## SEVERAL SUGGESTIONS FOR THE NEW ZIONIST DISTRICT

Until the new headquarters are established ,it is recommended that the organization set up for itself temporary headquarters in some suitably located hall,library or temple. The designated place should be supplied with the information,literature and history of Zionism and be made available at all times for members and friends.

A capable individual should be appointed who is acquainted with the materials,information etc.such a headquarters should require. Palestinian newspapers,magazines etc. should be made available for all.

The organization should publish a bulletin to acquaint the members with local,national and world affairs in Zionism.This bulletin should be monthly,if possible;at least quarterly.

The organization should create and sponsor some Hebrew speaking society for Cleveland Jewry.Whether such a society is to become a branch of the Histadruth or an independent group is for the organization to determine.But that Cleveland,including about 100,000 Jews,needs a Hebrew speaking group is undeniable.

To prepare young Jewish men and women for active membership in Zionism it is wise to first train them in and acquaint them with the necessary information,history and spirit of the movement. Only such trained men and women can be of genuine service to the active groups , [redacted].

The utmost should be done to acquaint the members of our organization with Living Palestine. To promote this several suggestions are in order.

1. For all great occasions the district sponsors that are attended by paid tickets,Raffles should be held,the winner being

awarded a free trip to Palestine.

2. We should celebrate in minor fashion all affairs held in the Holy Land, namely such as the Purim and Chanukah celebrations and the Olympic games for Jewish youths.

3. S. Edelheit, 5501 Snyder avenue, Brooklyn, New York, traveller and lecturer has available a series of late films taken in Palestine as well as in several of the European countries. To acquaint Cleveland Jewry with living Palestine, Mr. Edelheit should be procured to show the film and lecture.

The district should make it its duty and privilege to keep in contact with the Jewish young men and women of our colleges, to instil in them interest and spirit of Zionism; they should be encouraged to sponsor active groups in the movement. The right methods will undoubtedly keep Jewish youth awake to Jewish life and problems.







U.S. SENATOR ROYAL S. COPELAND TO ADDRESS CLEVELAND ZIONIST SOCIETY

The Cleveland Zionist Society Announces Opening of Year's Activities

For its first public meeting of the year, the Cleveland Zionist Society will have the pleasure of presenting to the Cleveland Jewish community, United States Senator Royal S. Copeland who has just returned from an unofficial tour of Palestine in the company of U.S. Senators Warren R. Austin and Daniel O. Hastings. The meeting will be held in Mahler Hall on Monday evening, October 26 under the chairmanship of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver.

Senator Copeland made a careful study of conditions in Palestine during the disturbances which have taken place in the country. He visited the important Jewish towns, settlements and institutions. He interviewed the outstanding Jewish leaders, government officials as well as Arab leaders in Palestine. He has brought back a tremendously important report which Cleveland Jewry will receive with the greatest of interest.

A largely attended meeting of the Board of the Cleveland Zionist Society was held on September 23 at which time extensive plans of activities for the coming year were laid.

The membership of the Cleveland Zionist Society is now close to five hundred and is one of the largest single Zionist units in the United States.

Gentlemen:

I received your telegram with reference to Senator Copeland's coming here. There must be some confusion as to the date of the Senator's coming here. We had invited him for October 6, 13 or 14. He wired asking whether October 26 would be at all possible for us. I replied that whereas we would prefer to have him come earlier in the month, we would accept October 26 if that was the only date available. On September 24, the Senator wired me: "October calender very full and since I must be in Ohio at that time much prefer twenty-sixth". I accordingly wrote him that same day that we would be delighted to have him on the 26th. I proceeded to give the announcement to the newspapers, a clipping of which I am herewith enclosing.

It would embarrass us greatly if we would have to change the date. Under any circumstances, the Cleveland Zionist Society, under whose auspices the Senator is coming, could not arrange a meeting on a Sunday.

Regarding the honorarium of \$250 - the figure is rather high - not that Senator Copeland is not deserving of such an honorarium but that the Society is charging no admission at this meeting. It has arranged it as a community-wide reception for the Senator. It had been our hope that \$100 plus traveling expenses would be the fee. Perhaps you would take this matter up with the Senator.

With Cut of Sen. Copeland

In opening the Fall season the Cleveland Zionist Society under the leadership of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, is presenting a timely lecture by Senator Royal S. Copeland of New York. The Senator's subject, "My Observation on a Recent Trip to Palestine", will be the major feature of the first open meeting of the Society at Mahler Hall, The Temple, Ansel Road and East 105th Street, at 8:15 p.m. Monday, October 26. This presentation is free ~~admission~~ to the public.

In order to answer such questions as: what is the situation in Palestine today? what are the issues involved in the bloody strife now in progress there? how does Great Britain administer the mandate over Palestine? what is the future of the Jewish National Home, an unofficial Senatorial Commission of which Senator Copeland is a member, was sent to Palestine.

The commission studied the great progress made by the Zionist effort to establish the Jewish National Home; inquired into the British trusteeship over the Holy Land and conferred with the recognized Arab and Jewish leaders. They investigated the precarious status of American citizens in the present conflict, and devoted themselves especially to examine the potential capacity of Palestine to absorb larger numbers of Jewish immigrants.

The commission has recently returned. Senator Copeland has already written articles embodying first hand observations of what he saw in Palestine.

To the Cleveland Zionist Society audience he will impart from the platform his interesting experiences which millions of Americans feel are of vital concern.~~xxxxxx~~

The Cleveland Zionist Society Executive Committee ~~promised~~<sup>stated</sup> ~~that~~ this to be ~~is~~ the first in a series of vital presentations dealing with Zionism, its ideals and present ~~xx~~ status. They ~~xxxx~~ report that the coming season will emulate the Society's past efforts in bringing to Cleveland outstanding personalities who can speak authoritatively on problems of ~~xx~~ real concern to American Jewry.



**BLAMES BRITAIN IN PALESTINE TANGLE**

Copeland, Addressing Zionist Group Here, Hits U. S.  
for Failure to Act.

United States Senator Royal S. Copeland of New York last night placed responsibility for current disorders in Palestine squarely upon the shoulders of Great Britain as the mandatory power charged with the task of assuring development of that country as a homeland for Jews.

Senator Copeland spoke before the Cleveland Zionist Society's first fall meeting in the Temple in his first address based upon observations in Palestine since his return to this country as a member of an unofficial senatorial commission which visited the Holy Land during the summer.

Strongly hinting that a row in Palestine gave England an excuse for keeping large bodies of troops available and that her hesitant policy was not unaligned with her interests in the Suez Canal and her fear of Arab sympathies in India, he declared the Arab-Jewish differences could be worked out simply through the League of Nations mandate.

He also criticized the United States for not interesting itself more definitely in the matter and insisting that England treat her responsibilities as an international rather than a colonial duty.

During a question period following his address, Senator Copeland said he had written Secretary of State Cordell Hull a letter setting forth his belief that the United States should insist upon the full enforcement of the mandate, and had been offered in reply access to confidential information possessed by the government.

Asked if he had attempted to see President Roosevelt, he said he had, but had found it very difficult to gain access to him.

"You see I'm sort of off the reservation and not much in demand," he replied, laughing.





Subsequently he became President of the Board of Education, and President of the Park board, as well as a member of the United States Pension Examining Board. In 1908 he was chosen president of his National Meducal Organization and in that year became the Dean of Flower Hospital Medical College, New York City.

Dr. Copeland was elected to the United States Senate November 7, 1922, and was reelected in 1928 and 1934.

NEW YORK, Sept. 28. (JTA) -- Moritz Neuman, Jewish philanthropist and religious leader, died early today in his eighty-third year. His widow, Mrs. Clara Neuman, four daughters and one son survive.

Mr. Neuman was vice-president of the Israel Orphan Asylum and president of the Congregation Ohab Zedek for twenty years and was its honorary president for the last ten years. He was a member of the Hungarian Society of New York and of the Independent Order of Brith Abraham.

HADASSAH LEADER, J.D.C. PUBLICITY CHIEF BACK FROM TOURS ABROAD

NEW YORK, Sept. 28. (JTA) -- The deplorable condition of Jews in Eastern European countries was described today by Mrs. Edward Jacobs, national president of Hadassah, women's Zionist organization in America and Herbert J. Seligman, public relations director of the American Joint Distribution Committee, both of whom returned yesterday from European tours.

Mrs. Jacobs said that the mounting anti-Semitism abroad was a "reflection of the unhealthy and unwholesome general state" in Europe.

Mr. Seligman asserted that the Jews of Eastern and Central Europe were existing under conditions "more critical than even in the anarchic post-war years."

COPELAND SEES ROOM FOR VAST DEVELOPMENT IN PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Sept. 28. (JTA) -- Palestine's absorptive capacity depends upon the development of its industry and commerce, Senator Royal S. Copeland declared in the first of a series of articles for the Hearst newspapers. In the company of Senators Warren R. Austin, and Daniel O. Hastings, he recently returned from an unofficial tour of investigation in Palestine.

Terming Palestine "the maritime frontier of a vast hinterland which is just beginning to awaken to the call of civilization," the Senator maintained that the country may be made a home for millions of Jews by the development of industry, without minimizing the role of agriculture.

He praised "Jewish endeavor and sacrifice." He said the party found Palestine "an armed camp."

"A state of warfare prevailed, without the martial law warranted by the activities of the Arab terrorists," he said.


My dear Rabbi:







## HAILS HEROISM OF JEWS IN PALESTINE

Zionist Leader, Here, Urges Clevelanders to Help Land of Refuge.

The Jews in Palestine have overcome great obstacles, both material and moral, in the crisis of the last six months, and have displayed a heroic spirit which both Great Britain and the Arabs have been compelled to recognize, Dr. Ben Zion Mossinsohn, vice president of the World Zionist Movement and for many years head of a Hebrew school in Palestine, told an audience of more than 600 at a dinner on the Cleveland Zionist Society's second birthday in Hotel Hollenden last night.

Rabbi A. H. Silver of the Temple presided and announced that a \$500 scholarship to Hebrew University of Jerusalem had been subscribed by the Cleveland Zionist Society. United States Senator Robert J. Bulkley and Mayor Harold H. Burton conveyed greetings.

The value of Palestine as a place of refuge for Jewish youth of Eu-

rope was emphasized by Dr. Mossinsohn.

"When the Jew has the slightest possibility of doing so, he builds and creates," said Dr. Mossinsohn, adding that the exclusion of Jews from professions in many European countries meant depriving them of hope.

### Two Trends of History.

"History is divided into two parts," he continued. "The east has given the world culture, and the west has given it civilization. Our destiny may be to bring the civilization of the west to the culture of the east and give back, as a present to the world, a new culture from the east."

Referring to progress the Jews have made in transforming Palestine into a fertile land, Dr. Mossinsohn asserted that, through new implements and methods of irrigation, the Jews had made the country five times as productive as it was before.

The Zionist movement has a three-fold motivation, explained Dr. Mossinsohn. The Jews wish to have the feeling of a home, where they have already rooted themselves to the soil; they want to keep their position secure for the sake of the 17,000,000 Jews in the world, and they feel and know that in maintaining their position in Palestine they are defending a right and just cause.

"It is your destiny," said the speaker, addressing the audience directly, "to speak out to the Jews of the world and for the Jews of the world. You must demand Palestine for the Jews. The United States, in its position, has a right to demand of Great Britain that it fulfill its duties as trustee.

"It is now a fight for Jewish honor, and we shall have to see we shall not lose this privilege, for never before have the Jews needed Palestine as bitterly as they need it today."





A crowd which overflowed the Ballroom of the Hollenden Hotel and filled the adjoining rooms attended the Second Annual Banquet and Dance of The Cleveland Zionist Society. A holiday spirit prevailed among the guests.

The celebration opened with the kindling of the Chanukah lights by Emanuel Rosenberg following which the entire assembly joined in the singing of the "Rock of Ages".

Warm greetings were conveyed by Mayor Harold H. Burton. United States Senator Robert J. Bulkley spoke of his deep interest in the Zionist movement and of the full and sympathetic attitude which the United States Government has taken towards the Balfour Declaration and the upbuilding of the Jewish homeland from the days of President Woodrow Wilson to President Roosevelt. Both the Mayor and the Senator were enthusiastically received by the audience.

A stirring and eloquent address which made a profound impression was delivered by Dr. Ben Zion Mossinson of Palestine. He told of the heroism displayed by the Yishuv during the recent troubles in Palestine and of the determination of Palestine Jewry to defend its position acquired through labor and sacrifice in Palestine not merely for their sake but for the sake of World Jewry. The story of what Palestine has come to mean to the politically and economically harassed Jewish communities throughout the world was graphically told by Dr. Mossinson.

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Toastmaster of the Affair, announced that the Cleveland Zionist Society had forwarded its first scholarship of \$500 to the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and read a telegram from Dr. Samuel B. Finkel, Director of the American Friends of the Hebrew University conveying the thanks and appreciation of the University for the scholarship as well as for the organization of the Cleveland Committee of the Hebrew University which now contains some of the most representative citizens in the cultural and educational life of Cleveland.

Judge Joseph H. Silbert, Chairman of the membership Committee, presented to Dr. Silver as a token of the love and respect of the Society, one hundred and eleven new members who have joined the Society within the last four weeks. Dr. Fred M. Falkman presented the Certificate which was received from the Jewish National Fund acknowledging the inscription of the name of Dr. Nahum Sokoloff in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund.

The two candles of the birthday cake marking the second anniversary of the Society were kindled by Dr. William Rigelhaupt, Chairman of the Program Committee, and Mr. I. Evans, Treasurer.

Mr. David Glinkovsky rendered a group of Palestinian and Hebrew songs which delighted the audience.
