My dear Abba:

It is my privilege and very great pleasure to inform you that it is the desire of the Faculty of the Hebrew Union College and its Board of Governors to confer upon you at the Graduation Exercises of the College on Saturday afternoon, May 24th, in recognition of your twenty-six years of distinguished and fruitful service as a Rabbi, and particularly of your most recent service as President of United Palestine Appeal, and in recognition likewise of the credit which you have brought to your Alma Mater by your service and your leadership in the cause of Judaism and of the people of Israel, the honorary degree of Doctor of Hebrew Letters.
