Dauby announcing the gift of the Louis D. Beaumont Trust in the amount of \$50,000 towards the Hebrew Union College Foundation Fund. I am sure that you will wish to acknowledge this contribution directly to the trustees. I am sending you the original letter for your records. This generous gift of the Beaumont Trust should stimulate other gifts in the country. I read the letter at the meeting which we called for last night, where Sol Freshof spoke. He made an excellent presentation of the case. I believe that the results achieved from the group present were quite satisfactory and we ought to have no difficulty raising a substantial amount in Cleveland. There was considerable resistance, and I might even say resentment, to the announcement that a floor of one thousand dollars was placed upon giving. This unprecedented proviso evoked considerable comment. There were a few people present who, though very much interested in the cause, could no give a thousand dollars and they felt themselves thrust out in the cold and their offering, so to speak, rejected. I am persuaded that the College and the Union should make other arrangements. Under no circumstances must the word go out that only gifts of one thousand dollars or over are welcomed by the Hebrew Union College Endowment Fund. This is bad public relations, and no amount of explanation as to the unwillingness of the HUC to trespass upon the Union's Campaign meets the situation.

My dear Dr. Silver:

The questions raised in your letter of the 16th give me a welcome opportunity to bring you up to date with reference to the College Foundation Fund effort.

At the last meeting of the Board of Governors, we were happy to learn that negotiations were being completed as a result of Dr. Morgenstern's efforts which will yield to the College a companion \$50,000 gift which will match the Beaumont Foundation gift which you and Dr. Brickner securted for the College. You will recall that just as your effort in Cleveland had to be postponed temporarily, pending the completion of the U.J.A. drive, we had similar occurrences both in Dallas and Kansas City. On September 12th, just a few days ago, a meeting was held in Dallas through the effort of Fred Florence and Dr. Lefkowitz to solicit gifts for the College. In Kansas City, we expect that they will resume after the High Holy Days and Dr. Mayerberg has already been instrumental in securting a gift of \$5,000 from a foundation that is in the process of liquidation. Dr. Freehof in Pittsburgh is working with his president, Mr. Strassburger, to lay the groundwork for a \$300,000 gift in the form of a memorial, an endowed Chair at the College.

Dr. Morgenstern is now visiting New York City and Boston. We hope that plans will mature for a small dinner meeting in New York City of a selected group of contributors. He also plans to make a beginning in Boston.

Dr. Morgenstern has been in communication with our Alumni on the West Coast and it is quite possible that a trip in this area may be scheduled for January or February. Dr. Rauch in Louisville is anxious to initiate the Foundation Fund effort right after the High Holy Days. We are happy in the knowledge that the Cleveland Jewish community took the initiative, under your aegis, to secure funds for the College. We regret, however, that any impression is prevalent that Cleveland is the only community, or that Cleveland was singled out to fulfill an obligation in which the rest of the Jewish community would not share responsibility with them.
