

Biographical Sketch of Dr. Nahum Goldmann.

Dr. Nahum Goldmann: 44 years old, born in Russia. Received his education in Germany where he lived till 1933. He was a member of the Zionist Executive of the German Zionist Federation. He was in Palestine before the World War and published a book about Palestine. In 1922 he founded the Eshkal Publishing Company which published the Encyclopedia Judaica of which ten volumes have been published before the Hitler regime stopped the enterprise. He became a member of the Zionist Actions Committee in 1933 and served as one of the members of the Political Commission which negotiated with the MacDonald Government after the publication of the Passfield White Paper. He was the organizer of the first World Jewish Congress at Geneva in 1932 and then became President of the Committee of Jewish Delegations in Paris, successor of Leo Motzkin. When the first World Jewish Congress was established in 1935, he became the Chairman of its Executive. Today he is the Chairman of the Administrative Committee of the World Jewish Congress. In 1935 he was elected a member of the Zionist Executive and became the representative of the Jewish Agency for Palestine at the League of Nations in Geneva, both of which posts he is holding today.



ZIONIST YOUTH COUNCIL

Digest of Minutes of meeting held on Monday, November 25, 1940 at the Hadassah Office, 10616 Euclid Ave.

Presiding, Mrs. B. F. Margolin, Temporary Chairman Secretary, Miss Dianne Kaplan

The meeting was held for the purpose of hearing the reports of the Budget Committee and the Program Committee which had been appointed at the last meeting.

Mrs. Weidenthal, Chairman of the Budget Committee gave the following report.

The Committee consisting of Mrs. C. M. Weidenthal, Chairman, Miss Lillian Berman, Mrs. Nathan Brilliant and Mr. E Goelman had met and discussed the needs of a budget for Young Judea and suggested the following budget:

> 10 leaders @ \$1.50 per session \$600.00 30 sessions for Gymnasium @ \$5.00 per 150.00 Postage, Bullitin, Interclub activities, etc. 250.00 \$1000.00

Mrs. Weidenthal explained the the committee had discussed the matter of budget at great length and investigated all the needs and had arrived at the above conslusions as the minimum for Young Judaea for this coming year.

There was a great deal of discussion and the motion was passed to accept the report of the committee for recommendation to the various organizations represented on the council.

Dr. Azreil Eisenberg (was not present), Chairman of the Program Committee submitted the following report;

It was recommended that the Council devote the major efforts to Young Judaea this year both in the matter of Budget and Program. The Committee further recommended the following proposals:

> 1. That every Zionist adult group in the city be asked to invite Young Judaea to present a part or all of its March program before the regular meeting of the organization , (March is designated as "Youth Month" throughout the country)

> 11. That all Zionist groups in the city have a Zionist-Family Get*Together during the month of March. The program of the affair to be given by the Zionist Adult Youth Groups of the City. Every General Zionist body be represented on the program committee for the arrangements.

> 111. That the Zionist District be asked to devote one of the Friday luncheon sessions in March to a discussion of Zionist Youth.

1V. That the Zionist Council for Youth conduct a week-end Seminar at on e of the camps in the spring to which will be invited Young Judaea Leaders, Avukah, Masada and Junior Hadassah; that Friday Evening and Saturday be devoted to general Zionist youth discussion and that Sunday be devoted to a discussion of the organizational problems of each of the constituent organizations which will participate in this projuect. (Dr. Eisenberg has conducted similar Saminars in Cincinnati).

The report of the Committee was accepted as presented. The program committee consisted of Dr. A. Eisenberg, Chairman, Mr. Morris Friedman, Mr. Elazar Goelman, Mrs. B. F. Margolin, Mrs Harry Rosen and Mrs. C. M. Weidenthal.

The discussion reverted to the question of the budget and how the money would be raised. It was the concensus of ppinion that the budget be allocated equitably among the various constituent groups. Mr. Brilliant moved that the allocation be presented to the constituent members as follows:

Senior Hadassah	\$300.00
Zionist District	250.00
Zionist Society	250.00
Heights Zionist District	150.00
Keren Hayesod	150.00
Migdal Zion	25.00
Total	1125.00

This motion was seconded and passed to be recommended to the sonstituent members.

It was moved and passed that a digest of the minutes be sent to each representative and to each of the constituent groups with a letter urging the presidents of the groups to send in the mames of appointed representatives and alternates.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Monday, December 23, 1940 at the Hadassah office.

Dear Rabbi:

In accordance with your request, I am mailing under separate cover twenty booklets of the Hebrew University. About one hundred fifty of these booklets were mailed together with copy of the enclosed letter, to each of last year's subscribers, together with likely prospects from our membership.

THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY JERUSALEM

CULL



The Hebrew University of Jerusalem was opened on April 1st, 1925. It has developed rapidly since then, and today comprises over ten main buildings. These include the Jewish National and University Library, which, with its 350,000 volumes, is the largest library in the Near East, and the three buildings of the "Medical Centre" (Clinic, Medical School and Nurses' School) erected jointly by the University, the American Jewish Physicians' Committee and the Hadassah Women's Zionist Organisation of America. Four more buildings are in course of erection.

The University possesses Faculties of Humanities and Science, also a Prefaculty of Medicine, which is to be developed gradually into a full faculty. A Faculty of Agriculture is in the process of being created, and a special building for it is already being erected. There are at present 1200 students on the University registers. The teaching staff, research workers and assistants number 130 persons.

The University possesses a number of collections, some of them unique of their kind. Among these are the Schocken Collection of Hebrew Incunabula, the Schwadron Collection of Jewish Autographs and Portraits, the Museum of Biblical and Talmudic Flora and Jewish and Arabic Plantlore, archaeological, botanical, zoological, geological and medical collections, and an Archive of Oriental Music.

At the head of the University's administration in Jerusalem is Salmann Schocken, in his capacity as Chairman of the Executive Council. Prof. Chaim Weizmann is Chairman of the Board of Governors, and Dr. Judah L. Magnes President of the Hebrew University. Academic matters are dealt with by the Senate and the Faculties.

The University bestows the degrees of "Magister Artium" (M. A.), "Magister Scientiarum" (M. Sc.) and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.). The Hebrew University is open to all students, without distinctions of race or creed.





At this time, when a calamity even worse than they have ever suffered in the past has befallen the Jewish people, special significance attaches to the Hebrew University. Jewish scientists of renown, exiled from scientific institutes in Europe, have found new possibilities for instruction and research at the Hebrew University. The certificates placed by the Mandatory Government at the disposal of the University, entitle the immigrant students to Palestinian citizenship. Here the exiles find a home, and at the University, they are given every opportunity of acquiring that knowledge which will enable them to fit into their new sphere. At the same time, the Hebrew University is saving the cultural treasures of the Jewish people from the destruction that has overtaken their sources in Central and Eastern Europe. Thus, in ever greater measure, the University on Mount Scopus is becoming the great spiritual centre of the Jewish people.

The University's achievements in the various branches of science play a decisive part in the upbuilding of Palestine — in caring for health and hygiene, in solving problems of soil and irrigation, in cooperating actively in the fields of industry and agriculture. In the sphere of education, and in furthering and developing the Hebrew language, the University fulfills functions of the highest importance. Its library circulates books throughout the country, and these facilities are supplemented by various courses and lectures by members of the University staff.

The Hebrew University receives no subsidy from the government, and must depend on the help of friends all over the world. Today, when in addition to its ordinary functions as a scientific institute, the Hebrew University has to fulfill tremendous obligations in saving Jewish scholars and students, and when it must, furthermore, fully support hundreds of its students, who have been rendered destitute, since war has cut them off from their sources of maintenance abroad, it is naturally especially difficult to cover the budget. The more so, since leading Jewish communities who were formerly active supporters of the University have now been annihilated.

In spite of all, however, the Hebrew University carries on, in the firm conviction that help from its friends in all parts of the world will not be lacking. Every Jew is bound to support the University in fulfilling its vital tasks on behalf of the Jewish people and the Jewish spirit.



ISRAEL MOSES SIEFT

Israel Moses Sieff, distinguished British-Jewish industrialist and philanthropist, is now visiting the United States on behalf of the British Board of Trade. Mr. Sieff, who is a director of the Marks & Spencer chain store system of Great Britain, has been one of the leading figures for many years in London's "Political and Economic Planning Group".

Due to his predominant position in British economic and political spheres, Mr. Sieff has exerted a powerful influence on behalf of the rebuilding of the Jewish homeland in Palestine, with which he has been identified from the days of the first World War.

In 1934, he endowed, in memory of his son, the Daniel Sieff Technical Research Institute at Rehoboth, Palestine which is directed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.
