A Message From David Ben-Gurion

1957 will be remembered in Israel for a number of significant events. Our security was strengthened as a result of the Sinai campaign. More than 80,000 immigrants arrived here from the East and from the



West. Elath became again a bustling port as in the days of King Solomon, and our commerce with East Africa and the Far East is assuming an ever-growing importance in the economic life of the country. A pipeline was laid from Elath to Beersheba and extended to the Mediterranean Sea. 30,000 homes were built for immigrants who reached our country. The final stage of the Huleh Lake drainage project was completed and added 15,000 acres of precious and fertile farm land to our settlers.

The construction of several important industries was undertaken. Israel's exports during 1957 will top the \$200,000,000 mark.

In all these achievements, Israel Bonds have played their considerable share, and I hope that each of you will come to Israel during our tenth-year celebration to see all that and more with your own eyes.

But there is still lots of wasteland to settle—more immigrants to absorb and integrate. There are more homes to build—more factories to erect—more roads to chart—more power stations to construct. To do all these things, more Bonds must be sold.

With the supply of arms to the Arabs by both the East and the West, our very existence as a democratic nation is assured by our strength on all fronts, and particularly by the vigor of our economy.

When I helped to launch the Bond drive more than six years ago, I believed then, as I do now, that its great strength would rest on the support of the large masses of American Jews.

I am confident of the response of our fellow Jews to the call for investment in Israel's future. Shalom.

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Chairman of the Board of Governors, is one of America's most prominent Jewish spokesmen, and is a foremost leader of the World Zionist movement.


As Chairman of the Zionist Emergency Council, he was in the forefront of the successful American Zionist effort in the United Nations in 1947 and 1948, to help bring about the establishment of the State of Israel.



Following his graduation from the University of Cincinnati in 1915 and his ordination as a Rabbi by the Hebrew Union College in the same year, Dr. Silver rendered special service during the first World War, for which he was decorated by the French Government. In 1917, he became spiritual leader of The Temple, in Cleveland, which under his leadership has become one of the foremost Jewish congregations in the country.


Dr. Silver has held numerous important posts, including: National Chairman, United Palestine Appeal; National Chairman, United Jewish Appeal; Dudleian Lecturer at Harvard University, 1939-40: member of the Near East Relief Committee, member of the Executive Board of the Larger Regional Government of Cleveland, and member of the Consumers League of Ohio.



Cantor Moshe Koussevitzky has before capacity audiences sung

throughout the United States and Canada, receiving the acclaim of music critics from coast to coast. Hundreds were turned away from Carnegie Hall at the time of his last recital there a year ago.

Moshe Koussevitzky was selected from a group of more than 200 contestants from all over the world to serve as Cantor of Warsaw in 1929. The first to be heard, and asked to sing again as the last, Cantor Koussevitzky was swiftly on his way to an international concert and operatic career.

In 1930, he made his recital debut at the Salle Gaveau in Paris, and during the same season was heard in Brussels and Antwerp. At the end of the war, Cantor Koussevitzky toured the British Isles, appearing in London, Glasgow, Manchester, Birmingham and other cities.

FIRST PLAY ABOUT ROOSEVELT OPENS AT COLONIAL THEATRE ON DEC. 30 "SUNRISE AT CAMPOBELLO" STARS RALPH BELLAMY

The first play written about Franklin Delano Roosevelt will light up the stage of the Colonial Theatre on Monday evening, December 30, where it remains for two weeks. Written by Mr. Schary, it is called "Sunrise at Campobello," and stars Ralph Bellamy as FDR. The Theatre Guild and Mr. Schary are co-producing the drama.

Playwright Schary, one of the bigwigs of the motion picture industry as both writer and producer, admits that he has been a long time admirer of the late President Roosevelt. "I never met him, though," he quickly adds.

"I didn't write the play because I admired him, however," he makes clear. "Tributes like that do not necessarily make good theatre. I wrote it because I think it is a tremendous story of a man's courageous fight against overwhelming odds. It deals primarily only with the years from 1921 to 1924 and tells the story of how Roosevelt overcame the crippling physical and mental effects of his polio attack. These years could have been the sunset of his career; instead it became the sunrise and restored him to political life."

Schary, who headed the powerful MGM studios for many years, is a showman of some thirty years standing. Such notable film hits as Academy Award-winning "Boy's Town," "Battleground," "Bad Day at Black Rock," "Blackboard Jungle" and "Designing Woman," attest to his craftsmanship. That is why, when he set out to write "Sunrise at Campobello," his first play, by the way, in 18 years, he thought in terms of effective drama and entertainment. He believes the episodes depicted in the play are warmly moving, poignant and make for striking and exciting theatre.

The play idea was born after he had left his MGM post about a year ago and the urge to write a play was upon him. In going through some books in his library he came upon material noting in detail Roosevelt's illness at the family's summer home at Campobello. Nova Scotia. Instantly the play began to take shape.

"I had the end before anything else. It was to be Roosevelt's triumphal return to public life in 1924 when he made the speech nominating Alfred E. Smith for President at the Democratic National Convention at Madison Square Garden. This, to me, is as dramatic a high point as any author could ever invent."

Naturally, Schary discussed the play with Eleanor Roosevelt, who endorsed the idea, and so he went ahead with an outline. Subsequently members of the family read the play and made suggestions which were incorporated into the script. "The Roosevelts are very happy with every phase of the play," reports Schary, "and they are still making suggestions, which pleases me considerably."

Casting "Sunrise at Campobello" was no easy matter. Vincent J. Donehue, who has directed the play, Lawrence Langner, who is co-administrator of the Theatre Guild, and Schary himself have veritably heard scores of actors every day for many months to get the right people for the more than twenty roles comprising the cast of characters. The Roosevelt children were particularly hard to get. Mary Fickett will essay Eleanor Roosevelt; Henry Jones plays Louis Howe; Anne Seymour will do Sara Delano Roosevelt and Alan Bunce will recreate Al Smith.

Ralph Bellamy, who will recreate Roosevelt, has been rehearsing privately for weeks

in the use of the crutches, canes and wheel chair.

"I think he's going to be just wonderful," says Schary. "He's about the same size as Roosevelt and when he puts on the pince-nez and sticks that long cigarette holder in his mouth the effect is startling."

"Sunrise at Campobello" will give Thursday and Saturday matinees at the Colonial. Following a fortnight's stand in Philadelphia, the drama opens at New York's Cort Theatre on January 30, Roosevelt's birthday.

HONORED GUEST

Miss Esther Herlitz has served as Consul of the State of Israel since December, 1954. She will shortly be leaving the United States to undertake a new assignment of great importance in the State of Israel.

One of Israel's highest-ranking women officials, Miss Herlitz has undertaken positions of unusual responsibility both as an Army officer and as a civilian in the diplomatic service.

On the international scene, Miss Herlitz represents emancipated womanhood. In 1949, as a member of, and adviser to the Israel Delegation to the United Nations, she was assigned to the powerful Political Committee, thus becoming the first woman to be appointed to this top-level group.

Born in Berlin, Miss Herlitz was only six when her father, George Herlitz, was appointed Director General of the World Zionist Archives in Jerusalem, a position he still occupies. Her life in the Holy City was that of student by day, and Haganah underground fighter by night.

After graduating Hebrew Teachers College in 1941, Miss Herlitz became a volunteer in the British Army, serving through 1946. She undertook her first diplomatic assignment as a Political Department aide for the Jewish Agency in 1947.

During the siege of Jerusalem during Israel's War of Independence, Miss Herlitz was second in command of the "Chen" (Women's Defense Army of Israel). Following the war she entered the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where she has rendered distinguished service for her country.



Silver Says West Holds Key to Peace

"The statesmen meeting in Paris today could bring a prompt solution to strife in the Middle East if they were to declare to the Arab nations that they must understand that Israel is here to stay." Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the board of governors of the Development Corporation for Israel, told 10,000 cheering spectators at the Fourth Annual Chanukah Festival for Israel at the Boston Garden Wednesday night.

Earlier, Lawrence G. Laskey, general chairman of the Greater Boston Israel Bond Committee, who presided at the Festival, told the audience, all of whom had participated in Action Day last Sunday by purchasing and selling bonds, that a total of \$1,706,800 in Israel Bonds had been sold in the community thus far this year, bringing the six-year total to \$11,108,600 in bond sales.

Dr. Silver referred to the historic parallels between the time of the Maccabees and the present, noting that: "Through the centuries, our people resisted all efforts to demolish and destroy them. It was no surprise that this Maccabean spirit which prevailed through the ages, enabled our brothers in Palestine, poorly equipped and sadly out-numbered, to prevail against the armed might of the six nations which invaded her. And in the end, there was a free independent State of Israel."

Referring to the meetings at the United Nations at which the question of establishing an independent Israel arose, Dr. Silver stated that "many friends of our people doubted the wisdom ten years ago of setting up an independent Israel, stating their profound misgivings over the ability of such a State to prosper against such odds. Today, Israel, on the brink of completing ten great years of freedom, has vindicated the honor of our people and emerged as a politically stable government and an outstanding model of democracy."

He urged continued purchase of Israel Bonds "for an indefinite period of years to come, to ensure that
