Dear Rabbi Silver:

I called you today but was unable to reach you because of the very busy day which you had. Since I'm going to be out of the office most of tomorrow morning, I asked Miss Klein to call me in the afternoon when you were free, and in the meantime you might have an opportunity to give some thought to the matter described below.

Two of the persons leading the Girl Scout capital account campaign for a new camp -- Mr. Seely and Mrs. Robinson -- saw Mr. Berne on Monday and were considerably concerned with the fact that of the \$ 37,000 pledged to date, only about \$ 600 had been contributed by Jews. About 500 of the 3,000 Girl Scouts, on the other hand, are Jewish.

Mr. Berne of course was anxious to improve the situation, but didn't want to do anything which would be harmful to the Jewish Welfare Fund campaign. He asked me to discuss the matter with you, since he had to leave for New York Monday evening.

At his suggestion I met with Mr. Seely and Mrs. Robinson, and found that they have solicited very few Jewish persons, and have not made a very effective approach to them. In analyzing the matter with Mr. Berne, and later with them, it seemed to us that we might be helpful in the following ways: (1) provide them

with a more adequate list of prospects than they now have; (2) add some outstanding Jewish persons to their Sponsoring Committee -- they already had decided to ask Mr. Berne, Mrs. Fryer, and Mrs. Herzog to serve in this capacity, in addition to yourself and Rabbi Brickner; (3) explain to the prospects that the Girl Scout organization is non-sectarian and that several hundred Jewish girls receive its benefits-- a fact which the prospects apparently did not understand fully; (4) possibly have their campaign chairman send a letter from campaign headquarters prior to the visit of the solicitor informing the prospect of the non-sectarian character of the Scout service. All this would have to be handled carefully, and the letter would not mention or single out the Jews in any way, but would be general in nature and would apply equally well to all groups.

It seems that these steps might be helpful, without drawing us into the campaign directly, and would safeguard the Jewish Welfare Fund. I shall be glad to get your reactions to such a program.



2. 1937 Campaign Plans, subject to approval and further suggestion from the Welfare Fund Committee:

a Goal of the Campaign

The Goal of the 1937 Campaign which will be increased necessarily by the requirements of the Overseas Agencies for the aid of Polish and German Jews, will be decided by the Budget Committee after its usual review of the information and the applications before it.

b. Date of the Campaign and Campaign Headquarters

The date of May 2nd is suggested for the opening of the Drive. The Statler Hotel will be headquarters if the same accommodations and facilities as last year, can be had.

c Campaign Organization Activities to Date

Men's Division

Under the Leadership of Mr Philip Frankel, and with the aid of the Business men's Council, the personnel of the Men's Soliciting Division, is being chosen, and the workers are being invited for service.

Women's Division

Under the Chairmanship of Mrs Siegmund Herzog, the Women's Executive Committee has been re-organized; Team Captains have been chosen and the quota of Team Workers is now being filled.

Youth's Division

Mr Jerome Curtis has again consented to take the leadership of this Group and plans are going forward with its organization.

Store and Factory Employe Division

Messrs Leo Neumark and Joseph Peveroff are being asked to head the Employees' Division and they will select key people for all stores and factories having Jewish employes.

Publicity Division

Mr Howard Wise is being asked to direct the activities of the Publicity Committee this year.

As heretofore, use will be made of the valuable publicity material which may be had from the overseas as well as some national agencies. Publicity will also be had as before through direct mail, the Anglo-Jewish Weeklies, Yiddish Dailies; Speakers' Bureau, the Radio; etc.

3. Election of Officers for the Campaign:

Special Committee to bring in a slate of Officers at this Meeting.

4. Budget and Quotas for the Campaign

- a The Budget Committee will proceed with the consideration of all appeals from national, international and local Agencies for inclusion, and for their 1937 needs; and to report back their recommendations to the Welfare Fund Committee and the Federation Board;
- b The Advisory Committee will be called upon to review the larger prospect cards for new ratings and for special assignments for pre-campaign solicitation; in this they will have the cooperation of the Division Chairmen.

5. Publication of the 1936 Booklet of Givers

The Welfare Fund Committee will need to authorize the publication and distribution at once of the 1936 Jewish Welfare Fund Booklet containing the list of all paid pledges of \$5 and over.





Dear Dr. Hurwitz:

Replying to your day letter, regret to state that the Budget Committee of the Welfare Fund has not made a practice of inviting representatives of the individual beneficiary agencies to appear before it to plead their respective causes. When such representatives have happened to be in the City, attempt has been made to extend them the courtesy of a meeting with such officers of the Fund as might be available, but you will realize that there are altogether too many beneficiary agencies included in the Fund to arrange meetings for all of them to appear; and furthermore, the Budget Committee has preferred to rely upon the reports provided by the Agencies themselves as well as other information sources available to the Federation and Welfare Fund, applying its own uninfluenced judgment after a careful review of the information provided. Nor would it be advisable to put some of these agencies to the expense of sending representatives in the light of the limitation of allotments, which can be made available to them.

We would, therefore, respectfully request that you send the information asked for so that your Agency may receive the same consideration extended to all others.



Dear Mr. Gould:

The undersigned, Officers of the Jewish Welfare Fund of Cleveland, would like very much to have your personal suggestions and reaction to the matter discussed in this letter.

The problems arising in Jewish Life today, both current and general, are such as to impose upon all of us the obligation to give of ourselves and our substance, not only that men, women and children, who have been suffering from want and persecution, may be lifted out of their misery, but also that we may for ourselves avert the spread of those conditions, which have contributed to their suffering. We need, every one of us, to be concerned over these problems, and we here in Cleveland have endeavored in the development of our Jewish Community life, to build strongly toward these ends.

The Jewish Welfare Fund of Cleveland was established in 1931 for the purpose of raising funds in the Jewish Community of Cleveland for Jewish agencies and causes which do not come within the scope of the local Community Fund for support.

The Fund has developed successfully to a point where our Community is availing itself quite generally of the opportunity to give in a single amount annually to cover the needs and the appeals of many Jewish causes, local, national, and overseas. For the year 1936 there were included in our Jewish Welfare Fund, as beneficiaries, twenty-eight different agencies not including several smaller Yeshivas

and Overseas institutions. The Fund was supported by over 9,000 Jewish contributors, who gave a total of nearly \$235,000. Of this latter amount \$120,000 was allocated to the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal.

It has now occurred to the Officers of our Cleveland Jewish Welfare Fund that some of the smaller communities surrounding Cleveland might wish to join in an effort of this kind, by:

- (a) Having representation from their Communities to sit on the Welfare Fund Committee in Cleveland;
- (b) To participate in considering the allocation of funds, to the many causes and agencies approved by our Budget Committee;
- (c) To carry on the Campaigns in their respective Communities coincidentally, if possible, with the May Campaign, each year in Cleveland;
- (d) To avail themselves of all of the information, which the Cleveland Welfare Fund has at its disposal, regarding these agencies and their needs; and to make use of such campaign information, literature and publicity as the Cleveland Fund can offer, all with a view to giving the efforts of the small communities, surrounding Cleveland, the benefit of the knowledge and inspiration, which has made for the success of our Appeals.

Sheet 3 -

The undersigned, who have been requested to explore the possibilities of such a plan, submit this to you with the request that you be kind enough to take the matter up with other prominent Jewish persons in your City to determine if such a program is feasible and might be undertaken even for this year and in the May Campaign, which is now being planned.

This program for the development of a "Metropoliten Welfare Fund" in line with the suggestions here set forth, is being submitted now also to the following cities: Ashtabula, Elyria, Geneva, Oberlin, and Painesville. If this seems practicable and desirable, an arrangement might be made for the selection of yourself and other prominent Jews of your City to attend a meeting soon of our own Welfare Fund Officers.

Cleveland has been going forward for the past six weeks with the preparation of its own Campaign, and we should be glad to hear from you promptly as to your reaction to this plan.



Dear Rabbi:

This matter of attempting to secure help from the Jewish Labor Unions has been tried in the past, though perhaps not as thoroughly explored as might be possible. You will perhaps recall that in the 1926 Campaign the Jewish Carpenters' Unions subscribed \$5500 which it never paid in full. It was at that time much the strongest of the Jewish Unions in the City of Cleveland, and our pledge was secured through their Mr. Goldberg and other Officers. The balance of \$3,000 of the pledge was never paid.

Last year Leo Neumark and his Employment Division Officers considered the question of approaching the so-called Jewish Unions; they did not find Mr. Katovsky particularly friendly to the Fund, perhaps for the usual reason of Labor's attitude toward the leadership of Jewish philanthropy. It also developed that it was not wise to apply to the Amalgamated Textile Workers because of the inclusion in their ranks now of a much larger percentage of Italian and other non-Jewish textile workers; it was, therefore, decided to make our Appeal directly to the Jewish workers through factory Committees as we did.

The other Union, which has a great many Jewish members, is the Film Operators, and these were handled through the Amusement Division and Mr. Martin Blum, who has been the Attorney for the Union and who was made a member of our Committee; the Musicians were likewise approached individually through representation on our Amusement Divi-



My dear Sam:

With reference to your inquiry about Felix Lowell, I do not recall that I asked him at any time to work in the campaign. I think, however, that he should be asked and his active support solicited.

I have just had a report about the campaign in Milwaukee. Their quota was \$65,000 - \$15,000 more than last year. They have raised no more than \$50,000 with the prospect of an additional \$6,000 from donors who are out of the city. In other words, they have gone just about ten percent better than last year. Milwaukee is a well organized welfare fund town and their inability to get more than about ten percent of last year's quota ought to give us pause when we talk about adding what amounts to \$60,000 over our last year's goal. If we discount the high pressure last minute solicitation at the Victory Dinner (a feat which, by the way, we cannot duplicate this year) and deduct some funds like the Herman Friedman legacy, the sum raised last year in the straight campaign was not much more than \$215,000. I am therefore wondering whether the goal of \$275,000 is really not an excessive one and whether sober judgment ought not to dictate that our goal ought not to be much beyond \$250,000. I should like to have you think through this problem not in relation to the overseas needs which are really unlimited, nor in relation to the capacity of the Jews of Cleveland to give if they are so inclined, but in relation to the availability of such giving.

I have gone over the 1936 booklet of donors a few times for a realistic scrutiny of the situation. Frankly, I do not know from what sources we expect to



Dear Mr. Goldhamer:

I have not acknowledged your letter in which you ask for figures on the Youth Aliyah Movement last year because I immediately contacted Hadassah and the United Palestine Appeal in order to try to get some information of the relationship of the money transferred from one organization to the other. But, since, to-date I have received no replies, I want you to have what information I have in my files.

During Hadassah's fiscal year ending September 30, 1936, \$109,421.13 were collected as earmarked contributions for Youth Aliyah. Of this amount, \$96,483.25 was remitted to the Bureau in Palestine. The balance, \$12,937.88, represented half of the money raised by Mr. Eddie Cantor, which, according to Hadassah, will eventually, according to an agreement with the United Palestine Appeal, be spent for the settlement of children who have finished their two years training in Palestine.

According to the audit of the United Palestine Appeal, no income, in the statements of income and expense from January 1, 1936 to December 31, 1936, was received or disbursed for the Youth Aliyah Movement. However, in the body of the audit, which contains many statements and interpretations, it is indicated that Hadassah raised and transferred to the United Palestine Appeal for the Youth Aliyah Movement, \$136,520.48. As you see, these figures are a bit inconsistent, and what I am trying to find out is what is the total amount collected by Hadassah and the total amount transferred by them to the United Palestine Appeal.

I shall be glad to write you as soon as I have received answers to my letters which were mailed from this office on March 18th. In the meantime, will you consider this information merely tentative and preliminary.



Dear Rabbi:

I think we should be in much better position to discuss the possibilities of our Campaign Goal, after I have finished the analysis of last year's giving and the preparation in form of that material which I was able to secure for our purposes this year.

I quite agree with you that the Special Gifts which were thrown into the Campaign last year to bring us nearer to an achievement of the goal, leave a considerable gap to be bridged apart from the increase we are planning to seek; and certainly this must be given consideration. However, I still feel that we ought to analyze the figures and consider some special measures that possibly might be taken to give a fresh impetus to the drive this year. I shall get in touch with you within a few days as soon as I have this material in shape.

THE NATIONAL LABOR COMMITTEE FOR THE JEWISH WORKERS IN PALESTINE, INC.

Note: This report for the calendar year of 1935 is based on printed material describing the purpose and activities of the Histadruth in Palestine and an audited account of the National Labor Committee in America. Material and information through conferences and by letter were supplied by the National Labor Committee to the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. This statement is limited to an analysis of scope, volume, and costs, and is not intended in any way to be an evaluation of the work.

PURPOSE

The National Labor Committee for the Jewish Workers in Palestine, located at 1225 Broadway, New York City, was organized in 1923 by the United Hebrew Trades of New York. The purpose as expressed by its leaders is "for mobilizing the moral and material support of American Jewry for the Jewish workers and pioneers in Palestine."

The Palestine Labor movement, known as the Histadruth Haovdim, is for the purpose of creating in Palestine a labor commonwealth, regulating immigration, colonization and the education of the worker, and attempting to cooperate peacefully with the Arab working masses.

SCOPE

The labor movement in Palestine is interested not only in the problems of the individual worker, but assumes responsibility of an agency concerned with the entire program of colonization.

For the purpose of immigration, the Histadruth Haovdim has created a Youth and Chalutz movement known as the Hechalutz. This movement, organized in many countries, gives instruction and training to prospective immigrants for the physical, cultural, and social life of Palestine.

Upon arrival in Palestine, the Central Immigration Office looks after the newcomer and through its various departments helps to provide jobs both in the city and on the farm.

The colonization program is carried on through the agency known as "NIR," formed by organized labor with considerable capital of its own.

There have also been developed 75 industrial cooperatives including those for transportation and communication, for wholesale and retail buying, for the sale of farm products, for agricultural undertakings, for banking, life insurance, housing, medical care, education, and for many other types of collective action.

Histadruth is concerned with social legislation and has promoted measures for employees' liabilities, for industrial accidents, for safeguarding the health of women and children, for legal recognition of the unions and for the rights of collective bargaining.

VOLUME

Created in 1920 with 4,433 members, it is stated that the membership of the Palestine Federation of Jewish Labor now includes 100,000 individuals, who, with

their families, constitute one-third of the population of Palestine.

The 75 collective farm settlements are reported to have 4,150 families while 53 small holders cooperative settlements are represented by 3,361 families.

The cooperatives are reported as conducting a volume of business partially illustrated by the following facts and figures. The wholesale and retail co-operative supplies goods to workers totalling a year's turnover of more than \$3,000,000. Sales of the marketing association amount to almost \$2,700,000.

Cultivation of 10,000 dunam of orange groves with a cost of labor, machinery of nearly \$1,100,000.

Loan and savings funds with a membership of 25,000.

Houses built for 3,000 families.

Health cooperatives with 65,000 members employing 200 physicians, 70 dentists, 23 druggists, and 220 nurses.

Analysis

The income from contributions includes \$9,492.24 from 32 federations and welfare funds.

It is estimated that "the major part of the income is being collected from labor organizations, the balance from friends who sympathize with the aims and activities of the labor movement in Palestine."

Of expense, 7.45 percent or \$14,668.37 is for administration; \$31,902.77 or 16.2 percent for organization, including the development of the American program and money raising, while \$150,263.98 or 76.37 percent of the funds raised were transferred to Histadruth Hoavdim in Palestine.

The quota for 1937 which was adopted at the twelfth national convention held in New York November 29th to December 1, 1936, is one half of a million dollars, while the budget for administration and organization expenditures will not exceed the sum of \$50,000.00.


1. It is stated that funds collected in America have been used to provide agricultural and industrial tools and machinery for the Jewish pioneers in Palestine, stimulated colonization and helped to develop a great variety of cultural and cooperative labor institutions.
2. The National Labor Committee for the Jewish Workers in Palestine, Inc., has "aside from money raising, the purpose of carrying on widespread propaganda and educational activities through mass meetings, lectures, etc., with the purpose of acquainting the Jewish population in this country with the program of the Palestine Federation of Labor."
3. It would be appropriate for welfare funds to consider their contribution on the basis of whether the inclusion of this organization in local campaigns is in lieu of all other collections made in the local community or whether the Flower Day and collections from local representatives of labor organizations that have been interested in developing, sponsoring, and financing the program, is to be continued.

THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF JEWISH SOCIAL WORK

Note: This report for the calendar year of 1935 and the anticipated costs and receipts for 1936 is based on statements supplied by the School to the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. The report is not intended in any way to be an evaluation of the work.

ORIGIN AND PURPOSE

The Graduate School of Jewish Social Work, located at 71 West 47th Street, New York City, was organized in January 1925 as the Training School for Jewish Social Work.

The School was created in response to a need for training social workers for Jewish social service and was initiated after several years of study by a special committee of the National Conference of Jewish Social Service.

The purpose of the School is indicated in the following statement by the President of the Faculty and Director of the School, Dr. M.J. Karpf:-

"The Graduate School for Jewish Social Work aims to provide facilities for the initial training of new social workers by offering a course of graduate study lasting two academic years. It also aims to provide facilities for further training and preparation of such workers as are already in the field of Jewish social work and want to equip themselves for better work and for further advancement in their chosen profession."

SCOPE

The requirements for admission to the regular course are:

1. Graduation from an accredited college or university
2. Adequate personality
3. Interest in and adaptability for social work
4. Knowledge of social sciences, especially sociology, psychology, social psychology, and economics

The School offers three courses of study leading to:

1. The Certificate
2. The Masters Degree
3. The Doctors Degree

The School is a member of the American Association of Schools of Social Work, the accrediting national body for schools of social work in the United States and Canada.

The School offers in addition to its regular course, extension courses to meet special needs of those already in professional social work or for those who are volunteers in social agencies.

For the selection of its students and the distribution of its graduates, the School is national in scope. This fact is borne out by the registration for the academic year 1935-1936 when students were in attendance from 24 cities in ten different States. During the current year, students came from 27 cities in 12 different States.

VOLUME

The School had a registration of 134 students in 1935 and 119 in 1936, about 50 of whom were full-time students. Since its organization in 1925, the School reports that it has enrolled approximately 1,000 students, including full-time, part-time, and for special classes and institutes, of which several were held in conjunction with the Bureau of Jewish Social Research and the Jewish Welfare Board. The School has graduated 146 students. The faculty consists of the Director, six full-time faculty members, six part-time faculty members, a number of special lecturers, staff members of the Jewish Welfare Board, and other Jewish social agencies where the students do their field work. Students take part of their work at the New York School of Social Work.

Graduates were reported in 1936 to be distributed as follows:

Family Case Work	38 percent
Child-Care	18 percent
Community Center	14 percent
Psychiatric Social Work	13 percent
Other Types of Social Work	17 percent

A graph prepared by the School in 1936 indicates that 64 percent of the graduates have positions as case workers, 17 percent as sub-executives, 10 percent in executive capacities, the remaining 9 percent being occupied in research and miscellaneous positions.

(a) It is explained that the excess of income over expense is created by the fact that part of the income is for the previous and part for the following year.

The financial support of the School has come from two foundations in New York City, 22 federations, and private contributions.

Analysis

Foundations in 1935 supplied 55 percent of the income of the School, individuals 20 percent, federations 15 percent, and tuition 10 percent. There is no endowment fund.

Present Financial Problem

As indicated in the report of the Director submitted to the Board of Trustees in June 1936, the two foundations which contributed more than 50 percent of the School's income since its organization, have indicated their unwillingness to continue their support of the School beyond the calendar year of 1937. This decision is based on the belief that foundations should not continue to support any given work except during the experimental period and that the federations, which are the beneficiaries of trained personnel, should support it.

COMMENTS

1. Tables prepared by the School indicate that 65 percent of its students come from the East, 24 percent from the Midwest, 7 percent from the South, 3 percent from the West, and 1 percent from Canada.

The distribution of graduates is as follows: 73.4 percent in the East, 22.4 percent in the Midwest, 2 percent in the South, and 2 percent in the West.


2. If foundation support is diminished or withdrawn, the School will need to have larger appropriations from federations and welfare funds if it is to continue on its present budget.
3. The problem of the financial support of the Graduate School was presented to the Council at its annual assembly on January 31, 1937, and a resolution suggesting that a meeting of representatives of some of the larger federations be held at the call of the Board of Trustees of the Graduate School was adopted. A copy of this resolution was sent to member agencies. When the meeting is called, a more detailed report on the School and its financial needs will be made available to member agencies.
4. The report of the Director to the Board of the School which sets forth the present situation and problems of the School, and which is a confidential document, may be obtained by direct communication with the School.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

We have just received from the Central Committee of the Jews in Germany, a report for 1936. The Joint Distribution Committee was not only instrumental in setting up this Central Committee in 1933 to cope with emergency problems, but it has been rendering the bulk of its service to the Jews in Germany through this organization.

The report fills 170 pages of closely set type. It gives an amazingly detailed picture of the condition and the trials of German Jewry. Much of the material is statistical, but to many of us these statistics reflect an unusual story of human suffering and of human courage. Since it is impossible to obtain a copy of this report for all our friends and supporters, I feel that I should at least give you a summary.

I cannot convey to you the full magnitude or significance of the story of the Jews of Germany during 1936. After these four years one might have expected that the Jews of Germany would have lost their courage, their strength, and in many cases even the will to live. Certainly, many of their best minds, their strongest men, have either fled or been exiled, or have died. Much of their wealth has disappeared, their resources slowly but steadily depleted. Yet, despite all this, they have shown a spiritual strength, an ability to reorganize their lives under restricted conditions and a capacity for self-sacrifice that is truly epic.

Realizing this, you will perhaps better understand the meaning of the fact that the German Jews themselves contributed during 1936 12,500,000 Reichsmarks, well over \$4,000,000., toward their own self-help activities. Part of these funds was for the use of the Central Committee for those special needs created by the policies of the Government. But these emergencies could not be met alone by the Jews of Germany. They felt they should, and they have, taken care of all their own normal welfare and relief work, even though the burden has grown to a magnitude far beyond anything that the Jewish Community of Germany has ever known before.

But it is to emergency activities, to the retraining of youth, to the providing of schooling for the children, to the emigration of those who can leave the country, that the Jews of Germany have asked their co-religionists of other lands to contribute. The record for 1936 shows, that the Jews of other lands contributed 59 percent of the Central Committee's budget of which over half came from the Jews of America through the Joint Distribution Committee. This is a record of which the Jews of America may be proud, but not so proud that we can say we have done our share and our task is over. The J.D.C. in 1936 contributed \$525,000. for work in behalf of Jews inside Germany. Reading this report, I am convinced you would agree that during 1937 we must give much more.

Here are some other things which the contributions of the J.D.C. helped to achieve in 1936:

Vocational training or retraining was received by 7,600 young men and women in agriculture and manual arts. They were thus better prepared for employment and possible emigration.

24,000 Jews were enabled to leave Germany for Palestine, the Americas, South Africa and other overseas or European countries. Half of them received assistance from organizations supported by the J.D.C.

An entire Jewish school system now numbering 160 schools is being established, because of the prohibition of Jewish attendance in the State schools. Already 22,000 Jewish children are attending these Jewish institutions and 20,000 more are anxiously awaiting that opportunity.

These are just a few of the bare statistics of Jewish life in Germany for the support of which American Jewry should be willing to assume a large share of financial responsibility.

How can I tell you what living conditions for Jews in Germany really are? You have read and heard much about this in the last few years. But think what it means when the report shows that 84,000 Jews have been on Jewish winter relief this season. Think what it means that, as conditions in the smaller German communities grow worse and worse, the young people crowd toward Berlin and a few other large cities where Jewish life is still somewhat more bearable. Think what little chance they have under such conditions, for employment or economic rehabilitation. And in the smaller communities they leave the older folks, even less able than these youngsters, so that the Central Committee has had to set aside 10 percent of its budget for welfare work.

The conditions of the Jews in Germany become worse each day. They need more economic aid, more welfare service, more vocational retraining, more emigration assistance. Since they are less able than ever to do these things for themselves, they must look to us, to the Jews in America, to the Joint Distribution Committee for these services. And it is our duty and yours to bring home to all our fellow Jews here their responsibility of standing by the Jews of Germany.

I feel that you, as a friend of the Joint Distribution Committee, will wish to make some of these things known to others and that you will do whatever you can to influence them to make the most generous contributions possible for the advancement of our program in Germany, as well as our program for aid in Poland and other lands of Eastern Europe.

Constant repetition of the same stories of distress and suffering sometimes tends to pall upon us. Few reports I have read recently are so touching as this merely factual statement of the Central Committee of the Jews in Germany. I hope that this letter conveys to you something of the sense of hardship, of courage, of sacrifice and of the need for our assistance that appears between the lines of the report.

As heretofore, we would welcome having the benefit of your comments and suggestions with respect to this, or indeed to any of the Joint Distribution Committee activities.

As one of a substantial Group in the Jewish Community of Cleveland, you should, we feel, be made aware of a situation of vital interest to you.

For several years now, the Jewish Teachers of Cleveland, have been accorded with other Jewish citizens, the opportunity to share in the burden of the support of Jewish Agencies and Institutions, mainly national and Overseas, and which are an essential part of our Jewish life.

And despite the growing needs and problems with which Jewry here as elsewhere, have been confronted; and notwithstanding the steadily increasing support which other Jews have accorded the Jewish Welfare Fund in its endeavors to meet these needs, the Jewish Teachers have consistently failed to lend their aid in any proportionate share to the participation of other groups.

Thus, in 1936, out of a total of 447 Jewish Teachers to whom information regarding the Campaign was sent, and to whom the appeal was directed either by mail or in person by Teachers who undertook their solicitation, only 193 considered the appeal worthy of their support and gave anything at all. And more important still, the record of the Teachers average gifts of \$4.55 per Pledge, stands out most glaringly of all, as testimony to a lack of appreciation of the importance of these Causes to them as to all other Jews.

It is our sincere hope that when you are called upon this year, your gift will be commensurate with your obligation to the 47 Causes included, and with your desire to give as others are doing.



My dear Mr. Richman:

In writing you on behalf of the Joint Distribution Committee, I am fully mindful of the great interest that you have taken in our work over so many years. Knowing as much as you do of our activities, we have perhaps a right to feel that your support has been given after full consideration and that therefore we may well be proud of the endorsement which you have given us - and you can well imagine that the endorsement and the support of thinking people is, quite apart from the financial help, a great mental assistance for us.

We are this year in a position where we have to go out for larger contributions from all communities. In your own community, your contribution means perhaps more than you realize. It not only sets the pace for others, but it shows to others the importance which you attach to our work. While our work is continuous and strenuous, we come to a community only once a year and at that time it is important for us to make efforts to enlist the thoughtful consideration of the most important people. In many cases this can only be done by personal appeal. Of this you get a sufficient number, no doubt, from the men who occupy themselves with the efforts to raise everybody's interest in your own city; and it may seem that in these efforts we in New York are perhaps only outsiders who would not need ordinarily to interfere with or to supplement the efforts of the local leaders. But we are in an extraordinary situation.

We have had prepared in New York a little pamphlet showing, in a birdseye fashion, the various activities which rely on our support. It is perhaps a typical fact that although this little pamphlet was only drawn up a few months ago, it does not mention the important activity which became necessary for us to interest ourselves in within the last few weeks. After lengthy meetings in which all our officers, including Mr. Felix Warburg, participated, we had to decide to make quite an unexpected appropriation of some \$70,000 to clean up a situation in San Paulo, Brazil, and to prevent difficulties there for the immigrants. What other acute situation may come to us tomorrow, we don't know, but we have got to be ready for everything that comes. Mr. Warburg has been in London for several weeks attending meetings of the Council for German Jewry, seeing our friends in England, in the ICA, as well as numerous other groups concerned with Jewish affairs abroad. I wish I could tell you something of the struggle that the men at these meetings have gone through, but it would make this letter too long and I don't want to burden you. However, taking into account the maximum funds that may be available this year, they still were faced with large deficits for the essential needs of emigration from Germany, training in and outside of Germany, schooling for large numbers of children in Germany, and the requirements of refugee committees abroad where the refugee problem is acute and must be dealt

with adequately if we are to avoid dangerous complications. This is entirely aside from the problem in Poland and Eastern Europe, which engages our attention daily.

But to return to our situation here. We have no endowment funds. Our letterhead says: "Supported by voluntary contributions". To me the word "voluntary" has perhaps a different and a higher meaning than the word ordinarily conveys. It has been our experience that in many cases of some of the larger contributors who do more than send us checks but who talk to us about the problems, they express not only their willingness but their anxiety to help, and they have also said that they are glad to be in a financial position to help and they are our most welcome "voluntary" subscribers. We have never asked people to tax themselves for more than they are anxious and willing to give. We would, however, have failed in our duty if we had not at times pointed out that in good years an additional contribution on the part of some of the important people not only is welcome and desirable by itself, but it means so much additional help because the example for others is such a great consideration.

I am told that big efforts are being made in Cleveland to reach a considerably larger total through the Welfare Fund than last year. I know of your personal understanding and generosity to all philanthropic undertakings meriting your support. In every important city there are a few who, like yourself, are willing to set the standard and your contribution will go a long way to enable Cleveland to reach their objective. The example of Cleveland's total in our campaigns in other big cities is, of course, of tremendous importance to us.

This is not a circular letter - in fact, it is one of the three letters which I have written this year to any individual away from New York and I have written it only because I feel so strongly convinced that your favorable attitude even beyond that heretofore known to us, would be of tremendous assistance at this every moment.

Dear Phil:

Thanks for your letter of May 20th. I note you ask for a suggestion for future campaigns. Analyzing it as a business man and forgetting for a moment all other points, I know that there is at least \$25,000.00 that the Jewish Welfare Federation could get from the community, if a small percentage would be spent in getting experienced social workers or students to solicit those who are in a position to give more liberally and if the true story were brought to them in an intelligent manner.

While we all work pretty hard during campaigns, you know as well as I that a good many solicitations were made over the telephone, due to lack of time or finding the party out at the first personal call. Since the drive I have come in contact with a good many people whose donations were \$15.00 to \$25.00 and who I know well enough could have given, and would have been willing to give \$100.00, if they had been contacted properly. When I say \$100.00 I am not exaggerating or over-estimating as the quota committee did. I personally know of many cases and every chairman, I am sure, has at least 25 such cases. Let me cite one example:

A concern in my division, through the efforts of Rabbi Silver, pledged \$750.00, which is I believe the right amount for them. In 1935 they gave \$150.00 and last year gave \$500.00, or an increase of \$350.00 over the previous year's contribution. This year they increased their pledge \$250.00 over their previous year's donation. There is another concern whose business I am very well acquainted with, and who is perhaps making more money than the one pledging \$750.00, yet their pledge this year was \$35.00. I know these people very well and I know their circumstances as I do business with them. The owners are sons who inherited the business upon the death of their father. While he was alive he was very charitable. The concern has quite a few traveling Jewish salesman on the road and all are receiving nice salaries, but how can we expect them to make a liberal donation when the owners of the business are getting away with a \$35.00 contribution. This is just one example. I can cite many others.

I would suggest that a list of slackers be made up by each chairman at least a month before the next campaign meeting gets under way. Some experienced social workers, teachers and students ought to be employed to concentrate on these slackers. I can assure you that a good percentage



of these would pledge the right amount. In a good many cases it is not fair for me to call these people slackers. I believe that they were not intelligently approached and the real purpose of the campaign not explained to them.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

A meeting of the Publicity Committee was held today at which time several suggestions were made regarding the 1937 Campaign, which, I think, merits your attention, and I herewith submit them to you for your comment and approval.

MEETINGS:

It was brought out that the pre-campaign solicitation reaches 50% or better of the funds donated, and it was the consensus of opinion of the Committee that a proportionate amount of time, effort, and money be expended to reach the pre-campaign givers before they are committed. We deem it advisable to enthuse the workers, who will solicit the pre-campaign pledges and the donors before the pledges are secured inasmuch as once a pledge is made the likelihood of it being increased is negligible.

We, therefore, suggest that an outstanding speaker be brought to Cleveland to address the meeting, which will be called by Mr. N. L. Dauby of the Advisory Committee and pre-campaign solicitors so that they will be impressed with the importance of their work and stimulated to the greatest possible degree. We understand that the meeting will be a dinner meeting, and we suggest that the meeting be arranged so that the campaign purposes will be dramatically revealed.

We also suggest that a meeting be called for the same evening at one of the hotels and that the thousand biggest givers to the Fund be invited to the meeting. We suggest that the outstanding speaker we secure for Mr. Dauby's meeting be brought down to the Hotel to address later on this larger meeting. We suggest that an outstanding member of the community should issue personal invitations to the meeting and that beer and sandwiches be served.

We suggest that the meetings during the campaign be as follows:

Open Meeting - Sunday night, May 2d.

Week-day Meetings on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.

Closing Meeting, following Tuesday.

We suggest that outstanding speakers be brought to each one of these meetings and that every person be publicized well in advance of the meeting. By this means we feel that the workers will be drawn to the meetings and that they will receive real instruction when they are there.

DIRECT MAIL:

We will, of course, get up a booklet or broadside, which will be ready before the meeting of the Advisory Committee. We expect to feature the catastrophe to the Polish Jews in this broadside and other literature. In addition to this broadside we propose to send out one piece of literature a week to the thousand biggest givers. This will be reprints, which we received from National Agencies to which we contribute, and we propose to imprint on each piece of literature going out in a prominent form the slogan, "What is going to be Your Answer?" If we do not have sufficient attractive reprints available, we propose to mimeograph a news bulletin to send in place of the literature so lacking.

SPEAKERS:

In addition to the excellent speakers working on the Speakers' Bureau last year, we will attempt to secure the services of outstanding personalities in Cleveland, who are good speakers, to address important meetings of individual organizations.

RADIO:

We propose to put on a radio program similar to the dignified program sponsored last year, which met with such favor.
