My dear Dr. Silver:

First of all, I wish you, Mrs. Silver and the children a very, very Happy New Year.

I am returning the letter that you sent from Mr. Kotler. He honored me with a similar document on the early morning of Rosh Hashana. Similar letters have been received by various leaders.

Altogether \$40,000 was raised for the project. The word "colony" could not be employed because it was never our prerogative to establish colonies. We not only fulfilled all our obligations but went even further than that. We received approximately \$40,000 to establish a Nachlath. The correspondence we have from Mr. Peres himself, who has since passed away, definitely indicates that it was a Nachlath. Upon our request, the KKL established a Shekhunat Peres.

Let me quote a cable that I sent after having received Mr. Shankman's illuminating document, and the reply.

SEPTEMBER 30, 1949 "IMPERATIVE CABLE DETAILED INFORMATION RE NACHLATH PERES OF MEMPHIS GIVING SPECIFIC NUMBER OF DUNAMS ACQUIRED LOCATION OF PROJECT ALSO PROGRESS SETTLEMENT stop THIS INFORMATION ESSENTIAL BROCHURE PUBLISHED CIRCULATED WIDELY ZIONIST LEADERS ACCUSING US MISREPRESENTA-TION FAILURE TO LIVE UP OUR AGREEMENT"

JERUSALEM, OCTOBER 4, 1949 "RE YOURS THIRTIETH SHEKHUNAT PERES RESIDENTIAL QUARTER SIXTY DWELLING UNITS ESTABLISHED ON LAND NAHLAT HARDWIG PERES ONEHUNDREDNINETY DUNAMS LOCATED RAANANA"

As for the motivation, Mr. Shankman is a good Zionist. He seems to have a complex, however, on the subject matter of a colony and wishes to give the impression that the JNF here or the KKL in Jerusalem did not fulfill its obligations. We did more than that. I replied immediately to Mr. Kotler's letter and we are now preparing a document setting forth all the facts.

September 22, 1949 Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver 19810 Shaker Blvd. Cleveland, Ohio Dear Rabbi Silver, As the newly elected President of the Memphis Zionist District it has very strongly been brought to my attention that there is no Hardwig Peres Colony nor Memphis Peres Colony in Israel. It has also been forcibly brought to my attention that the Jewish National Fund or its representatives have for a number of years misrepresented the existence of a Memphis Peres Colony in Israel in raising money for the Jewish National Fund. While we in Memphis are wholly in sympathy with the "Fund", at the same time we do not feel that misrepresentation should be made regardless of how noble the purposes. This matter has taken such hold in Memphis that an article regarding it was made public in our 14th Annual Barbecue and Dance Souvenir Booklet, a copy of which is herein enclosed. Your particular attention is called to this article on Hardwig Peres. You will take note that specific names are used. The Memphis public at large has become aroused to the point that, if necessary, proper action will be instituted to search this matter out to its fullest. Heretofore our letters have gone unanswered and unacknowledged, and I must urge upon you the importance of this correspondence, so that it will not become necessary to take any drastic action to have our questions answered to the satisfaction of the many hundreds of persons in Memphis, who have contributed large sums of money with the specific direction and understanding that it would be earmarked for a Memphis Peres Colony in Israel.
