Dear Rabbi:

I hardly know whether it was more satisfying an experience to see Israel or to get back home to familiar surroundings and the family again. At any rate, part of the penalty I pay for being the last of our study group to Israel to get home, is that by this time I know you have received full accounts of the tremendous impression both Kfar Silver and all of Israel made on our group. Certainly I, who have been in this type or work for a good many years, should have been prepared for what we saw, but the impact was quite overwhelming. There were, of course, many questions and doubts on specific matters that occurred to all of us, but none of this is significant as compared with the tremendous force of what we saw and experienced.

We are all most grateful to you for inviting us to Kfar Silver and in a larger sense we also have a sense of gratitude in that your work throughout a lifetime has been one of the significant contributions that made Israel possible.

I very much hope that you have recovered from your bout of illness and I look forward to meeting with you and sharing some of my impression with you.

Dear Maury:

In preparation for the meeting of the Spencer D. Irwin Memorial Committee next Thursday, March 24, I thought it would be worth-while to share with you some ideas that have been expressed as to how the funds can most effectively be used. Here are some of the ideas so far, some based on using only the interest (about \$125 a year), and some based on using the capital so that awards will be made for perhaps six years in the amount of \$500 annually. The suggestions include:

1. Annual prize to local journalist who writes the best story, editorial, or feature on anything connected with the Middle East.

2. A summer scholarship for study in Israel by a qualified Cleveland college student. Perhaps the Israel government could supply a scholarship to the Hebrew University and lower fare on air travel to make this project really tempting.

3. Scholarships to Israeli journalist students to come to this country for a year's study. Possibly this idea and number 2 could be combined into three scholarships each on alternating years.

4. Establishment of a prize in the Department of History of Western Reserve University for the best essay on problems of the Middle East.

5. An annual award at Hebrew University for the best work dealing with America-Israel relationships.

6. Purchase of some part of a Spencer D. Irwin Memorial forest in Israel.

7. Sponsorship of an annual lecture by an outstanding authority on matters connected with America-Israel relationships or of Israel itself.

Perhaps by the time of our meeting other suggestions will be made and, if so, I will send them to you.

I am happy to report to you that a subcommittee composed of Dr Abba Hillel Silver, Albert A Levin, and Edward Braverman has recommended that the Spencer D. Irwin Memorial take the form of an award to an outstanding Greater Clevelander for a study mission to Israel. It is further recommended that the award be in the amount of \$1,500, with the aim of an annual or biennial designation of a recipient. The President of Federation will be asked to appoint a committee of five to select a community leader as the recipient of the award, and the expectation is that the first designation will be made in the next few months.

It is presently planned to present these recommendations to the Board of Trustees meeting on June 29. You are cordially invited to communicate with me if there is any negative reaction to these suggestions and it appears there is not enthusiastic approval of the subcommittee's recommendations, we shall convene a meeting of the full Spencer D Irwin Committee to consider alternative suggestions.

Otherwise, our chairman, Maurice Saltzman, will make the recommendations to the Board meeting and we are hopeful that we can quickly launch what seems to us to be a promising and significant project.

Thank you for your kindness and cooperation in making possible this work of our committee.
