



Dear Rabbi Silver:

This letter is to supplement the telegram you recently received in connection with a Midwest Conference on international economic growth and foreign aid.

I am tremendously enthusiastic about the response to the idea of this conference and about the growing list of people who are planning to meet in Dayton on May 16th.

At this Dayton meeting a sizable group of national leaders, headed by Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge and Eric Johnston, will present the kind of information and background recommended by the National Conference in Washington last February.

There is no fee for conference members, but attendance will be by invitation only, and will be limited to representative and thoughtful citizens of Ohio, Michigan and Kentucky, in the main.

Because of your interest in this field and your wide acquaintanceship with community leaders, I would sincerely appreciate it if you would send me, by return mail, a list of 50 to 100 persons to whom we might issue invitations to participate.

We need this help from you to be certain that America's foreign aid program is thoroughly examined and completely understood by influential men and women representing a broad cross-section of our citizenry.

While I do not want you to finalize your invitation list until you have included all the persons you might recommend, I must emphasize the need to send me at least a partial list today. A glance at the calendar will show you how much we are working against time. We can use additional names as they occur to you, of course.




