I - Give what you can annually for ten years; even \$5000 a year would be significant.


II - Gather some men and women in your community immediately, lay before them our urgent need, and secure from them their utmost in co-operation.

I do not think I shall be in Cincinnati next week, as I have just returned from there, having attended Isidor Wise's funeral.

I want to call your attention to the arrangement which we suggested for the Hebrew Union College School for Teachers. I do so in the hope that you will find yourself free to support it.

It is suggested that the school be managed and financed through the Hebrew Union College with the understanding that the financing is eventually to be assumed by the community of the city of New York. The community has promised \$12,000 for this year, and it is hoped that the needed \$30,000 to \$35,000 will within a reasonable time be found in this vicinity.


It is important that the directing personnel of the school be radically changed. Dr. Schulman is head of the committee and has as his associates some of our local and neighborhood rabbis. They seldom meet and never actually touch the policy of the institution. This is largely due to the inadequacy of Dr. Schulman. I think I am violating no confidence when I say that he is totally incapable of guiding or inspiring a movement of this sort.

Inasmuch as I have not rounded out this eulogy I must ask you to consider it as intended for your private ear. I am however, of the opinion that the Board of Governors should change the method of administering the school here if it wishes to make the project self-sustaining as well as stimulating.

I shall be happy to hear from you in the matter of the Israelite. I am looking forward to seeing you in our synagogue in March.

As you know, of course, on October 19 of this year, Mr. Alfred M. Cohen, Chairman of the Board of Governors, will celebrate his seventieth birthday. It gives me great pleasure to inform you and through you, with your kind cooperation, the members of the Board of Governors, that the Faculty of the Hebrew Union College, by unanimous vote, expresses its desire to confer upon Mr. Cohen, and asks the approval of the Board of Governors therein, the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Hebrew Law in recognition of lifelong devotion to the highest principles of American citizenship and human welfare and fellowship, of unswerving loyalty to the ideals of Judaism and unsparing, self-sacrificing labors in its behalf in various capacities and many high, responsible offices, and of twenty-eight years of faithful, wise and valuable service to the Hebrew Union College as a member, and for twelve years thereof as Chairman, of its Board of Governors.

The decision of the Board of Governors in this matter, expressed in the mail vote, can be read into the Minutes of the Board of Governors at its first regular meeting on November 26.


