> DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER, OUTSTANDING JEWISH LEADER, NAMED CHAIRMAN OF BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF ISRAEL BOND DRIVE

> > * * * * * * *

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, outstanding American Jewish leader in the movement for the upbuilding of Israel, was named yesterday to serve as Chairman of the Board of Governors of the State of Israel Bond campaign.

The designation of Dr. Silver to key national leadership of the Israel Bond drive was announced by Abraham Feinberg, President of the Israel Bond Organization.

Dr. Silver accepted the post of Chairman of the Board of Governors in response to an invitation from Levi Eshkol, Minister of Finance of Israel, who urged his participation in the top leadership of the Israel Bond campaign as a means of bringing about the fullest mobilization of all forces in American Jewish life for a united effort to strengthen the economic growth of the State of Israel at a time of serious crisis. The last occupant of this post was Henry Morgenthau, Jr., a former Secretary of the U. S. Treasury.

During the past five years the sale of Israel Bonds has raised more than \$200,000,000 for the industrial and agricultural development of the State of Israel.

In commenting on Dr. Silver's assumption of his new post, Moshe Sharett, Foreign Minister of the State of Israel, said:

"I was happy to hear that Dr. Abba Hillel Silver has been mamed Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Israel Bond Drive. His dynamism and drive played an outstanding part in the political struggle for the establishment of the State of Israel. They will stand Israel in good stead when harnessed to the task of mobilizing the resources so urgently required to accelerate Israel's progress, buttress her security and hasten the attainment of her economic independence." Spiritual leader of The Temple in Cleveland, Dr. Silver has been in the forefront of American Jewish leadership during the past twenty-five years. He is a former President of the Zionist Organization of America and a past Chairman of the American section of the Jewish Agency for Palestine. In the latter capacity he presented to the United Nations the case for the establishment of an independent Jewish State. He has also served as National Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal and the United Falestine Appeal.

In accepting his new post of leadership in the Israel Bond drive, Dr. Silver called attention to the key importance of Israel Bonds in building the State of Israel. The veteran Zionist leader said:

"I have accepted the Chairmanship of the Board of Governors of the Israel Bond Organization because I believe that economic upbuilding is the key to the future of the State of Israel.

"State of Israel Bonds are providing the investment capital which Israel needs for the achievement of economic independence in the shortest possible time. At a moment when Israel faces one of the gravest crises in its history, a continuing flow of Israel Bond dollars is of decisive importance to its survival and growth.

"Those of us who have been identified for many years with work for Jewish Statehood find in Israel Bonds an expression of the highest aspects of the ideal which has animated our efforts. Israel Bonds are a symbol of Israel's coming of age. The economic partnership between us and Israel that has been created and fostered by the Israel Bond campaign has given great impetus to the industrial and agricultural development of the country. It has also given new and vigorous meaning to the long-standing friendship between the people of the United States and the people of Israel.

"The Israel Bond campaign will seek to encourage American investment in Israel's economic future because it represents one of the most powerful influences for the preservation and strengthening of the spirit of democracy in the Middle East."

DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Israel Bond Organization, and outstanding American Jewish leader, will appear at on in behalf of the State of Israel Development Bond Issue.

As Chairman of the Board of Governors, Dr. Silver heads the planning body for the State of Israel Bond drive in communities throughout the United States, Canada, Latin America and Western European countries.

One of the foremost leaders of the American 7ionist movement, Dr. Silver is Past President of the Zionist Organization of America and former Chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency for Palestine. As Chairman of the 7ionist Emergency Council, he was in the forefront of the American Zionist effort in the United Nations which played such a vital part in the establishment of the State of Israel.

In addition to his prominent role in the establishment and upbuilding of Israel, Dr. Silver has a distinguished reputation as a scholar and spiritual leader.

Following his graduation from the University of Cincinnati in 1915 and his ordination as a Rabbi by the Hebrew Union College in the same year, Dr. Silver rendered special war service, for which he was decorated by the French Government. In 1917, he became spiritual leader of The Temple, in Cleveland, which, under his leadership, has become one of the foremost Jewish congregations in the country.

Dr. Silver has held numerous important posts, including National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal; National Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal; Dudleian lecturer at Harvard University 1939-40; member of the Near East Relief Committee; member of the Executive Board of the Larger Regional Government of Cleveland, and member of the Consumers League of Ohio.

President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis from 1945 to 1947, Dr. Silver holds honorary degrees from Western Reserve University and the Hebrew Union College. He is the author of "Messianic Speculations in Israel", "World Crisis and Jewish Survival", and numerous pamphlets and monographs.

The State of Israel Bond Issue provides the investment capital for Israel's historic program of economic development. Funds derived through the sale of Israel Bonds are making possible the growth of industry and agriculture, the expansion of irrigation, the construction of roads, harbors and railways, the increase of electric power, and the exploitation of natural resources.

An Answer Unflagging Persistence – Now as Then

by Dr. Abba Hille Silver

I have read with great interest ex-President Truman's Memoirs, especially those parts which relate to the events which led up to the proclamation of the State of Israel.

The Israeli and the Jewish people throughout the world will forever be grateful to Mr. Truman for the tremendous help which he gave to their cause in the decisive hour and for having been a consistent friend of the State of Israel ever since.

Mr. Truman refers in his Memoirs, deprecatorily, to the "extreme" Zionists. I do not know what he means by "extreme Zionists. Presumably the reference is to those Zionists who worked for the establishment of an independent Jewish State, who urged our Government to assist in this work, and to grant recognition to Israel once it was established. The State of Israel was established and our Government did recognize it. In fact, it was Mr. Truman himself who, as President of the United States, gave the first recognition to the new State. In so doing he clearly endorsed the position taken by those whom he now calls "extreme" Zionists.

What was extreme about these Zionas was their unrelenting persistence and unflagging efforts without which their cause might never have succeeded. Mr. Truman himself calls attention to the fact that the specialists on the Near East in our State Department "were almost without exception unfriendly to the idea of a Jewish State." He is sorry to report "that there were some among them who were also inclined to be anti-Semitic" and that they almost succeeded in putting it over on him.

The responsible Zionist leaders suspected this all along. They knew the powerful forces which were lined up against them and the extent to which they would go to defeat the great moral cause which had received the endorsement of both political parties in our country and the American people.

When, under pressure from those same forces, our Government reversed itself in March of 1948, and requested a special session of the Assembly of the United Nations in order to re-impose a "temporary" trusteeship on Palestine, it was these same "extreme" Zionists who, by their redoubled efforts and powerful appeal to the citizens of our country, averted what would have been a political disaster and brought the policy of the Truman administration back to its sound and just course.

Needless to say that our State Department at the present time still harbors these same "specialists" on the Near East and that they are still, almost without exception, unfriendly to the idea of a Jewish State. They are still trying to "put it over" on the President and our Secretary of State.

The State of Israel was established in spite of the unfriendly attitude of these people, in spite -f the violent opposition and sabotage of Great Britain and the armed attacks of Arab Governments. I am strongly of the belief that the State of Israel, which is soon to celebrate its eighth anniversary, will, in spite of all these continuing oppositions and conspiracies, continue to grow and prosper. Its people are firm in their moral integrity and in their resolve to defend themselves and their country at all costs. They are steadily building for strength and security, while at all times seeking the ways of peace. They are learning that which is very difficult for a young state to learn-how to exercise restraint in the face of constant provocation, and how to keep on building under severe threat and danger.

We are reminded of the words of the Psalmist:

"Much have they afflicted me from

my youth, says Israel, but they will not prevail against me."

In the last analysis it is the economic strength of the State of Israel which will determine its capacity to defend itself against aggression and consequently also its ability to survive. A sound economy towards which the Government of Israel has been steadily moving is the surest guarantee for the ultimate solution of its political problem. That, and the stout hearts and firm resolutions of the Israelis themselves, who have built their country with such zeal and vision and who can be relied upon to defend it with their very lives.

Whatever support is given to the State of Israel through the purchase of Israel Bonds helps to undergird its economy and to strengthen the hands of its defenders.

The enemies of Israel have been waiting for its collapse and they have sought to hasten it by means of boycotts and blockades. Because they believed that such a collapse was imminent they have resisted every attempt made by Israel in the last seven years to conclude an honorable peace.

Having failed to strangle Israel economically and to check its development through an incessant harassment of the Israeli borders, they are now hoping to crush it in another war and to that end they are building up a massive reservoir of armament. In this objective Russia and Great Britain have been cooperating by sending to Egypt, which is the key figure in this conspiracy, shiploads of tanks, jet planes, and heavy armament-Russia as part of its long range policy to penetrate the Near East and expand communist influence; and Great Britain as part of its long record of blundering retreat and defeat in that part of the world. Our own country is now in danger of being led into similar costly blunders in the Near East by a blind guide whose" actions and motives clearly disqualify it from playing the role of mediator and honest broker.

The hour is grave for Israel because the Western powers and the Soviet Union are now trying to out-bid one another in their avowed devotion and support of the Arab states who are committed to the destruction of Israel. The notorious action of Egypt in opening the doors of the Middle East to Soviet penetration, which was Egypt's response to Secretary of State Dulles' appeal of last November for an Arab-Israel peace, has evoked no retaliatory action. On the contrary, Nasser is being rewarded for his act of betrayal by the offer of hundreds of millions of dollars to build the Aswam Dam. The little State of Israel, loyal to the democratic world, and gravely en dangered by this military coup of Egypt, has been given no "upport of compensatory arms, nor any assurance of security. The statesmen of the West have availed themselves of the opportunity in the Security Council to censure Israel for having replied to the provocations of the Government of Syria. We are persuaded that the great powers are pursuing r policy in the Middle East which, if not quickly revised, will bring disaster to that part of the world and which may involve them too in a way in which they do not wish to be involved. But until sanity returns and better counsel prevails, it is the primary responsibility of all those who love justice and freedom and who believe that the establishment of the State of Israel was one of the most significant and heartening moral achievements of this century, to rally to its support and provide it with the wherewithal to carry on its industrial, agricultural and social progress and to enable it to strengthen its defenses.

This ought to be a dogma, an axiom of all of our work: that Israel, to be strong and secure, must be economically strong. That requires no great elaboration. Yet it is the one thing that we have to drive home time and time again. I would like to see a million Jews in the United States owning Israel Bonds; for with these Bonds we build. Every completed irrigation project, every new settlement and settler, every new road built or harbor improved or railway expanded, every new ship or sailor, every new industry or manufacturing plant, every new mine or oil well, is so much red blood poured into the arteries of the State of Israel, making it strong and capable of defense, of growth and progress.

And Israel Bonds do all these things and many more. There are equal but different qualities of dedication required in great human enterprises. To create a state, to bring it into existence, requires vision and daring and idealism. Fortunately we had such people and they created the state. To maintain the state and to defend it, you need administrative skill, you need statesmanship of a high order, and above all you need patience and perseverance, not to be deterred by threats or dangers or setbacks.

Israel was not founded by faint-hearted men. In the War of Liberation, Israel was not defended by faint-hearted men, and Israel will be made strong and secure only by stout-hearted men whose courage will surmount their timidity, and whose faith will be stronger than their doubts.

BIG News

This is an hour of covenant affirmation on the part of our people. Our people made a covenant with the land of Israel. Three times in our history we were exiled from it, and three times we returned to it. Three times in our long history we returned to our ancient homeland, because we felt that there was a bond—a historic, unbreakable, sacred bond—between the land and the people. The land needed the people, the people needed the land.

This is the hour, when the Land of Israel is imperiled, that we ought to reaffirm our covenant. I believe that our people will do it because I know our people. I know what they are capable of. I know the strength of soul that is theirs. I know the wisdom that is theirs. They will not permit themselves to become undermined by shifting political winds. They will look to the things which are eternal and endure in Jewish life, and this is one of them—the Jewish people in the Land of Israel.

Listen to the voices of our fellow Jews in Israel. They need the wherewithal. Let's give it to them.





Rabbi Halpern's Column

DR. ALBERT SCHWEITZER AND PRAYER

IN OUR WORLD of confusion we are admonished by all educators, psychologists, child welfare workers and columnists not to neglect the religious education of our children.

For us it is not new. We have been stressing this from time immemorial. Every time we say the "Shema" we are told "Thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children." We were to lose no occasion to inspire our children with the desire for learning and with the urge to turn to God in prayer.

Dr. Albert Schweitzer—great humanitarian, shares all this with us. He recognizes the importance of our children sitting with us at services. We can well afford to accept his direction in addition to the direction of our teachers of all times when he says: "From the services in which I joined as a child, I have taken with me into life a feeling for what is solemn, and a need for quiet self-recollection, without which I cannot realize the meaning of my life.

I cannot, therefore, support the opinion of those who would not let children take part in grown-up people's services till they to some extent understand them.

The important thing is not that children shall understand but that they shall feel something of what is serious and solemn.

The fact that a child sees his elders full of devotion, and has to feel something himself, that is what gives the service its meaning for him."

In an article "Are Churches Failing Our Youth?" a subtitle said "Churches condescend to youngsters and segregate them and teen-agers resent it" and added:—

"The mark of the "enlightened" church, critics say, is the "youth worship service." Adult logic reasons that beaming worship to teenagers will make them feel they "belong." Young people in contrast, feel that it emphasizes their difference. Even worse, they believe adults regard youth worship as "cute."

"Young people want to be accepted as adults," a critic has said. "Anything that seems to be 'kid stuff' keeps them away in droves."







Dr. Abba Hillel Silver's passing is being mourned by the membership of the Zionist Organization of America as its supreme leader, as the Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Israel Bond Organization, and above all as a great and encompassing human being. Dr. Silver was a tower of strength and leadership to this organization, to the Israel Bond effort, and indeed, to Israel itself. We can all but revere his memory by keeping him before us at all times as the great example of complete devotion to Israel, in dedication and in deed, and continue the work to which he has offered his life.

In a statement issued at the time of Dr. Silver's death by Abraham Feinberg, President of the Israel Bond Organization, Samuel Rothberg, National Campaign Chairman, and Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz, Vice President, they said: "In the pulpit, in the community, in the nation, in Israel and in the world, his vision, his scholarship, his uncompromising perseverence, his incomparable oratorical powers, his love of Zion which was the very core of his life-these were the ingredients of great and statesmanlike leadership which won for him a special place in the hearts of American Jewry. We and Jews everywhere have sustained a profoundly grievous and irreparable loss."

The spirit of dedication to Israel personified in Dr. Silver finds its echoes throughout the American Jewish community. It is evident in the increasing response to the Israel Bond drive, to which he rendered such yeoman service.



ISADORE S. TUROVER, NATIONAL CHAIRMAN, ISRAEL BONDS FOR ZOA

Mr. I. S. Turover has accepted the designation by ZOA President Max Nussbaum as National Israel Bond Chairman, succeeding Rabbi I. Usher Kirshbum who held this post for the past three years.

Mr. Turover, a National Vice President of ZOA, has served as member of the Board of Governors of the Bond Organization. He was chairman of the ZOA Economic Mission to Israel, and is a former President of the Washington, D.C. District and Region. He is a member of the Executive of the United Israel Appeal. He was also general chairman and President of U.J.A. in Washington, D.C. Mr. Turover is immensely interested in the economic development of Israel, and is well equipped for his task. As a veteran leader of the ZOA, he is warmly welcomed to his new office.
