My dear Mr. Joseph:

Permit me to give you the information wanted,
soriatim:

1. Short Religious Services are held daily in the playroom;
Regular Services on the Sabbath and the Holy Days, are conducted in the
Prayer Hall.

2. & 3. In the fourth and fifth grades, three sessions per week are given to the study of Hebrew and Biblical History; in the sixth and seventh grades, two sessions, and in the most advanced classes, but one session is assigned to the work. The length of the session varies from 55 to 70 minutes.

4. In Hebrew the children are taught to read and to translate. They also learn to use the script. In the lower classes, it is the portions of the Union Prayer Book that are usually read in Hebrew, which the children learn to translate; in the higher classes, selections from the Pentateuch, the Psalms and the Sayings of the Fathers, (Pirke Aboth), are drawn upon for the same purpose. The study of Biblical History is completed in the seventh grade. Beginning with the eighth grade, post-Biblical History is studied and a rapid survey of Mediaeval and Modern Jewish History has been given.

5. I personally, took charge of the class composed of girls and boys attending high school and the girls of our commercial class. I also instruct the confirmation class. Mr. L. I. Reich has had complete charge of the work done in the subjects mentioned, in the other classes of our school. The salary paid to him is \$1595.00 per annum.

My dear Rabbi:

At the outset let me remind you of the fact that you are a Member of the Board of Trustees and Directors of The Cleveland Jewish Orphan Asylum.

You have undoubtedly received notice that Mr. L. Edward Lashman was elected Superintendent of the Orphan Asylum to succeed Mr. Peiser on January 1st next; you are undoubtedly familiar with the fact that Mr. Lashman is not a Rabbi nor as he ever taught Hebrew or Biblical History nor conducted Services. I enclose herewith copy of a letter from Mr. Peiser giving the information as to Religious Services and the study of Hebrew and Biblical History. I assume that, to some extent, these will have to be continued under Mr. Lashman's administration and the problem is whether the course pursued under Rabbi Peiser which, as I understand it, is exactly the same course pursued under Dr. Wolfenstein, should be continued in all its parts or should be modified and then we have the further question as to who shall head the religious department, deliver sermons and, in a general way, supervise the religious activities beginning January 1st.

I wish you would be good enough to give this matter your attention and give me your suggestions which I will forward to the Board.

I appreciate very much your kind reminder that I am a member of the Board of Trustees of the Cleveland Jewish Orphan Asylum. I regret exceedingly that such a little thing as my Sunday morning service has to interfere with your meetings, but you see I am, unfortunately, paid to attend every service.

With reference to the religious studies at the Orphanage, permit me to say, that they should, under all circumstances, be continued. I am including under religious studies the study of Hebrew and Biblical History. The new Superintendent may very well conduct the services on week days as well as on the Sabbath or Holidays. In our religion it does not need an ordained Rabbi to conduct services. He may also deliver short talks to the boys and girls on these occasions, and I am quite confident that Mr. Lashman is fully competent to do it.

With reference to the Confirmation Class, it might perhaps be advisable to adopt the plan of the Council Educational Alliance, i.e., to request the Rabbis of the City to meet with the Class one afternoon a week and to conduct the Confirmation Service at the conclusion of the year, each Rabbi to undertake the instruction for one year. The alternative may be adopted of having the members of the Confirmation Class attend the sessions of the Confirmation Class in one of the local Temples. This plan, would be feasible only as long as the Orphanage

My dear Rabbi:

I am exceedingly obliged to you for yours of the 11th and have sent a copy to Mr. Lashman. Mr. and Mrs. Lashman expect to come to Cleveland permanently about ten days before the first of January and will assume their duties on the first. I will suggest to Mr. Lashman, if it is agreeable to you, that as soon as he can after his arrival here late this month he confer with you for the purpose of mapping out a program for a continuance of the study of Hebrew and Biblical History. In this connection I would like to say that I am in favor of continuing and even enlarging upon the study of Biblical History but I am not prepared to say if the time now devoted at the Orphan Asylum to the study of the Hebrew language is advisable. I think that the matter should be thoroughly gone into with the end in view that the children should not be compelled to go through the form of acquiring a language in which they have no real interest and in which they make no real progress. Mind you, I do not say that the study of the Hebrew language should be totally abolished, but I do say that perhaps its study at the Orphan Asylum should be more restricted than it is now.


It has occurred to me that we might be able to give more dignity and meaning to our religious services on Saturday mornings if we encouraged the presence of grown-ups with their children at our services. 4. Consulting service ... providing accomplished case workers for all problems in the children's field.


