Dear Dr. Silver:

The Administrative Committee of the National Labor Committee for Palestine was very pleased to receive the report of Mr. Hamlin and Mr. Wertheim to the effect that you have agreed to address the opening session of our 21st Annual Convention, November 25th, at Carnegie Hall, New York.

Close to 3000 delegates are expected at the Convention, representing trade unions, landsmanshaften, Jewish National Workers' Alliance, branches of the Workmen's Circle and various Labor Zionist organizations. A capacity audience is expected at Carnegie Hall on Saturday evening. To the delegates and visitors, all of whom are devoted to the cause of Palestine, because of what it means to the Jewish people, the Carnegie Hall meeting will be a solemn demonstration of Jewish solidarity and for the Jewish Commonwealth. I need not assure you that they are looking forward to hearing your message and that you will have a most appreciative audience.

The National Labor Committee for Palestine has been carrying the \$\mathbb{R}\$ Histadrut banner in this country for the past 21 years. It began in an atmosphere of general and bitter antagonism, but it has succeeded in winning admiration and affection for the Histadrut in the widest Jewish ranks and enlisting the cooperation of the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations, and also in a wide circle of the Jewish labor movement.

On behalf of the Administrative Committee, I thank you for your cooperation.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

This is to supplement our telephone conversation. The League For Labor Palestine has recently undertaken to foster and support the Hehalutz movement in this country. The League has undertaken to stimulate public interest in the Hehalutz activities, and to supplement their budgetary needs.

As you know, during the past years prior to the war, quite a number of our young people have gone to Palestine to participate in the pioneering activities of Histadrut, and a few Kvutzot were built up by these Halutzim. Now that the war is over, the Hehalutz is resuming its activities on a much larger scale, and there are a number of young men and women who are ready to leave for Eretz. The League decided to give these Halutzim a public reception before they leave, in order to bring the work the Hehalutz is doing to the attention of American Jewry, and to stimulate greater interest in its work.

The plans for this event, as well as the success of the same, depend upon you. It is our wish and hope that you will accept to be guest speaker of the evening. and present to the American public the full meaning of Halutzism and the far reaching affects it is bound to have upon our youth, and the contribution it will make to fulfill our hopes in Erets. We have selected tentatively Wednesday, December 19th, for a dinner either at the Hotel Commodore, or at the Waldorf-Astoria. In case this date is not open on your calendar, you will please give us a date as close to December 19th as possible.

I am looking forward to your acceptance of our invitation, and to your giving us a suitable date, so that we may proceed with the preparations for this event.
