Please return this card at once so that the committee may know how to plan for you. No reservations for the dinner after July 24th.







Dear Mr. Freedman:

I have your letter of March eighth. In reply, let me state that I should greatly appreciate the opportunity to appear before your Budget Committee in order to present the case of the Dropsie College. I am sure that a time can be arranged which will be satisfactory to the Committee and also conventionttomme. I am particularly eager that once for all the Dropsie may have a fair hearing in your important community. I am glad to let you have the figures for which you ask, but they do not tell the full story and are apt to create misunderstanding of the true situation.

In the new fuscal year - May 1, 1944 to April 50, 1945 - the budget calls for an expenditure of \$60,000. The income from the endowment which at one time approximated \$75,000. has shrunk to only \$20,000. We are therefore primarily dependent for the maintenance of the College and its growth upon the allocation of various Jewish community funds. Philadelphia, through its Allied Jewish Appeal, allocates to the College the sum of \$7,500; Bostons \$2000. Detroit is considering an allocation of \$2500. for the forthcoming year. Their past allocation was \$1000. In Pitteburgh we receive \$1500. from individuals. In Baltimore, where we have received approximately \$2000. per annum from individual subscriptions, we are now having our application considered by the Community Fund. In Cincinnati, a committee has undertaken to raise \$1500. to \$2000. for the College.from private subscriptions. Smaller communities contribute sums ranging from \$100. to \$500.

As to Cleveland, were I to make a formal application, it would be for the sum of \$2000. But for the time being, all I ask is an opportunity to interpret the College and its relation to higher Jewish life in

America.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I am writing you in behalf of the Yiddish Scientific Institute located in New York. I know that you are very busy and burdened with a lot of responsibility so I hesitated a great deal before writing to you. However, I do not know anyone else here in Cleveland who is interested in the work that the Institute is doing, I have learned that you and I are the only two in the city of Cleveland donating annually to the work that this Institute is doing.

It has been called to my attention that the welfare federations in different cities are helping, the Jewish Welfare of Cleveland is only donating \$200.00 per annum to this organization. This in my opinion is very little — our neighboring cities, such as Detroit and Pittsburgh are doing a great deal more to assist this worthy institute with which I am sure you are familiar. I am therefore appealing to you as one of the trustees of the Jewish Welfare to see if at all possible whether the appropriation for the Yiddish Scientific Institute can be increased. While I know that there are a good many demands and calls on the Jewish Welfare fund which are very important I believe that this cause is also important and in my opinion the appropriation should be substantially increased.

I will appreciate your effort in their behalf and if you think I should take this up with some of the other trustees I shall be glad to do so.

My dear Mr. Cahen:

Please pardon the delay in answering your letter. I have been away from the city a good deal of the time.

The allocations for 1944 have already been made by the Jewish Welfare Fund of Cleveland. I am under the impression that the Yiddish Scientific Institute receives its subsidy from the Contingent Fund of the Jewish Welfare Fund which is authorized to appropriate relatively small sums of money to overseas Yeshivoth, Academies, etc. At the forthcoming meeting of the Contingent Fund I shall make inquiries as to whether a larger appropriation cannot be made for the Yiddish Scientific Institute. Rabbi Armond Cohen, of the Jewish Center, is chairman of this Contingent Fund and it may be helpful if you would get in touch with him.
