ON THURSDAY EVENING, JANUARY 7

Marvin Lowenthal, author of "The Jews of Germany" will address the Cleveland Zionist Society, Thursday evening, January 7 at 8:15 P.M. in Mahler Hall of The Temple, East 105th St. and Ansel Road. Mr. Lowenthal will speak on GERMANY TODAY AND AMERICA TOMORROW. This meeting is free to the public.

Proof of Mr. Lowenthal's keen ability as an analyst of modern social trends on the world scene is his feat ~~of~~ of predicting the success of the Nationalists in Germany and the effort to drive the Jews to the Ghetto ten years before the event. At that time, 1923, Hitler was known only for his fiasco in the Munich beer hall.

Marvin Lowenthal was born in Bradford, Pa., in 1891. He was graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1915 and then spent a year at Harvard. He has been an editor of the Menorah Journal and one of its leading contributors.

AMERICAN JEWISH
ARCHIVES

For ten years (1922-32) he has lived abroad, chiefly in Paris, but his work as editor, journalist, representative of national minority interests at the League of Nations and as a secretary of the World Conference for International Peace through Religion took him on extensive travels through Europe, North Africa, and the Near East.

In 1922 he spent the greater part of a year in Germany which he has frequently revisited, but his new book is not concerned only with modern Germany. It is a story ~~of~~ of 16 centuries, tracing the history of the Jew in Germany from 321 A.D. down to the present time.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am happy to inform you that we have arranged for Mr. Pierre van Paassen, internationally famous correspondent and Christian Zionist, to visit your community on Tuesday, February 23rd.

It is no exaggeration to state that a real treat is in store for you, coming from recent visits to Palestine, Soviet Russia and a number of European countries including Spain — for that matter even Ethiopia figured in his itinerary — Mr. van Paassen's message is not only pregnant with information but also has in it the elements of lofty inspiration.

As you were informed when we originally wrote you, the lecture fee is \$50. plus railroad expense. Having succeeded in arranging so extensive a tour for him the railroad fare has been reduced to a minimum and therefore amounts to only \$15. In other words the total cost to you will be \$65.

Mr. van Paassen is prepared to lecture on the following subjects:

"A Gentile Surveys the World Jewish Scene"
"Does the Chaos in Society Lead to War"
"Zionism and World Forces"

Kindly indicate which topic you would prefer.

Being intensely interested in numerically strengthening the Zionist Organization of America, Mr. van Paassen is willing either prior to his scheduled public lecture or immediately thereafter to meet with a group of the workers of your District. If possible I would urge that such a conference be arranged. It could take the form of a little dinner meeting in which case, of course, it would have to be arranged in advance of the public lecture.



Dear Abba:

I am touched by your cordial invitation to come to Cleveland which much to my regret, I can't accept.

I arrived on the 22nd and spent five days with my wife and child who have been here for a year, and want in the intervening time to finish my negotiations on the Huleh for which I have gotten from the Refugee Economic Corporation a participation of \$250,000. I must sail again on the 10th.

Our situation in Palestine is far from happy. I look for restrictions on rights previously possessed of one sort or another. These are matters which can best be talked about but not written about. If you are in New York before March 10, I shall be extremely glad to tell you in detail about my views and conjectures.


Dear Dr. Silver:

THE SHEKEL CAMPAIGN FOR 1937

Important Announcement

The Zionist Executive in Jerusalem has summoned Zionists the world over to undertake an extraordinary campaign for the enrollment of Shekel-payers as the first step in the organization of the next Zionist Congress to be held in August of this year.

It is anticipated that at this session of the Congress, important, far-reaching decisions will have to be made, in view of the forthcoming report of the British Royal Commission. All Zionist resources will have to be mobilized and registered in the next Zionist Congress.

At a meeting of representatives of the various national Zionist Organizations in America, called by Eliezer Kaplan and Louis Lipsky, members of the Zionist Executive, it was decided to organize the National Shekel Board for the United States forthwith; and to take steps at once to inaugurate an extraordinary Shekel Campaign to be held during the months of April and May, 1937.

It was agreed that notice be given to all local Zionist groups - Z.O.A. Districts, Hadassah Chapters, Order Camps, local branches of the Poale Zion-Zvire Zion, and of the Mizrachi Organization - to proceed with the organization of local Shekel Commissions who are to assume charge of the Shekel Campaign in their respective communities, and to set the machinery for the election of delegates to the Zionist Congress, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the National Shekel Board.

Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt has been a leader in American and world Zionism for many years, occupying a number of important positions in the Administration of the Zionist Organization of America and in the World Zionist Organization. He was vice-chairman of the American Organization and American member of the Financial and Economic Council of the World Zionist Organization.

Judge Rosenblatt has been successful in initiating and carrying through a number of important institutions and enterprises which have been of conspicuous service in promoting the development of Palestine. Chief among these is the American Zion Commonwealth organized for the purpose of selling Palestine land to American Jews and establishing colonies, which he founded before the war. The Commonwealth has already established Balfouria, which it is now extending and has also established Herzlia, to the north of Tel-Aviv and Afule. In 1923 Judge Rosenblatt returned from Palestine with the first Jewish municipal bonds in history, those of Tel-Aviv, which he successfully floated on the American market. On his recent visit in Palestine Judge Rosenblatt brought about a union of principal Jewish townships in Palestine under the name of the Palestine Municipal Union. Mr. Rosenblatt returned from Palestine a few ~~months~~ ago, where he made a thorough survey of economic conditions.

The Cleveland Zionist Society will be represented at the forthcoming convention of the Zionist Organization of America to be held in New York City, beginning June 26th by the following delegates: I. Evans, Dr. F. M. Falkman, Mrs. Arthur I. Fischer, Morris Friedman, George W. Furth, Samuel Katz, Rabbi David Sherman, Judge Joseph H. Silbert, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and Leon Wiesenfeld. Alternates elected are: J. J. Bassichis, Yakov Goldstein, H.L. Kollin, Max Lieber, Elisha Papo, Mrs. R. Peretz, J. T. Selzman, Mrs. A. Ture and Mr. A. Woldman.

A well attended meeting devoted to a discussion of Convention problems as well as of the issues before the forthcoming Zionist Congress in Switzerland was held on ~~Tuesday~~ Tuesday evening, June 15 and was addressed by Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt of Haifa and by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver.

The Society voted to hold a picnic for its membership sometime during the summer.



RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION IN THE UNITED STATES
OF DELEGATES TO THE TWENTIETH WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

1. DATE OF ELECTION: The date of Election of Delegates to the Twentieth World Zionist Congress is officially set for Sunday, June 20th, 1937.
2. ELIGIBILITY FOR VOTING: Every Jew, eighteen years of age, or over, who has paid a Shekel fee for the year 5697 (1937) before May 28th, 1937, has the right to vote at the Congress Election, providing the number of his Shekel Receipt appears as paid on the official register of paid Shekirim Receipts.
3. SUPERVISION OF ELECTIONS: (a) The Central Election Board directs and has complete supervision of the Elections throughout the United States. All communications should be addressed to the Central Shekel and Election Board for the Twentieth World Zionist Congress, 111 Fifth Avenue, New York, N. Y.
(b) The entire election area of the United States is considered as one constituency. The Central Election Board therefore also exercises the rights and duties of District Election Committees.
(c) Local Election Committees are to be constituted by the representatives of the Z. O. A., Poale Zion, Ziere Zion, Mizrahi and Jewish State Party where branches of these organizations exist. Other electoral groups, having nomination lists, are entitled to be represented on local election committees in an advisory capacity only. The Z.O.A. includes the Hadassah and the Order Sons of Zion.
In constituting these committees the proportion of 4:4:2 - General Zionists, Poale Zion and Mizrahi respectively - should be maintained.
4. NOMINATION LISTS: All nomination lists must be submitted to the Central Shekel and Election Board not later than May 28th, 1937. Each nomination list is to be signed by at least one hundred voters belonging to the election area. These voters have to declare the name of the person authorized to act as their representative. No voter may sign more than one nomination list. No nomination list shall contain more than twice as many names as can be elected delegates in the particular area in addition to the required number of Deputy Delegates. Each nomination list must also state to which World Election List it is attached.
5. POLLING PLACES: (a) All localities where there are any Zionist Societies, or branches, shall be provided with one or more polling places to be organized under the direction of the Central Election Board.
(b) Polling places shall remain open on election day from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M.
6. REGISTER OF PAID SHEKEL RECEIPTS: The Central Shekel and Election Board will publish an official register containing a record of the numbers of the paid 5697 (1937) Shekel Receipts, which have been reported as issued and paid for on or before May 28th, 1937. Only persons, the number of whose Shekel Receipt appears on official register have the right to vote.
7. METHODS OF VOTING: (a) The ballot is secret and direct. No one may vote on behalf of another. Each voter must call in person at the polling station, declare his name and address to the Local Election Committee. Before receiving a ballot, each voter must present and surrender to the Local Election Committee his Shekel Receipt for the year 5697 (1937). Each voter, after receiving a ballot, shall mark it and personally place it into the ballot box.
(b) The Local Election Committee shall enter upon special forms, supplied by the Central Election Committee, the name and address and Shekel Receipt number of each voter. Each Shekel Receipt, upon being surrendered, must be marked voted.

(It is suggested that every polling station be supplied with rubber stamp "voted", so that the marking of the surrendered Shekel Receipt may be facilitated.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION IN THE UNITED STATES
OF DELEGATES TO THE TWENTIETH WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

(continued)

(c) On completion of elections, the Local Election Committee shall open the ballot boxes, count the votes and record results upon official forms supplied by the Central Election Board. Counting of votes shall take place in public.

(d) When a Shekel payer's right to vote is challenged for any reason, or when there may be doubts of any kind about a Shekel payer's eligibility for voting, the ballot papers of such voters are not to be deposited in the ballot box, but are to be put in special sealed envelopes which together with their Shekel Receipts, are to be forwarded (in an another envelope) with the rest of the ballots accompanied by note of explanation.

8. ELECTION RETURNS: (a) The Local Election Committee shall forward to the Central Election Board immediately after the election, the completed election returns, together with all ballots cast and the corresponding Shekel Receipts. Election returns postmarked, or expressed, later than midnight, June 22nd, will not be counted by the Central Election Board.

(b) The Central Election Board shall ascertain the election results on the basis of all election returns.

9. COMPLAINTS: (a) Complaints against instructions or regulations issued by the Central Election Board or the Local Election Committee, must be made and forwarded to the Congress Attorney (Dr. A. Barth, Rechow Jerusalem 16, Hadar Hakarmel, Haifa, Palestine), and this must be done in writing. Copies of the complaint must also be forwarded simultaneously to the Executive of the Zionist Organization (77, Gt. Russell Street, London, W.C.1), and to the Central Election Board, 111 Fifth Avenue, New York, N.Y.

(b) Petitions against validity of elections have to be sent in writing and in two copies. One of these to be sent to the Central Election Board and one to the local committee. Such petitions must reach their destination not later than July 12th, 1937. The petition must include a correct description of the polling station, particulars as to election proceedings which are being contested and particulars as to the evidence submitted, and if at all possible also depositions of witnesses signed by at least 20 Shekel payers entitled to vote. Their signatures and addresses must appear in a legible handwriting.

Elections shall be conducted in all respects subject to the rules of election and the Constitution of the World Zionist Organization.

These rules are subject to amendment by the Board.

THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY




In 1918, while the Turkish guns could still be heard in the Holy Land, a few men of vision and inspiration laid the cornerstone of the Hebrew University on Mt. Scopus.

In 1925, the first building was dedicated by the late Earl of Balfour in the presence of scientists and scholars of world renown who came as the representatives of many of the oldest universities of the world.

"This occasion marks a great epoch in the history of the people who have made this little land of Palestine the seed ground of great religions . . . and who will look back to this day as one of the great milestones in their future career."

From that time the Hebrew University has rapidly grown and has extended its scope through the addition of new departments. The progress of the University is shown by the growth of its Academic Staff from thirty-seven in 1925, to one hundred and three in 1936 and its student body from one hundred and thirty to six hundred.

THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY



The University at present numbers ten buildings, housing among others, the Institute of Mathematics, the Institute of Physics, the Chemistry Department, the Cancer Research Laboratories, the School of Oriental Studies, the highly important Institute of Jewish Studies and the Jewish National and University Library, the largest in the Middle and Near East. Recently ground was broken for a Medical Center and a Hospital.

Many famous scholars and scientists, some of them exiles from Germany, have found at the Hebrew University, a place of refuge where they are enabled to continue their important studies and research.

JUDGE BERNARD A. ROSENBLATT

Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt has been a leader in American and world Zionism for many years, occupying a number of important positions in the Administration of the Zionist Organization of America and in the World Zionist Organization. He was vice-chairman of the American Organization and American member of the Financial and Economic Council of the World Zionist Organization.

Judge Rosenblatt has been successful in initiating and carrying through a number of important institutions and enterprises which have been of conspicous service in promoting the development of Palestine. Chief among these is the American Zion Commonwealth organized for the purpose of selling Palestine land to American Jews and establishing colonies, which he founded before the war. The Commonwealth has already established Balfouria, which it is now extending and has also established Herzlia, to the north of Tel-Aviv and Afule. In 1923 Judge Rosenblatt returned from Palestine with the first Jewish municipal bonds in history, those of Tel-Aviv, which he successfully floated on the American market. On his recent visit in Palestine Judge Rosenblatt brought about a union of principal Jewish townships in Palestine under the name of the Palestine Municipal Union. Mr. Rosenblatt returned from Palestine a few ~~days~~ ago, where he made a thorough survey of economic conditions.

Judge Rosenblatt served as City Magistrate in New York where he is prominent in the councils of the Democratic Party. He has written extensively on economic subjects and is the author of several books on Zionism. Judge Rosenblatt is a forceful speaker and is a recognized expert on Palestinian economic problems.

The musical portion of this first meeting of the season, ~~which is free to the public~~, will be presented by the noted Cleveland violinist, Dr. Jerome Gross.



He ^{has} received the degree of Master of Arts from St. Lawrence University, Doctor of Law from Syracuse University, Doctor of Law from Oglethorpe University, Doctor of Science from Temple University, and is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons.

He was appointed professor in the Medical school of Michigan University. At 33 years of age he became Mayor of Ann Arbor. Subsequently he became President of the Board of Education, and President of the Park board, as well as a member of the United States Pension Examining Board. In 1908 he was chosen

president of his National Medical Organization and in that year became the Dean of Flower Hospital Medical College, New York City.


