Dear Mr.Berman.

Rabbi H. Englander of the U.S.A. has been speaking to me about his efforts to find an opportunity for service here in Israel. He tells me that he sent his application to you some time ago. He has been here a year and has thus far not succeeded in securing a position. He is a young man and seems to have qualifications for useful work.

I an writing you this note because it brings up a general problem which has been occupying my thoughts of late since I have met quite a few Zionists from America who have come here in the hope of finding an opportunity for service and who are still "displaced" American Zionists. They are not incompetents. They are young and able and eager. They have left the U.S.A. not because they were unalle to find jobs there but because they wanted to work and serve here in Israel.

American Zionist leaders have been urged to cell American Jewish youth to Israel. We have been chided for the small numbers of American youth who have come here: and yet, when I come upon situations such as the one referred to in this letter, I find it difficult to reconcile the call with the opportunity.

Perhaps I am inadequately informed about the real situation. Perhaps those whom I have met and from whom I have heard complaints are the exceptions. Nevertheless, I feel it my duty to express my at least tentative reaction to this situation.

With reference to the specific instance referred to in this letter, I would appreciate it if you would bt me know what has happened with Rabbi Englander's application.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I am pleased to give you the following information that you requested:

The gentleman in question is J. Raymond Nunan who was appointed Commissioner of Internal Revenue by F.D.R. and has been an active member of, and contributor to, the Democratic National Committee.

He was Chief Advisor to Donald Nelson in the War Production Board and subsequently, a leading figure in the War Assets Administration.

He is a boyhood chum of Governor Dewey. During the past Republican Convention, a man of excellent reputation who was at Mr. Nunan's home at the time, informed me that Mr. Nunan received a call from Governor Dewey. In response to a request he informed the Governor that he would mail him a check for \$25,000 made out to the Republican National Committee. From what I understand, it is not unlikely that Mr. Nunan may get a high appointment in the Dewey administration if the Governor is elected.

Mr. Numan told me that he was the chief lobbyist for both the Argentine Government and the Dominican Republic in their successful negotiations for loans from the United States.

I have knowledge of a personal and successful appeal made by Mr. Nunan to the White House for the clearing of an "impossible" passport for us after it had been turned down by the State Department and the Appeal Board of the State Department. Forty-eight hours after the appeal was made - it was undoubtedly accompanied by a contribution to the Democratic National Committee - this "impossible" passport was granted over the signature of Secretary of State Marshall.

In my brief relationship with the gentleman in question, I have gotten the impression that there are very few men in Washington who have so many important contacts in high places. It is quite obvious that he has rendered services to many important individuals in Washington who are undoubtedly, indebted to him in large measure.

When I suggested to you the other day that it might be advantageous for you to meet him and discuss any and all problems that you might deem advisable, I not only had the present situation in mind but also the future especially, since it is very likely that he will play an important role and continue to be a man of great influence in the Dewey administration.

I regret that this letter has been so lengthy but I did want to give you a few of the salient points so that you might know who the man is. I have omitted a number of details which I shall be very happy to give you privately but in the main, I believe I have given you an accurate picture of J. Raymond Nunan.

In closing, I should like to add what I am sure is known to you - namely, that whereas he is extremely sympathetic to our cause, he expects to be paid well for services rendered.

Dear Sir:

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I represent His Grace, Vitaly, the Ruling Archbishop of the American and Canadian Diocese of the Russian Orthodox Greek-Catholic Church, whose headquarters are located in the City of New York. He is the senior ecclesiastical authority in North America of the Synod of Bishops of the Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia.

It has come to the attention of His Grace that "The New York Times" of September 13, 1948, has reported, in a dispatch from Jerusalem, which has been filed by Mr. Julian Louis Meltzer, one of their most competent and experienced foreign correspondents, that the Soviet Union has sent to Jerusalem two members of the staff of the Seviet diplomatic mission at Tel Aviv for the announced purpose of establishing in Jerusalem a limison office, which has as its ultimate objective the assumption by the Soviet Union of complete control of the properties of the Russian Orthodox Church in Jerusalem. These properties are valued at several million dollars and comprise some important commercial properties in the center of Jerusalem, as well as various churches, monasteries and convents, which are located not only in the City of Jerusalem, but in Bethlehem, Magareth and Ein Karim.

Nonks have heretofore been administering the properties, pursuant to authorigation granted to them by an order of His Excellency, the High Commissioner, dated April 28, 1948, which was made by him in the exercise of powers vested in him by Article 3 of the Palestine Order in Council, 1948.

Mr. Neltzer's dispatch further indicates that he has received information in Jerusalem to the effect that continuous maintenance of the properties will be undertaken by the Soviet Union through its mission in Jerusalem.

On behalf of the authorized representatives of the Russian Orthodox Church, I wish to register with you a most emphatic protest against any interference by the Soviet Union with the properties of the Russian Orthodox Church, identified above, and in the interest of orderly government and the protection of established rights, such as are recognized by all governments everywhere. I wish to bespeak the cooperation of the Government of Israel in preventing the consummation of any such plan as that which the Soviet Union has announced. The properties are valuable from a purely monetary, or financial, point of view, but the intrinsic value of the properties is not the most important consideration. The most important consideration is the spiritual value of these properties in the Holy Land, where the Christian faith had its origins.

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The Soviet Union has frequently indicated its opposition to Christianity and even to theism, and there can be no reasonable doubt in the minds of those who understand the activities of the Soviet Union, particularly with reference to the Russian Orthodox Church, as practised over a period of time beginning with 1919, that the purpose of the Soviet mission is the destruction of the properties identified above or their diversion to unauthorized uses and the confiscation of any income which might be derived therefrom.

Regardless of what the intent of the Soviet mission may be, however, and regardless of what statement they may make as to their purposes, the fact is that they have no right whatsoever in or to the properties, or any of them, and that only the Synod of Bishops of the Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia, to which body my client, Archbishop Vitaly, gives ecclesiastical allegiance, has any authority, temporal or spiritual, in the properties in question, and we look to you for the protection of these rights in Jerusalem.

I would appreciate it if you would be kind enough to give this matter your very prompt attention and advise me as to what steps will be taken by your Government with reference to this matter.

I would also be glad to have you report to me as to what the officers of your Government in Jerusalem may report to you as the facts with reference to the matter, which is the subject of Mr. Meltzer's dispatch, above referred to.

WE UNDERSTAND THAT QUESTION OF REINSTATEMENT FIVE EXECUTIVE STAFE MEMBERS UPA WILL BE DISCUSSED TOMORROWS MEETING AMERICAN SECTION JEWISH AGENCY. WE REEL YOU SHOULD KNOW THE FACTS RELATED TO THIS MATTER. ON SUNDAY DECEMBER FIFTH COMMITTEE OF CONTRIBUTORS TOLD MR. EDWIN ROSENBERG THAT PREREQUISITE CONDITION FOR THEIR ACCEPTANCE OVERALL AGREEMENT IS IMMEDIATE REINSTATEMENT OF THESE MEN AND ASKED FOR ASSURANCE THAT THIS SAME DAY MR. ROSENBERG INFORMED REPRESENTATIVES OF OUR CONDITION WILL BE MET BY UPA. CONDITTEE THAT HE HAD REACHED AGRETMENT WITH MR. WEISMAN TO THE EFFECT THAT THE FIVE MEN CAN RETURN TO THEIR POSTS IF THEY SO DESIRED ON CONDITIONS MADE BY MR. ROSENBERG. AND THAT MR. ROSENBERG HAS FULL AND SOLE AUTHORITY TO MAKE SUCH CONDITIONS AND DETERMINE PROCEDURE OF THEIR RETURN TO WORK. IN A WIRE TE SENT YESTERDAY TO MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF UPA WE SAID QUOTE IT WAS CLEARLY UNDERSTOOD BY MR. ROSENBERG AND THE CONCILIATION COMMITTEE OF THE COUNCIL OF JEWISH FEDERATIONS AND WELFARE FUNDS THAT THE REFURN OF THE FIVE MEN UNDER THE CONDITIONS TO BE MADE BY MR. ROSENBERG WAS PART OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN UPA AND COMMITTEE OF CONTRIBUTORS. MR. ROSENBERG AFTER HAVING REACHED HIS DECISION ADVISED THE MEN ON THURSDAY DECEMBER SIXTEENTH TO RETURN TO THEIR POSTS ON MONDAY MORNING DECEMBER TWENTIETH AND SO ADVISED THE UPA. THE MEN FOLLOWED MR. ROSENBERGS ADVICE AND RETURNED YES TERDAY BUT THEY WERE TOLD BY MR. SHAPIRO THAT MR. WEIS MAN DENIES EVER HAVING GRANTED MR. ROSENBERG SUCH AUTHORITY. THERE IS NO XXXXXX DOUBT THAT ANY ATTEMPT TO CIRCUMVENT MR. ROSENBERGS DECISION BY ADDING CONDITIONS TO THE RETURN OF THE FIVE MEN IN OUR OPINION WOULD CONSTITUTE A CLEAR BREACH OF FAITH IN THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN UPA AND THE COMMITTEE OF CONTRIBUTORS. WE ARE QUITE SURE THAT YOU AS WELL AS WE ANXIOUS TO PRESERVE THE GOOD MANE AND REPUTATION OF UPA AND CONCERNED

WITH SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN IN 1949 WOULD NOT WISH TO BE A PARTY TO ANY BREACH OF FAITH AND WILL DO EVERYTHING IN YOUR POWER TO PREVENT IT UNQUOTE WE WANT TO IMPRESS UPON YOU THAT THE INMEDIATE READRN OF THESE EXECUTIVES TO THEIR POSTS WOULD HAVE SERVED TO THE ENTIRE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY AS SYMBOL OF REESTARLISHED UNITY. IT IS THE FIRST EMEREN CONCERTE TEST OF THE SINCERITY AND THE GOOD FAITH OF UPA IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE AGREEMENT. IF THE AGREEMENT FOR THE REINSTATIMENT OF THE FIVE ELECUTIVES IS TO BE DISHONORED OUR COMMITTEE WOULD HAVE REASON TO FEEL THAT THE OTHER PEASES OF THE AGREEMENT MAY BE SIMILARLY IGNORED. WE THEREFORE INSIST THAT THE MEN BE ADVISED TO RETURN TO THEIR DESKS BY DECIMBER TWENTY SEVENTH AND TO BE CONSIDERED REINSTATED AS OF THE DATE DECIDED UPON BY MR ROSENBERG, ANY FURTHER DELAY IN COMPLYING WITH MR ROSENBERGS DIRECTIVE MEANS BREAKDOWN OF AN AGREEMENT THAT WAS ENDORSED BY JEWISH AGENCY EXECUTIVE. COMMITTEE OF CONTRIBUTORS NOULD HAVE NO CHOICE BUT TO INFORM COUNTRY AGEO NDINGLY AND TO REASSEMBLE FOR THE FURPOSE OF DISCUSSING JUTURE ACTION. WE URGE TOU TO LET US HAVE YOUR REPLY BY FRIDAY MORNING CARE MY OFFICE ROOM 4401 TAPIRE STATE BUILDING. A COPY OF THIS TELEGRAM IS BEING SENT TO THE COUNCIL OF JEWISH FEDERATIONS AND WELFARE FUNDS.

In the light of the actual developments that have taken place and without prejudice to the basic agreement that was arrived at during the A.C. Meeting with respect to the status and scope of the Economic Department of the American Section of the Jewish Agency, the following arrangements for the proper functioning of the Economic Department both in Jerusalem and in Tel Aviv have been agreed upon:

I. The Economic Department of the American Section of the Jewish Agency will be responsible for the final formulation and decision regarding the policy and method of capital promotion for private enterprises in Israel.

II. Economic Departments will function both in Jerusalem and in New York, each containing divisions dealing with :

- Mobilization of private capital. Tourism.
- otzeret Ha'aretz.

III. The Department in New York will operate mainly in North, Central, and South America.

IV. The Department in Jerusalem will operate in all countries except those within the jurisdiction of the American Section.

The Department in Jerusalem will be responsible for economic information v. and the issuing of publications connected with economic information, but it is understood that it will closely cooperate with the New York office.

VI. The Economic Department in Jerusalem will evaluabe pronomic projects submitted to it for examination; elaborate projects on its own initiative for the consideration of investors.

VII. All inquiries from the Americas which the Jerusalem office may receive from America will be forwarded for action and reply to the New York office together with all relevant information.

Dear Barbarash:

I received your telegram this morning and also the memo from Miss Kroll of January 3.

On Sunday I shall send you a new article on current developments here for your next issue.

Attached is the article on Keenan and a picture of him which <u>he gave me</u>. For your personal information ONLY, I spent a half hour with him on Tuesday. We had a lengthy discussion of various angles connected with his work, but he did not want me to quote him as a source at this time bedause it would embarrass him in his work. Most of my article is based on my talk with him and with his JEWISH partner, a chap named Morris Kanfer who is a member of the ZOA. I would advise you very strongly not to publicize this information because it will do us more harmthan good.

All I can tell you is: We have nothing to fear, the man knows what his job is and he is most anxious to be helpful to the Jews. But we cannot say so publicly. You may pass it on to Silver or Neuman, but no further. Keenan told me he will most definitely consult with Jewish leaders in this country before he leaves. Bear in mind, however, that his chief interest lies in keeping the Jews pacified and their votes safe for the Democratic Party.

I know much more than I can tell you or than I was able to disclose in the article. I had to be extremely cautious in my article. You may use it as is or shorten it if necessary, but do not add anything or change anything in a way that might embarrass me later.

He knows me now as a newspaperman. Bloom was theone that arranged my meeting with him, consequently he was very friendly. In view of that, it occured to me that perhaps Silver and Neumann would think it edvisable for me to go along with the Commission as a newspaperman, but at the same time to keep them posted <u>confidentially</u> on other developments. What do you think of the idea? Would you like to propose it to them? Maybe you ought to talk it over with Sidney Marks?

Dear Dr. Silver:

I want to acknowledge your letter of March 14th with respect to the incorporation of Jewish Agency, Inc., and the use of your name as one of the Directors.

The decision to incoporate Jewish Agency, Inc. was taken by the Plenary Session of the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine on February 18, 1949. It was decided that the Directors of the Corporation, until the first annual meeting, should all be the members of the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

Since the Executive has not acted upon your resignation your name was included among those of the other members as a Director.

On March 9th a notice of meeting of the Corporation was sent to you. Since that date the first annual meeting of the Corporation was held. Note was taken of your unwillingness to serve as a Director of Jewish Agency, Inc., and you were accordingly not reelected.

IF ANY AD-DITIONAL CELEBRATIONS ARE TO BE HELD ON THAT DAY, THE EMERGENCY COUNCIL WILL HAVE TO BE ASSURED OF AN ADDITIONAL EUDGET. REGARDS.
