Dear Colleague:

Some fascinating developments have been occurring in our Reform Congregations during the past few months and we are eager to share them with you. First, we would thank those of you who by your efforts and interest are giving the Israel Bond program fresh impetus in your congregations. Second, we would report to you some of the highlights of recent weeks.

A number of our congregations that have never before attempted a Bond sale are doing so in 1963 for the first time. Congregations Adath Israel, Rabbi Herbert S. Waller, and B'rith Sholom, Rabbi Martin Perley, Louisville, Ky. - Oheb Shalom, Rabbi Abraham D. Shaw, Baltimore, Md. - Mt. Zion, Rabbi Bernard Martin, St. Paul, Minn. - United Hebrew, Rabbi Jerome W. Grollman, St. Louis, Mo. - Temple Emanuel, Rabbi Abraham Klausner, Yonkers, N. Y. - Beth El, Rabbi Henry M. Weiner, Glens Falls, N. Y. -Beth David, Rabbi Samuel H. Markowitz, Philadelphia, Pa. - are among these.

By far the most exciting function was recently conducted at The Temple in Cleveland. Under the spirited leadership of our esteemed Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Chairman of the Board of Governors of Israel Bonds, \$250,000 worth of Israel Bonds were sold at a Dinner on October 15th. A committee composed of his own congregational leadership, through a series of advance meetings and solicitations directed exclusively towards the congregational family, were able to bring about the success of this affair. We are confident that this will be "a first annual affair".

We deeply appreciate the support you are giving the Israel Bond program and hope that with your cooperation we will make this Redemption Year one in which we will even more widely broaden the base of our congregational participation.
