I have another request to make of you. The annual Chanukah banquet of the Cleveland Zionist Society, which is its outstanding affair of the season, will be held on Sunday evening, December 5. **A**FTER an absence of ten years Ludwig Lewisohn returned to the United States in 1934 to settle permanently with his family and it was soon found that his years of observation and reflection abroad had led him to become a crusader against stereotyped civilization. His humanism stresses the values of the past and calls for wider horizons.

With a message that was timely it was not long before the invitations began to come in like a flood tide and his promise to speak on a lecture tour for a period of five weeks was extended and re-extended again and again until he had covered the country from Coast to Coast in a twenty-five week tour. Wherever he went he was acclaimed not only for his eloquence and power but above all, by men and women of the most varied religious and political beliefs, as one whose message is profoundly needed in a confused and difficult age.

Because of Dr. Lewisohn's very real success as a speaker we have persuaded him to again interrupt his creative work, to drop his pen and devote at least part of his time to the lecture platform.

Born in Berlin, Dr. Lewisohn was eight years old when his parents brought him to South Carolina, and except for his extended travels in Europe and the near East he has lived his life in America. He was educated at Columbia University, was instructor in German at the University of Wisconsin for five years, and professor of German literature at Ohio State University.

Dr. Lewisohn has written some of the most beautiful prose known to English literature as well as some of its most pungent criticism. During the period of his editorial work for *The Nation* there was a demand to see and hear the man and he accepted invitations to speak in most of the principal cities east of the Mississippi. The success of those earlier speeches was in a large measure responsible for the immediate demand for him in 1934.

"Humanism" is the only proper name for a certain rich and noble philosophy of life. By right it belongs not to the lay parsons who claim it but to those who have first familiarized themselves with "the best that has been thought and said." Today in his study Lewisohn works with his shelves lined with American, English, German, Hebrew, French, and Latin volumes, and he is loyal not to one race, one creed, or one political faith but to all that have touched him. He has sought to be a citizen of the world though by choice paying his taxes to Uncle Sam.
