While this announcement did not come to me as a complete surprise, it made me sharply and regretfully aware that we will soon miss you as chief spokesman of Israel not only in Washington and New York, but throughout this You have meant much to the new State of Israel but equally as much to American Jewry. We have learned to turn to you in great moments and in significant situations and you never failed us. Your leadership was always sound, your voice movingly eloquent, and your dignified bearing at all times inspired confidence and pride. I am sure that the experience which you gained here during an exciting and historical decade will be of inestimable value to Israel. I still hope that we shall meet before I leave at the end of May, either in Cleveland or in Washington or New York. Let me add that my colleagues are writing to me enthusiastically from Far Eastern Capitals concerning the strong impression which you made during your recent tour.
