Dear Dr. Silver:

With the approach of Rosh Hashanah. may I wish you, Mrs. Silver and your sons a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year - - one in which you will be spared disappointment, and during which your genuine devotion to Israel and the Jewish people, and your sincerity of purpose will be better understood, even by those, who without justification, bitterly opposed you.

It is unfortunate that our son's severe illness necessitated the return home of my wife and myself from Geneva. just as we were to start for Jerusalem to attend the Congress. We both wanted so much to be there to support you to the fullest of our ability though we would have been on the losing side.

Dr. Harris Levine told me of what took place in Jerusalem. I am disgusted and heart-sick over the disloyalty of some of the present ZOA leaders. Their action was short-sighted and reeked with ingratitude, for it was you and you alone who saved them in Chicago last year. They should have had more decency. I am not alone in my let-down feeling. There are many, many others with whom I spoke and who are of the unanimous opinion that without your inspiring guidance and advice ZOA will not amount to anything from this point on. Its effectiveness ceases. The leadership during the last three years has not been strong enough to keep the organization from disintegrating. After Jerusalem we can expect the worst.

I suppose you wonder whether there are any on whom you can depend. As one who has been in touch with hundreds in the ZOA rank and file let me assure you that the membership was, still is and always will be, overwhelmingly behind you. You will continue as titular head of ZOA as long as you wish to, in spite of Ben Browdy's brain trust. For them there must be a day of reckoning. This is not said for the purpose of influencing you in shaping your future It is not for me to make suggestions to you on plans. that score. Whatever you decide on is good enough for your followers, among whom I am proud to count myself.

The condition of my son makes it imperative that I slow up Zionist activities for a time. On doctors' orders, I have declined to serve as President of the New Jersey ZOA Region for another term. However, if I can be of service to you in any way, I am yours to command.
