ZOA National Convention June 16 - 20

NEW YORK (ZINS) - The 58th Annual National Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will be held on June 16 - 20 in Washington, D.C., according to a resolution adopted by the ZOA National Administrative Council held in New York this week. Isidor S. Turover, of Washington, national treasurer of the organization, has been appointed convention chairman.

Economic and Domestic Policies Main Issues in Coming Israel Elections, Declares Lubinsky

NEW YORK (ZINS) - "The main issues in the election will be the domestic economic policies of the government which have a direct bearing on our security and external political situation. The issue will be a liberal, free enterprise Israel based on competitive economy or a continuation of the Mapai policy of 'socialism in our life time'," declared Mr. Haim Lubinsky, vice-chairman of the National Council of the Israel General Zionist Party, at the meeting of the ZOA National Administrative Council at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. Mr. Lubinsky continued: "The two main contending parties in the forthcoming election fight for the Israel Knesset will be Mapai and the General Zionists. The experience of the General Zionists in the implementation of only a small part of their program, during their two-year tenure in the coalition government, has proved that the decontrol of the economy and the liberalization of industrial and commercial controls have been a boon to Israel, and are major factors in the improvement of the economic situation of Israel.

"The forthcoming Parliamentary elections will show how far the Israeli voter has advanced in the direction of self reliance in the economic field, and how far he is ready to entrust the guidance of Israel affairs in the liberal forces in the country," he said.

New Incentives to Immigration from Western Countries

JERUSALEM (ZINS) - During the coming month the Israel government and the Jewish Agency will adopt new measures designed to encourage immigration by 50,000 families from western countries. Participating in a special meeting called by the Finance Minister Levi Eshkol, were the members of the Jewish Agency Executive Meir Grossman, A. Dobkin and S. Z. Shragai, as well as representatives of the European immigration organizations and similar bodies from North and South Africa.

Among the proposals discussed was one which provides for a loan of up to \$10,000 for every immigrant family from a western country. Another provides for a special exchange rate of IL 2. per dollar for those who transfer foreign capital to Israel.

The meeting decided to establish a consultative body to facilitate immigration from the west.

Israel Health Ministry Director Flying to United States to Obtain Anti-Polio Vaccine

JERUSALEM (ZINS) - Dr. Betish, General Director of Israel's Ministry of Health, is flying to the United States on an urgent mission with instructions from Health Minister Joseph Serlin to obtain the anti-polio vaccine, even at full price.

A few months ago Israel received a gift of the Salk vaccine from the United States for 120,000 children at a cost of \$10,000. However, the shipment was held up because of protests that Israel was being favored over other countries, and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis had to announce that Israel will not receive the vaccine outside of normal channels.

The director of the Health Ministry will make every effort here to obtain an export license so that innoculation of Israel's children can proceed before the beginning of the polio epidemic season.

Ben Gurion Transformed his Settlement in Sde Boker into Political Springboard to Gain Votes, Declares Haboker

TEL AVIV (ZINS) - "Ben Gurion smiles down from all walls in Israel. Mapai launched its election campaign for the Histadrut conference with its main drawing card. Many will deplore the fact that the man who should have become an inspiration and an example by settling in a non-party kibbutz, transformed this into a political springboard," states Itzhak Ziv-Av in Haboker. "It is painful to see how the hopes inspired by his personal example are being dissipated by politics. Ben Gurion is now leading Mapai to the Histadrut elections. Tomorrow he will lead it to the Knesset elections, with the sole goal of perpetuating the present regime" the article concludes.

Unveiling of Masliansky Portrait in ZOA House, Tel Aviv

TEL AVIV (ZINS) - The unveiling ceremony for a portrait of the noted American Zionist leader of the early part of this century, Zvi Hirsh Masliansky, took place at the ZOA House here. Mr. Masliansky's children and grandchildren from the United States and Israel, as well as many of his admirers, were present at the ceremony.

Dr. Bernstein Declared that Tourists are Wanted not only for Their Currency

EIN GEV (ZINS) - The government Tourist Center is making efforts to attract tourists to Israel, not only for financial reasons, but because of a deep desire to have tourists know Israel, stated Dr. Peretz Bernstein, Minister of Commerce and Industry, at the opening of the music festival in Ein Gev.

Dr. Bernstein, in describing the Ein Gev Festival celebration, organized by the Tourist Center to propagate Israel culture, pointed out that "culture cannot be manufactured, but grows like a tree. And like a tree it needs encouragement." The artist who has something to say, he said, must be given an opportunity to develop his talents if our culture is to flourish.

ZOA Conference on Israel and Middle East in New York May 1

NEW YORK (ZINS) - A briefing and orientation conference for ZOA leaders of the New York Metropolitan Area under the auspices of the ZOA Commission on Israel and the Middle East will be held at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City all day Sunday, May 1. Following the pattern of similar conferences held by the Commission in various parts of the country, it is designed to foster a proper understanding of the political situation in which Israel and the Zionist movement find themselves to-day.

The conference will be addressed by a panel of speakers, among whom are: Rabbi Leon Feuer, chairman of ZOA's Department of Public Information; Arthur Liveran, member of the Israel delegation to the UN; Harry Torczyner, chairman of the Commission on Israel and the Middle East; Rev. Karl Baehr, secretary of the American Christian Palestine Committee and Harold P. Manson, executive vice-chairman of the Department of Public Information of the ZOA.

ZOA Symposium on U.S. - Israel Cultural Relations May 12

NEW YORK (ZINS) - Bartley C. Crum, Dr. Emanuel Neumann and the Hon. Leonard Ware, Acting Chief of the Near Eastern Division of the U.S. Information Agency, will be the panel discussants in the first symposium on Cultural Relations between the United States and Israel to be held under the auspices of the ZOA's National Committee for ZOA Activities in Israel on Thursday evening, May 12, in New York's Savoy-Plaza.

General Zionists Helped Improve Israel's Economy, Declares Saphir

TIBERIAS (ZINS) - "Since the General Zionists joined the government there has been marked improvement in Israel's economy", declared Communications Minister Joseph Saphir at a recent meeting in Tiberias. "The budget was balanced and production increased once citizens were given a considerable degree of freedom to produce and reap the fruits of their initiative, he explained.

Conflict over Street Name in Rehovot

REHOVOT (ZINS) - A sharp conflict has broken out in Rehovot over a decision of the Mapai-dominated municipal council to change the name of the street dedicated to Levi Epstein, leader of the organization which founded Rehovot, to commemorate the late Mapai leader David Remez. The council's decision aroused the citizens of Rehovot and after strong intervention by the Farmers Federation the original Levi-Epstein street signs were returned to the posts.

\$38,000,000 Expected from 1955 Citrus Export

REHOVOT (ZINS) - Exports of oranges and other citrus products of private initiative enriched the national treasury by \$36,500,000 during 1954. It is expected that in 1955 the export will net \$38,000,000, announced a spokesman for the Citrus Export Council.

During the next two years an additional 35,000 dunams will be devoted to groves, bringing the entire area to 200,000 dunams. By 1960 production is expected to reach 20,000,000 cases, including 16,000,000 for export. This record production will surpass even the high export mark of 1938, which reached 18,000,000 cases (including output of the Arab groves).

Sharp Decline in Emigration from Israel

JERUSALEM (ZINS) - The past month marked a sharp decline in the number of emigrants from Israel. The March total was 185, which is the smallest number of exits recorded for several years. The Emigration total for February was 346.

American-Israel Economic Horizons New Organ of Chamber of Commerce

NEW YORK (ZINS) - The American-Israel Chamber of Commerce and Industry announces the Leunching this month of a new monthly journal, American-Israel Economic Horizons. The successor to Economic Horizons, published heretofore by the Economic Department of the Jewish Agency, the new monthly will deal with U.S. - Israel business and economic relations, Israel economic news, and the activities of the Chamber itself.

Dear Director: I wish to acknowledge your letter of April 21st in which you state that Mr. David Macarov, Director of the American Zionist Council Youth Department, plans to be in Cleveland on May 12th and 13th for various matters connected with the work of his department. I must hasten to say that since the creation of the American Zionist Committee for Public Affairs my personal work has been directed to carrying out locally its national policies and activities, for the reason that that is the extent of my authority and the limits of my time and energy. More than a year ago you were advised that if there was to be any other type of local Zionist Council, someone from your office would have to come to Cleveland and help organize such a body. I will be very happy to attend a meeting with David Macarov on May 12th for the purpose of making some suggestions in keeping with my limited authority. Sincerely yours, John Cory John Saul S. Dear Mr. Danaceau:

Thank you for your letter of April 28th. I learned this afternoon that after the call my secretary made to your secretary, you had a conversation with Mr. Harry Steinberg, my assistant. I fully understand the situation and appreciate all the circumstances to which you refer. I might add however that it was never contemplated that when the American Zionist Committee for Public Affairs was organized separate committees would be created in local communities in addition to the local Zionist Councils. The reasons that compelled the organization of the AZCPA do not apply to the activities that flow from that committee locally. The local Zionist Councils are able to carry out the requests and directives that are issued from the American Zionist Council as well as the American Zionist Committee for Public Affairs. All that is required is for the local Zionist Council to establish a sub-committee on political affairs similar to other sub-committees operating in the different fields of our work.

I know that you and others have requested that a field worker come into Cleveland as long as a year ago. Unfortunately we did not have the personnel to make such a visit possible nor could Mr. Steinberg nor I manage to find the available week necessary for that operation. I am however happy to say that with the opening of our Chicago office earlier this year we now have a midwestern representative, whose territory includes Cleveland. I am directing him to arrange for a trip to Gleveland for the very purpose that you advise. The only reason I had suggested a meeting when Mr. Macarov comes next week is that since he is acquainted with the problems, it might have been useful to have a preliminary meeting and discussion with him.

You understand of course that we here cannot sall a meeting of the local Zionist Council in Cleveland or anywhere else. That must be done by the local people themselves, in which of course we are happy to cooperate. Several of the people on the list of the Cleveland Zionist Council have replied. Mr. Henry L. Zucker of the Jewish Community Federation of Cleveland has reported that he is willing to meet with others and Mr. Macarov, and I am still hoping that despite the lack of preparations for a meeting, Mr. Macarov will be able to see and speak with as many of the people as possible. Incidentally I might mention that Mrs. Joseph R. Merlin was in New York last wednesday and attended the American Zionist Council Independence Day Reception. I was not able to spend much

- 2 -Mr. Saul S. Danaceau May 3, 1955 time with her because as host that day I was naturally engaged by scores of people. I think she was a little bit offended that I could not take an hour off that afternoon and I tried to make her understand. However, I did introduce Mr. Macarov to her, who spent over an hour discussing the matter with her. I hope that our midwestern representative, Mr. Ben Zion Emanuel. whose office is in Chicago, will be able to include you among those with whom he will discuss the problem when he arranges a visit to Cleveland. By now you have received David Macarov's letter of May 3 which he has shared with me. I know you are going to find the meeting with him very interesting and I know too that you will do all in your power to help him achieve his objective on his visit to Cleveland.

I am not too hopeful about the reorganization of the Cleveland Zionist Council. Saul Danaceau, who has been its Chairman for many years, now no longer considers himself Chairman but is interested in continuing political activities in connection with the American Zionist Committee for Public Affairs. I enclose a copy of my letter to Mr. Danaceau on the subject.

Mrs. Merlin, referred to both in my letter and Mr. Macarov's, is not likely to be too helpful. On the other hand, as Secretary of the Cleveland Zionist Council for a long time, she may still be useful.

Mr. and Mrs. Ezra Shapiro, on whom I had placed some hope for assisting in the organization of the new Cleveland Zionist Organization, are both ill. Others in Cleveland have not been responding to our appeals.

Naturally this vitality depends upon an equal vitality in the respective Zionist groups in Cleveland which make up the Council. In any case do meet with Mr. Macarov. Shortly after his visit I expect that our midwestern representative, Mr. Ben Zion Emanuel, will be planning to come to Cleveland. I am telling him to get in touch with you and am hopeful that before long we shall begin to achieve the kind of results all of us desire.
