Message from Dr. Abba Hillel Silver

The creation of the State of Israel in our time is a fact that impinges on our daily lives, and on the relationships between the various Jewish communities of our hemisphere and of the world. Out of all the centuries of frustrated hopes, it has been given to our generation to witness the fulfillment of our ancient hope in the re-establishment of the State of Israel.

We are on the threshold of the tenth year of its establishment. We have reason to be proud of the achievements of these years, the manner in which the Israelis built and defended their state, and the manner in which the Jews of the world cooperated.

I cannot recall a single decade in Jewish history which was so replete in monumental achievements, so creative, so glorious in enterprise and valor as this last decade. It began, you will recall, in chaos, in the anarchic abandonment of Palestine by its Mandatory government, in attempts at armed invasions, in attacks all along its borders. The decade began in fear and insecurity and in the failure of the United Nations to come to the aid of the besieged state - the first of a series of such failures.

But this decade closes in an upsurge of strength, in an increased sense of security, thanks to a superb army which has been tested under fire, and in a remarkable tempo of growth and progress.

There has never been a time in Jewish history when our support and our help counted so heavily in the balance of the present and future destiny of Israel. Since I am unable to be with you, I would like to take this opportunity to extend my very best wishes for a most successful anniversary celebration.

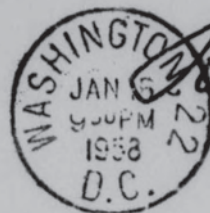




