

BIOGRAPHY OF WENDELL PHILLIPS

Reverend Wendell Phillips, for the past six years Rector of Christ's Church, Rye, N.Y. has earned wide acclaim as a vigorous, forthright and effective champion of human rights.

Educated at Wesleyan and at Union Theological Seminary, Mr. Phillips taught at the American University in Cairo from 1926 to 1929. He is an astute observer of political trends, has made a thorough study of Near Eastern problems and is today a well-qualified commentator on the significant developments in that extremely important part of the world. Mr. Phillips has also served as assistant Chaplain of Columbia University and as Rector of Trinity Church, New Rochelle, N.Y.

He brings to the lecture platform wide knowledge, born of experience and intensive study, strong convictions and a stimulating approach to the burning issues of our time.

Dear Friend:

This communication is being sent to you so that you may act at once on a matter of supreme importance to our people. I need not dwell on the fate of our people in Europe. They, who have suffered most and longest at the hands of the Axis Powers, are being deprived of the opportunity of rebuilding their lives in Palestine.


The infamous White Paper which threatens to choke off all of the progress made in Palestine and shut the door of hope in the faces of those who are entitled to the fruits of victory, is being stringently enforced. It may be continued in force unless definite action is undertaken by our Government. It is our responsibility as American citizens to voice our demand that justice be done. Our voices will be heard if they are directed to the proper place in sufficient volume.

I AM, THEREFORE, CALLING UPON YOU TO WRITE AT ONCE TO PRESIDENT TRUMAN, SECRETARY OF STATE BYRNES, YOUR SENATORS, AND CONGRESSMEN, URGING IMMEDIATE ACTION. Enclosed is a specimen letter to the President, containing the salient points of our demands. Compose your own letter and make it strong, for you are exercising the right and privilege of every American citizen.

I hope you will comply with my request at once. Our hope rests in decisive action, implemented immediately.

My dear President Truman:

The Jewish people, chief victims of the war which has just ended, are now faced with disappointment of their hopes. The White Paper relating to Palestine is still in effect, and the doors of the land promised as a National Jewish Home Land are shut in the faces of those who have no other place in which they can rehabilitate themselves physically, economically, and socially. The sacrifices made by the Jewish people in the common war against the oppression of Fascism are not being recognized.

I wish to express my disappointment, and to ask that you take steps to have this wrong righted. I refuse to believe that an ally of long standing can have its hopes shattered by a refusal to have its just demands satisfied. I call upon you in the name of the decency for which Americanism stands to act at once in order to have the White Paper withdrawn. The doors of Palestine must be thrown open at once for all Jews who are in need of a place to live in. Steps should be taken to enable the Jews to establish a Commonwealth in Palestine.

I cannot believe that, animated as you are by the desire to see justice done, you will ignore the rights of the Jewish people to these demands. The hope of mankind for a lasting and just peace can be justified only by decisive steps taken to correct conditions which furnished a fertile soil for the machinations of those who brought on the war. The White Paper was one of the instruments that watered this soil. As an American citizen, I ask that our Government bend all efforts to eliminate this instrument.







My dear Abe:

When Reverend Wendell Phillips was here to address The Cleveland Zionist Society, he expressed the thought that it was more or less a waste of time to bring pro-Zionist Christian speakers to address Zionist meetings. It is like "carrying coals to New Castle." They should be used, he thought, to reach non-Zionists and anti-Zionists. I think his point is very well taken.

As you know, The Cleveland Zionist Society is arranging its annual Chanukah Banquet at the Statler Hotel on December 2. The guest speaker will be Senator Brewster, one of the most brilliant members of the Senate and one of the most ardent spokesmen of our cause. It would be a pity if his message, too, were limited to convinced Zionists. I think an effort should be made to bring to the meeting a few hundred of our non-Zionist friends, those who have denounced Zionism, who are not yet convinced, or who are opposed. This can be done only if their friends would invite them as guests to this banquet.

I am going to be away from the city most of the time between now and December 2, else I would do a good bit of the work myself. I would appreciate it very much if you would reach a few of our friends like Mr. Harry J. Fisher, Sam Friedman, Dan Sherby, Sidney Weitz, Clarence Fishel, and as many others as you can think of who would undertake to fill tables with their non-Zionist friends. 





Society at Hotel Statler last night. "Before the resolution in behalf of Palestine as a homeland for the Jews was introduced in the Senate this month, President Truman and Secretary of State Byrnes both indicated there would be no administration opposition to the bill," Senator Brewster said. "Last week they reversed themselves and opposed it."

The senator said a commission was now being appointed to find out if there was room for Jews in Palestine. He viewed the proposed senatorial commission with concern "because when you oppose an issue you appoint a commission to obscure it."

Middle East oil, not the welfare of some million displaced and homeless Jews in Europe, is what presents the Palestine "problem," Senator Brewster charged.

"There are 50 billion barrels of petroleum there—the richest stake in the world for a third world

war," he said. "Three years ago the British lion and the Russian bear were growling at each other over that oil. Now the United States is determined to keep them from fighting each other."

### "Oil Over Humanity"

These great oil reserves are under concession to British and American companies by the Arab rulers, the senator continued. The answer to the issue, he said, is "oil over suffering humanity."

Brewster scoffed at the suggestion that 500,000 American soldiers would be needed in Palestine to maintain order if the Jews were allowed entry. There are 30,000 Jewish volunteers from Palestine now serving in the British Army. Order would be certain if these volunteers were released by the British and sent back to Palestine, the senator said.

All American contact with the Middle East is being squeezed out by British order, he implied.

"This country spent over two billion dollars building airfields throughout the Middle East," Senator Brewster said. "Now American planes are ordered out so we'll have no communication with the hottest and tensest spot in the world."

The return from Palestine of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, co-chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council and presidential spokesman on the issue, according to Senator Brewster, will offer the first source of uncensored information as to what the British are doing there.

### Efforts Here Praised

America's quest for final peace is the same as the search of the Jewish race for a homeland, the senator said. In conclusion he praised the determined and courageous efforts of the Cleveland Zionist Society in behalf of a Palestine solution.

Mayor Thomas A. Burke, who was accompanied at the dinner by

Mrs. Burke, welcomed the senator, who is an intimate friend and former college classmate of Associate Justice Harold H. Burton, of the United States Supreme Court.

The program was opened with the "Kindling of the Hanukkah Lights" by Maurice Goldman, baritone, and an invocation by Rabbi William M. Kramer. Sidney N. Weitz was chairman.







My dear Ralph:

I understand that you would like to have an authoritative statement on what the Zionist Movement understands when it speaks of the "Jewish State" in Palestine. I would refer you to the memorandum which was submitted to the United Nations Conference on International Organization by the Jewish Agency for Palestine in April, 1945. You will find the entire memorandum printed in the Palestine Yearbook 1944-45. I am giving you the relevant paragraph (No. 9, page 321):

"In this connection the Jewish Agency for Palestine wishes to emphasize the determination of the Jewish people to establish the Jewish State as a free and democratic Commonwealth fully integrated within the appropriate international arrangements for the betterment of mankind and a stable and peaceful world. On behalf of the Jewish people it gives solemn assurance that the Jewish State will have scrupulous regard for the preservation of the personal and property rights as well as of the religious, linguistic and cultural rights of the Arab and other non-Jewish population of Palestine, and it pledges further the civil and religious equality of all the inhabitants of Palestine before the law. The inviolability of the holy places of the various religions shall be guaranteed by appropriate international agreement."

I should also like to refer you to the statement read into the records by Dr. Emanuel Neumann at the Hearings on the Palestine Resolution held before the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House on February 16, 1944, which you will find on page 315 of the printed record. I am transcribing it herewith for you:

"By a Jewish commonwealth we certainly do not mean a state which is exclusively Jewish. We do not mean to drive the existing Arab population into the desert or cast it into the sea. On the contrary, those who choose to do so are to remain. Moreover, their civil and personal rights shall be inviolate. There shall be a full and complete equality before the law. Not only that, but the Arabs shall have every

right and possibility to preserve and develop their cultural and religious heritage. Their language shall be recognized and their traditions respected. And in addition they shall share fully in the economic advantages and opportunities and the prosperity which will come with the modernization of the country and the development of its resources.

"Indeed, this has already been the case in a substantial measure. If, then, we are asked what do we mean by the adjective "Jewish" as applied to the future commonwealth of Palestine my answer is that it is a short and abbreviated way of saying that through the repatriation of large numbers of European and other Jews, the Jewish people will attain a numerical majority in Palestine and thereby permanently guarantee the open door for others who may follow; so that Palestine shall never cease to serve as a sanctuary and homeland for any and all Jews from whatever part of the world who may choose to go there in the future. It will also be a Jewish commonwealth in the vital sense that in that country, in that little corner of the world, the Jewish people, no longer living under minority conditions but as a majority, will be free to apply their talent, their industry, their genius and leave the intangible impress of their civilization upon their ancestral land as in the days of the kings and the prophets.

"But the development of this Jewish commonwealth shall take place under democratic institutions and in a democratic spirit. The Jews will preponderate and lead in the development of the country without dominating or oppressing the minority. Jew and Arab devoted to their respective cultures and traditions shall cooperate as free and equal citizens and jointly contribute to the prosperity and welfare of a common single unitary state. The Arab citizens of the Jewish commonwealth will be as favorably situated as are the French-speaking citizens of the British Dominion of Canada. It will be a free and democratic Jewish state composed of Jews, Moslems, Christians and, if there are any, Buddhists, as well -- compatriots, all. All shall be eligible to public office, even the highest."
