MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE AMERICAN PALESTINE CAMPAIGN HELD TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27th, 4 P.M. AT 111 FIFTH AVE.

PRESENT: Louis Lipsky (in the chair), Harry L. Glucksman, Joseph C. Hyman, Abram Liebovitz (by proxy), Isidore D. Morrison, Morris Rothenberg.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT OF CAMPAIGN

The Chairman presented to the Board a financial statement of the income and disbursements of the American Palestine Campaign for the period from January 18th to September 25th, 1932, together with comparative statistics for the campaign of 1931. A copy of the financial statement is attached herewith.

It was the general sentiment of the members of the Board that the receipts of the campaign are fairly satisfactory, considering the economic situation that obtains in this country.

Mr. Glucksman pointed out that the results obtained by the American Palestine Campaign compare favorably with the experience of other institutions, nationally and locally, in their fund-raising activities. Other members of the Board echoed Mr. Glucksman's view and expressed appreciation for the effort put into the campaign by its leaders.

#### RABBI SILVER'S RESIGNATION

The Chairman read a letter from Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland who submitted his resignation as one of the National Chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, in view of the fact that he is about to leave for a Sabbatical year and will not return to the United States until September, 1933.

It was the decision of the Board that Rabbi Silver's resignation should not be accepted in view of the brief time that remains until the national conference of the campaign is held in January. At that time, the national conference will have an opportunity to act upon Rabbi Silver's resignation.

The Board went on record as expressing its appreciation of the services rendered to the campaign by Rabbi Silver and wishing him a fruitful Sabbatical year.

#### CAMPAIGN PROSPECTS:

The Chairman reported as follows in regard to the campaigns that are now in progress or that are about to be launched:

Pacific Coast: George Greenspun, field director, has gone to Los Angeles to organize and conduct campaign there. He will stay on Pacific Coast several months and will visit all larger communities in California and Washington. On his way back he will conduct the campaign in Denver.
