Dear Sidney:

You must have been wondering why you have not heard from me. That I have been under pressure of a driving schedule is neither explanation nor justification because that has been a chronic condition. The fact is that I have deliberately refrained from stating my reactions to your draft report, even though you have requested it. The reasons?

A wise surveyor should present the facts and recommendations to the community and then stand aside and permit the community to grapple with the difficult problems of implementation. And implementation in a voluntary community rests not only on reason but also on adjustments, accommodations, and compromises. If the surveyor is authoritarian by inclination and has caught a glimpse of the Truth, with a capital T, he immediately becomes involved in a fight and helps destroy the effectiveness of his Report. Since I have no pretensions to absolute certainty, I don't object to modifications or rephrasing of our recommendations.

There is another reason. Our Report aroused very considerable feelings among certain elements in Cleveland. And, I suspect, that they were especially bitter because they knew that our strictures were justified. Your committees made the effort to soften the blow by dissociating themsolves from some of our criticisms, and I note in your Report a tendency to stress the work of your committees and correspondingly to play down the role of the surveyors. This was good tactical procedure.

However, if I were to comment as a surveyor on your Report, I would have to ignore the tactics of implementation and stress the facts, thus reopening old wounds. Moreover, any comments from me at this stage would have underscored the fact that, asyou put it, "there is a complete dependence upon your material throughout." And that would not have helped you in your delicate negotiations.

I think that Jewish education in Cleveland has profited from the Study. The challenge presented by us and the work of your committee have produced a ferment in the community which is of real educational value. Furthermore, some of our criticisms have struck home where they are bound to do good. The schools affected hotly challenged our accuracy and your committees naturally could not support us. Yet, the defects we noted were there, and the schools will correct some of them quietly and unobstrusively. Indeed, your report shows that in one school at least this process is at work.

Many of our recommendations cannot be implemented at once. It will take years of unremitting effort to effect the needed improvements in Jewish Education. However, two requirements are central at this stage, namely, adequate teaching personnel and a Bureau or

central community agency which has the confidence of the Rabbis and schools. If the Bureau is regarded by the schools as an external agency, its influence will be peripheral. It must become the agency of the schools, and I am glad to see that you have incorporated our recommendations respecting the "Educational Directors' Council" and the "Coordinating Committee." (p.26)


One word more. I hope that our recommendations respecting needed staff (p. 28), which you have incorporated, will really be carried out. Otherwise, the concomitant decisions will remain in the category of "noble sentiments."

May I add that your own contribution to this effort has been of inestimable value.



In 1948, Israel turned to us in America for help -- and our whole-hearted response was a vital factor in the narrow margin between survival and annihilation at that time. Now once again Israel is in a perilous situation. And once again we Zionists have the historic privilege of helping Israel in its time of crisis.

We shall have only one guest speaker--Lt. Colonel Ruth Berman of Israel's Defense Forces, who arrived in the United States yesterday. A colorful personality and dynamic speaker, Col. Berman is making her first visit to this country since 1948 and Cleveland is one of the few cities that will have the opportunity to hear her authoritative account of the current critical situation in Israel. We shall then take concrete action toward meeting our share of Cleveland's special quota of a minimum of \$500,000. Mr. Ezra Z. Shapiro will be in charge of this portion of the program.

Please mail back the enclosed self-addressed card immediately so that we can reserve a place for you at what I know will be a historic meeting, for the first time in many years of all Zionist organizations in Cleveland.

Heads of all nine Greater Cleveland Zionist organizations joined this week in a call to their memberships issued by Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, to participate in an Emergency Rally on Monday evening, February 20, at 8:30 in Mahler Hall of The Temple for immediate aid to Israel.

Termed the first such meeting of all Cleveland Zionist organizations in many years, the Rally stresses the critical situation confronting Israel and the Jewish men, women and children in North Africa seeking to emigrate to Israel. The Rally will seek to mobilize Zionist support throughout the community in cooperation with the Jewish Welfare Fund Appeal toward the nationwide Special Fund by the United Jewish Appeal, which seeks a minimum of \$25,000,000 to finance the emigration of at least 45,000 Jews from North Africa to Israel. This extra effort is in addition to the regular Welfare Fund Campaign now in progress.

Presiding at the Rally will be Rabbi Silver. Guest speaker will be Lt. Colonel Ruth Berman of Israel's Defense Forces, who arrived in New York this week. One of the first Jewish women to enlist in the British Army in 1942, she took part in numerous battles in World War II, reaching the rank of Captain. Cleveland is one of the few cities she will visit during her current stay in this country, which she last visited in 1948.

Following Col. Berman's analysis of the present situation in Israel and its relation to the emigration from North Africa, Ezra Z. Shapiro will call upon the audience for

specific steps to help meet Cleveland's minimum quota of \$500,000 toward the UJA Special Fund. Participating in the program will be Max Simon, President of The Jewish Community Federation, under whose auspices the annual Welfare Fund Campaign is conducted.

Appealing to the Zionist membership "to take leadership in this decisive campaign in cooperation with the local Welfare Fund", Rabbi Silver urged Zionists to "put everything aside in order to participate in the Rally." Joining in the call to all local Zionists and cooperating in the Rally are: Cleveland Zionist District, Cleveland Zionist Society, Hadassah, Heights Temple Zionist District, Mizrachi--Hapoel Hamizrachi, Mizrachi Women, Pioneer Women and Poale Zion-Farband.

# **1956 Jewish Welfare Fund Appeal**

The present dictator of Egypt calls Israel "an artificial State which must disappear". Quite recently he declared that he was looking forward to the Egyptian Army meeting the Syrian Army on Israel's ruins. King Saud of Arabia stated that "the only way which the Arab States must go is to pull up Israel by her roots", and asked "why should we not sacrifice ten million out of fifty million Arabs so that we may live in greatness and honour?" One Arab leader after another has voiced similar threats "to raze the State of Israel from the map". "Now that we have got rid of the British", said King Hussein of Jordan after the dismissal of General Glubb, "our next step will be to conquer the rest of Palestine".

These words are not empty threats. Hardly a day passes without some act of aggression by Egyptian forces across the Israel frontier. The villagers in the border land have to stand night after night on guard over their homes and dear ones against treacherous attacks from across the border. Moreover, of late, the Egyptian Government has overtly started large-scale preparations for war against Israel. The bulk of their military forces has been stationed along its southern frontier, equipped with large quantities of the offensive weapons recently received from Eastern Europe. As against this threat Israel finds itself grievously handicapped by its lack of essential arms. The weakening of its defensive position, which is becoming every day more evident to its enemies, has become a most powerful incentive to their aggressive policies. March 14,1956

During a very busy professional career, Judge Sobeloff has functioned as the Impartial Arbitrator of the Men's Clothing Industry in Baltimore; by appointment of the Circuit Court of Baltimore he conducted an investigation of the Baltimore Trust Co. the largest bank south of Philadelphia; he was counsel to the Housing Authority of Baltimore; he headed Maryland's Commission on the Administrative Organization of the State, which improved the budget system, parole procedure and effected other reforms; he served several terms as Vice-President of the Prisoners' Aid Association and is at present a member of its Board of Directors; and he is a member of the Executive Board of the Baltimore Urban League.

He has been a prominent leader in Jewish affairs as former President of Board of Jewish Education of Baltimore and director of National Association of Jewish Education; former President of Menorah Lodge, B'nai B'rith; one of the founders and first President of the Baltimore Branch of the American Jewish Congress, and former national vice-president; former President of Baltimore Jewish Council, and now a member of its Board; board member of Zionist Organization of America; and board member of Associated Jewish Charities of Baltimore.

A dynamic interpreter of the current world political picture, Mr. Sobeloff is eminently qualified to speak about the great life-saving, life-sustaining programs of the United Jewish Appeal.
