greatly if you could submit the Constitution to your organization or executive board within the next week or two and inform us of the decision, so that we can proceed with the formation of the Council. Awaiting your reply, I am.

A BRIEF SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS REACHED IN DISCUSSIONS
HELD UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE JEWISH WELFARE FEDERATION

The Problem

The problem, essentially, is the need for greater unity and co-ordination in Jewish life.

This is apparent locally, nationally, internationally. The tragic results are being unfolded every day in many parts of the world.

In our own Jewish community of Cleveland there is likewise an obvious need for greater coordination and integration. Instead of being one community, we are in reality a number of separate communities. Few groups fully understand the aims and efforts of the others, and at no time has there been a joint consideration of broad Jewish problems by all the elements concerned.

The community would undoubtedly benefit if all elements and points of view were given a greater opportunity for expression and participation in the formation of decisions affecting all aspects of Jewish life.

Then, too, there is also much capable leadership in the community that has never been fully utilized. The community vitally needs this leadership.

It is imperative that all Cleveland Jewry more completely understand its problems, needs, and responsibilities. The Welfare of our people, our institutions -- in fact, our own well-being -- depends upon this.

PURPOSES AND FUNCTIONS OF A JEWISH COMMUNITY COUNCIL

(A Tentative Outline)

- A. The Council would be a body of representatives of the major Jewish organizations in the city.

It would include:

1. Temples and Synagogues
2. Educational and Cultural Organizations
3. Philanthropic and Benefit Societies
4. Lodges and Social Clubs
5. Local Chapters of National and International Societies

The Federation would be one of the organizations included.

- B. The Council would make possible the joint consideration of problems which are of mutual concern to all.

1. It would bring together for the first time all elements of the Jewish Community, which today are a number of separate communities.
2. It would discuss matters of concern to the entire community, from the standpoint of information, analysis, and evaluation.
3. It would give expression to all points of view within a single body and before an audience representing the entire Jewish community. Never before was this possible, and never was it more necessary.
4. The Council would in no way affect the autonomy of any existing organization.
5. The form and functions of the Council would evolve according to situations and needs as these develop. It is intended at the start that there be a minimum of rules and that the structure be as flexible as possible.

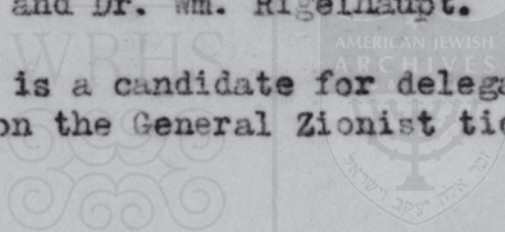
RABBI ABBA HILLEL SILVER HEADS LARGE CLEVELAND

ZIONIST DISTRICT 2 CHOOSES SILVER

"All the Fighting Is Finished," Rabbi Tells New Corporation.

Electing Rabbi A. H. Silver as president, the Cleveland Zionist District No. 2 last night became a corporate body, adopting its constitution and choosing its officers in a meeting at Mahler Hall attended by a capacity audience.

The only passing reference to the storm which greeted the new district's first organization announcement came in Rabbi Silver's acceptance speech when he said:

"All the fighting is finished. That's a closed chapter. There is room in this city with its 100,000 Jews not for one or two districts but for ten. I assure you this organization will not be a one-man group, the group of a clique, nor will it be run by three or four people with no interest.

"I'd rather smash it into bits than have it become anything but what it is supposed to be—an organization to work for Zionism."

The new organization will have an executive board of 45. Thirty were elected last night. The others will be chosen at the next meeting. In addition to Rabbi Silver, officers are:

It is agreed that the Cleveland Zionist District will raise no objection to the organization of the new Zionist group in the city. The new organization will be known as the Cleveland Zionist Society -- the alternative name provided for in the constitution recently adopted by the new organization. The Administrative Committee of the Zionist Organization of America will be apprised of these facts, and on the basis of the constitution of the National organization, it is confidently expected that the Cleveland Zionist Society will receive formal recognition.

It is further agreed that a joint committee shall be appointed to assist in coordinating the activities of the two organizations so as to achieve the fullest measure of cooperation and harmony.

It is also agreed that a comprehensive survey shall be made under the auspices of the Bureau of Jewish Education and with the cooperation of the Jewish Welfare Federation, of all the educational institutions sponsored by the Bureau with the idea of extending and improving their educational and financial status.

The undersigned regret the unfortunate events which led up to the recent controversy. The officers of the Cleveland Zionist District and the Ohio Zionist Region regret the sending of their recent communication to New York. Rabbi Silver appreciates this expression of the officers, and expresses his regret at the sharp words of criticism which he directed at them. The controversy is definitely closed.

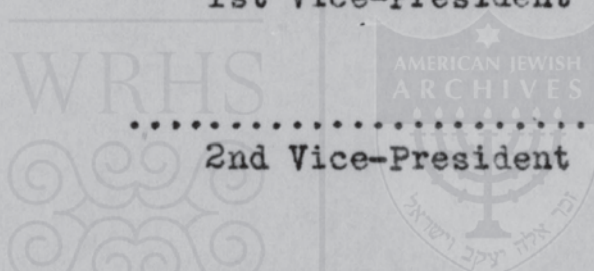

DR. NELSON GLUECK TO ADDRESS NEW ZIONIST DISTRICT
Adoption of Constitution and Election of Officers next Wednesday, February 27.

Dr. Nelson Glueck, Professor at the Hebrew Union College, will address the first meeting of the newly organized Cleveland Zionist District on Wednesday evening, February 27, at eight o'clock P.M. at Mahler Hall. He will speak on "Digging Up Biblical Cities."

Dr. Glueck returned in September after a six months' period of service as Annual Professor in charge of the American School of Oriental Research at Baghdad. During this period he conducted a joint archaeological expedition under the auspices of the H.U.C., the American Schools of Oriental Research and the Department of Antiquities of Transjordan, which completed the work inaugurated by him in the preceding year, in which he served as Director of the American School of Oriental Research in Jerusalem. In this last expedition, Dr. Glueck succeeded in definitely establishing the boundaries of the ancient Edomite Kingdom and determining the sites of its most important cities, and perhaps most important of all, in discovering and determining the economic history of the copper mines which were worked in the days of Solomon and in the period following ~~it~~ thereupon, and which provided one of the chief materials of export both of Solomon and of the Edomite rulers.

The resolutions of the National Convention of the Zionist Organization of America of last year state that if there is any objection to the organization of a new Zionist unit on the part of the existing district, the National Administration "shall upon thorough investigation be vested with an authority of final decision." Knowing of the opposition of the old District, it was the intent of the Executive Committee, after its first organization meeting, to present the entire matter to the National Administration. The hasty and unwarranted action of New York headquarters will in no way change this proper and prescribed procedure for our organization.

We particularly resent the long distance white-wash which was administered by the New York Office to the local officers without first thoroughly investigating the reasons which have prompted hundreds of men and women in the city, many of them old time Zionists and active workers in the cause, to join a new Zionist unit -- many of them resigning from the old District and joining the new organization.

The movement to create a new Zionist organization in this city was not initiated by Rabbi Silver. The opposition has sought to make this entirely a personal issue between Rabbi Silver and themselves. This is ridiculously unreal. For years now there has been wide-spread dissatisfaction with the incompetence and inefficiency of the old District which

at this date numbers less than one hundred paid-up members. The District has had no meetings in a year. A few people have consistently presumed to speak and act for it. Two years ago, an attempt was made to organize a new District but the attempt was scuttled by the same clique which is now trying so hard to interfere with the new organization. The infamous attack upon Rabbi Silver by the officers of the local Zionist district in sending of a defamatory pasquille to Zionist headquarters, asking for the recall of an invitation which had previously been extended to Rabbi Silver to address the Palestine rally in Washington -- a message never authorized by their own Executive Board but sent surreptitiously by five men -- was merely the signal for the rallying of the forces which have been waiting for an opportunity to destroy that kind of Zionist control in the city.

We furthermore resent the pompous laudation of the so-called achievements and contributions of the officers of the old District while ignoring the quarter of a century of outstanding service which Rabbi Silver has rendered to the cause of Zionism, nationally and internationally, and the pioneering work which he did for the cause in the City of Cleveland. Had the national officers looked into their own files, they would have come upon the record of his great services which they themselves in the past had frequently praised -- and concerning which they are now so strongly silent.

The Executive Committee takes this opportunity to voice its complete confidence in the leadership of Rabbi Silver and pledges its whole-hearted loyalty to him. It calls upon all those who desire to do earnest and sincere Zionist work and who believe in the leadership of Rabbi Silver to join the new organization.
