

The League for Women's Rights in Israel is an independent, non-governmental and non-political organization whose activities are: The struggle for and defense of the rights of women in our country, without any distinction of race, religion or creed, class or idealogy. Our League includes members from all classes (Jewish and Arab women) that in spite of their varying political, religious or economical opinions and conditions, cooperate in friendship and understanding for the mutual cause.

The League for Women's Rights in Israel was founded at the time of the establishment of the State of Israel in 1949.

Active women leaders were convinced that if Israel were to be founded on truly democratic principles, it would be necessary to secure full equal rights for women not only in theory, but also in practice, in every aspect of life--civic, legal, economic, social, domestic, etc. It was also deemed important to stimulate women to greater activity in the civic affairs of the State, which Jewish women had helped to build, defend and create, side by side with Jewish men.

The aims and objectives of the League are:

- 1) The achievement of full equal rights for women in civil and religious law.
- 2) The fuller participation of women in all affairs of the State, as citizens with equal rights in theory and in practice.
- 3) The enlightenment and education of women for the continuing struggle for women's equal rights, and for the defense and preservation of those rights and values that women have already won.
- 4) To raise the moral standard by fighting women's delinquency and prostitution and by rehabilitation of women prisoners.
- 5) To establish appropriate various facilities for women such as clubs, hostels and homes, cultural centers, etc.

Accordingly, the League adopted the following plan of action to carry out its objectives:

A. Newspaper

One of the first activities was the publication of a newspaper which had to serve as an organ expressing the objectives of the League and as a clarion to call the attention of the public at large to women's demands with respect to various laws and reforms. The periodical would also educate the woman to better citizenship by means of appropriate information which would help her understand better her own problems and those of the community and the State.

The periodical, "The Woman in the State" ("Haisha Bamedina"), was established at the same time the League was formed. It maintains high public and cultural standards which have contributed significantly to the status of women in Israel.

B. Memoranda

An important activity is the dispatching of memoranda to the higher Governmental and legal agencies and institutions of the State of Israel

- 1) on the need of new various laws, as well as for amendments to existing laws, on behalf of women;
- 2) on the need to guarantee women's rights by special legislation;
- 3) on participation of women in positions of responsibility in the agencies and administration directing the work of the State and of the Government;
- 4) on cases of discrimination against women and of infringement of women's rights in government agencies.

Two hundred such memoranda have been sent over the twelve years of the League's existence to date. Memoranda have gone to the Knesset (Parliament) and its members, Government, various Government Institutions, which deal with all aspects of life concerning women and their problems. It should be noted that several of these memoranda produced very favorable results including the appointment of a woman as a Member of the Cabinet, the appointment of women to the Diplomatic Corps, the appointment of women to the Judiciary—as judges and state—attorneys, the appointment of women to higher posts in the Governmental administration, a progressive citizenship law which grants equal rights to men and women of the State of Israel, without any discrimination in regard to sex; the Women's Equal Rights Law-1951, etc.

C. Petitions in the matter of Marriage and Divorce Law

Another effective activity was to stimulate the public to more energetic action against the enacting of the Marriage and Divorce Law-1953. This Law, enacted for political reasons only, transferred the jurisdiction over marriage and divorce of all Jews in Israel to the Rabbinical (Religious) Courts exclusively. These Courts are not subject to Government control but function solely in accordance with Jewish Rabbinic Law, with all its glaring discriminations against women.

The struggle against this Law and the circulation, later, of petitions to repeal the Law, or to change it, constitute one of the outstanding, most glorious chapters in the history of the League. About 50,000 pamphlets in many languages were distributed, hundreds of speeches and lectures were delivered, thousands of signatures were collected to support the petitions, and thousands of letters were sent to members of the Knesset and to various leaders in town and country. This campaign impoverished the League. The anticipated results, however, were not achieved because of the opposition of the ruling political parties which, together with the religious parties, belonged to the Government Coalition that actually initiated the Law. Even those members of the coalition parties who opposed the law were forbidden to vote against its passage and later to support our petition for its repeal.

D. Guidance of Women in Political, Public and Civic Affairs.

Important in educating women for good citizenship is the development of their awareness of their own legal and personal status in society and in the State. Women can attain such awareness by information directed to them through the press, bulletins and leaflets, and lectures.

Our periodical, Haisha Bamedinah (The Woman in the State), serves this purpose to a certain degree. Moreover, the League has, in addition, sponsored hundreds of lectures during the twelve years of its existence. These lectures dealt with various topics concerning women in Israel and abroad, as well as in international areas. The lecturers were women, expert in many fields, who spoke in different languages, addressed also many new immigrants. Hebrew, Yiddish, German, English, Polish, French, Spanish and Arabic, were all necessary to reach all our women.

In addition to lectures the League had arranged discussion-meetings and even seminars on very urgent questions and on the status of women, to encourage wider participation and to develop leadership among the members.

The Information Service of the League sends out press releases on the various activities of the League, provides many articles to the press on the different problems of women in national and international areas. It also keeps the press informed on women's endeavors and organizations in countries the world over. This news is gathered from the periodicals and printed matter received by us from women's groups from all over the world.

E. Legal Bureau

Legal aid is extended to women who have suffered discrimination as women. For this purpose, the League maintains a Legal Bureau. Here women receive free legal advice (from expert legal counselors) in all matters, but particularly in domestic affairs and disputes. In certain cases the actual legal services are offered gratis; in others legal services are rendered by experts at nominal fees. Our legal counselors appear before civil courts, and, in particular, in the Rabbinical Courts, defending the women's cause. A representative of the League for Women's Rights has also appeared in a Moslem Religious Court, in defense of an Arab woman in a case dealing with a domestic dispute.

Our Legal Bureau services at least ten clients a week; we have already handled about 5,000 women who turned to us, including about 300 domestic claims, and about 70 trials.

A number of the law suits handled by the Bureau established special precedents which have subsequently evolved into laws and practices in Israel, such as the recognition of the principle of the support of children born before the marriage by the prospective father and the case establishing the obligation of children to support their parents.

The Legal Bureau also conducts research in problems of women which involve Rabbinic Law. Solutions are sought which will comply with modern, everyday life.

The Legal Bureau maintains constant contact with Jewish organizations and institutions in countries throughout the world on legal matters concerning Jewish women in such cases as Agunah (deserted wife), Halitza (legal release of a childless widow), and religious divorces which must be solved only by Rabbinical Courts. In all such cases, the Bureau gives guidance and counsel.

F. Committee for Moral Standards

According to its objectives the League established:

- 1) A Committee for Women prisoners, to learn the problems of their delinquency, to assist them, if necessary, with legal aid and to care for their rehabilitation.
- 2) A Subcommittee to assist in rehabilitation of delinquent young women.

G. International Relations

The League for Women's Reights in Israel is affiliated with the International Alliance of Women. This Alliance consists of 54 national organizations of the countries of Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia and South America. in the Western sphere. Its head-quarters are now in Colombo, Ceylon. The aim of the Alliance is also for equal rights for women in every area of life, as well as the establishment of international bonds of friendship and the creation of good will and a climate for peace among women the world over. The Chairman of the League, Mrs. Tehilla Matmon, is also a Board member of the Alliance.

Thanks to these contacts, the League has won many friends for Israel.

THE MOST IMPORTANT TASKS FACING THE LEAGUE IN THE NEAR FUTURE

Changes in the personal status of the Jewish woman:

The State of Israel is indeed a democratic country, and under its laws, women enjoy the same civic and political rights as men. As citizens with equal rights, women have also equal obligations to the State.

However, as regards their personal status in domestic matters, which is based on the Religious-Rabbinical law, women are often the victims of discrimination; and regarded as lower-class individuals. In Israel, the laws of the Torah (the Bible), fixed many centuries ago, are still in effect. These laws were based on customs and concepts of ancient times. With due respect to our Bible, enlightened as it was at its inception, we cannot accept as suitable to our needs in the twentieth century, the very same laws that were promulgated in the tenth century B.C.--regardless of how fine they were considered in ancient times.

The existence of these laws in full force in Israel has been the source of suffering, injustice and misfortune not only for many thousands of women in Israel, but also for thousands of women in the Diaspora. Jewish women who still adhere to religious tradition, and who wish to continue their religious observance, must bow to ancient laws, based on a now obsolete polygamous society. The following are some of these laws:

- 1) According to Biblical law, only the husband is permitted to divorce his wife, but the wife may not divorce her husband.
- 2) A Jewish man may marry a second wife without having divorced the first, if it may be proved that his first wife is insane. A Jewish woman, on the other hand, is not permitted to divorce her husband, if he is found to be insane, and she is doomed to remain an Agunah (deserted wife), for the rest of her life.
- 3) A Jewish widower who is childless is permitted to remarry and start a family, but a childless widow may not remarry and must remain an Agunah and childless until she has been given Halitzah (release from her late husband's brother) even if his whereabouts are unknown.
- 4) A Jewish woman who has been awarded a civil divorce is not considered divorced in the eyes of Jewish Rabbinic Law, and will be unable to remarry until she has received a religious divorce from her husband. A Jewish man, on the other hand, who has received a civil divorce, is permitted to send his wife a religious divorce (even against her will) and then obtain permission to remarry.

It is obvious that these laws, applying as they do to Jewry the world over, affect Jewish women wherever they may live.

The League will continue to fight to free Jewish women from their hardships. It will, however, require the support of enlightened Jewry, women and men alike, in other countries, in its efforts.


PROJECTOR OPERATES ON 50 CYCLES:





Amplifier—Pedestal Case
