2. When the plaque will be ready for dedication you will undoubtedly be notified. Should you plan to visit Israel next year, I would naturally like you to dedicate the plaque. If you do not plan to visit Israel, I might ask a good friend who knows me well and plans to visit Israel to partake in the Dedication ceremony.

The pressing demands of the expanded ZOA program have impelled this action for extended or renewed campaigns throughout the country, in accord with the message of President Emanuel Neumann [page 2] calling for "an extraordinary effort in behalf of the AZF, particularly during the coming weeks."

A Spring-Summer campaign has been outlined, a four-pronged activity embracing approaches for both large and small donations and serving the basic needs of the ZOA program in Israel as well as on the American scene.

1 — The 60th Anniversary Journal

An AZF undertaking which demands immediate action by Regions and Districts is the national Journal being published by the ZOA to commemorate sixty years of American Zionism. Titled "The First Sixty Years." the Journal will be issued for the forthcoming national convention. The advertisements and greetings to be inserted in this memorable publication are looked to as a prime source of additional income.

3 — Traditional AZF Functions

Where for any reason it has not been held, Districts are urged to proceed at once with the annual local affair for the American Zionist Fund. This may be a dinner, breakfast, cocktail party, or parlor meeting, as is best suited to the particular local situation. There is still time, even for a dinner, if the approved four-week limit for preparation is observed.

4 - Special Gifts

Individual gifts in the larger amounts are a source of needed income which should not wait on formal campaigning. These may be earmarked if the donor wishes. Alertness to opportunities for substantial individual gifts is called for the year around, but a special effort at this time is urged.

Various phases of these activities are detailed in this REPORTER and in communications sent to ZOA units. The Journal and the Booklet Campaign should be taken up as an immediate order of business at your Executive meeting. All materials and cooperation will be furnished to speed the success of an effort that is in the highest degree vital to the ZOA.

For instance, there is the public relations arm of the ZOA that helps to keep Jewish and non-Jewish supporters informed and ever vigilant for action — whether through forums, radio and TV programs, the press, or many thousands of pieces of literature each year.

There are the Young Zionists, who meet regularly, who can participate in seminars here and in leadership training courses in Israel.

Many Other Services

Then too, there are the Hebrew courses; the giftware from Israel sold through our ZOA Book and Gift Shop, where members receive a twenty percent discount; and the many community services, too varied to list here.

Is all this to be paid for, can it be paid for, out of the ten-dollar dues the average member pays? The District has expenses. The Region has to function. The National Office must initiate, guide, coordinate.

Surely it is not difficult to understand that ZOA membership is a big "bargain" at ten dollars, a bargain which *someone* has to match with another ten dollars, for that is closer to what these services cost.

But, we have not yet taken into account the ZOA Daniel Frisch House and Kfar Silver. Kfar Silver has a building program amounting to more than one million dollars, and both projects have an annual maintenance budget to cover.

We are proud to have these two fine projects in Israel, but now you will surely agree and the budgetary figures plainly show—that thirty dollars per member would be nearer the amount necessary to keep our constantly growing ZOA financially sound.

Since our aim is to enable every Jew to belong to the Zionist movement, we have kept the membership dues down to ten dollars. But the difference must be made up somewhere, and that is the purpose of the American Zionist Fund. We are using a variety of approaches to help us raise this difference. One method is more successful in one place, another works better elsewhere. These different ways are intended to give every volunteer and every contributor a chance to find the level best suited for him. One person may find it most practical to solicit many small contributions, another may prefer to contribute a page in the pending Journal, and still another to endow, or furnish, a building in Kfar Silver.

The main point is to recognize the urgent obligation to provide ZOA with the necessary funds to finance its program. We are confident that our members will wish to use the next few weeks to do their utmost, and we thank them in advance. We know they will not fail the ZOA!

A Footnote to the Dollar Booklet Campaign

The Dollar Booklet campaign, sponsored in the NEC by Moses Torczyner as a medium for popular subscription on a national scale, was a successful pilot project of the Dover, N. J. Zionist District. Spearheaded by Morris Resnick, the idea caught on in his home community and spread. Ellis Goodman introduced it in Camden, and Sol Finkelstein had "shares" printed for the Vineland District.

A Spontaneous Movement

"The selling of 'Dollar Shares' for the benefit of Kfar Silver," says Leopold Frankel, president of the New Jersey Zionist Region, "spread as a spontaneous movement because it gives everyone, even the humblest, a part in our project."

In a move to enlist young people and wives of members in this activity. Sidney Penner, Regional AZF chairman, has called on the other Districts, particularly those in the seaside resorts, to make this their outstanding vacation project.

AZF Strengthens Jewish Life in the U.S.

AZF and Mass Appeal

Kfar Silver Agricultural Training Institute in Israel represents the greatest achievement by any organization in this field in



Israel today. To provide simultaneously for its current maintenance and for the expansion still needed to reach its full capacity of 320 students is a task that is straining our resources to the utmost.

Our Organization has always been representative of the Jewish masses. Except for a short period of time between 1946-48, we have never received much support from the rich of American Jewry. In the bestowing of honors we could not compete with other organizations, and certainly not with the State of Israel itself. What we had to offer was our devotion and our daily effort, consistent and uninterrupted, against all manner of obstacles. One of the obstacles was and continues to be the astonishing fact that the Zionist Organization of America alone is not permitted by the Jewish Agency to conduct an official major campaign for funds.

Kfar Silver Building Program

In spite of all the difficulties put in our way for reasons which are no longer secret, we have succeeded in building the ZOA Daniel Frisch House in Tel Aviv, and Kfar Silver near Ashkelon. We have succeeded in financing all other activities — public relations, education, youth, etc. While maintenance of our two large projects in Israel can be taken care of within the regular budget, the completion of Kfar Silver however requires a capital outlay of over one million dollars. It is to raise this amount in the months ahead that we turn to you with our Booklet Campaign today.

Our attractive booklet contains 18 contribution slips at one dollar each. We believe it possible to enlist 10,000 of our most active members who will carry booklets with them daily for a few months to come, and succeed in selling at least one slip a day. That would result in a monthly sale of over \$300,000. I cannot conceive that any business or social acquaintance will refuse to contribute one dollar. I am convinced, rather, that more than the minimum I have indicated can be sold at meetings, in door-to-door campaigns, at resort places during the coming vacation period, and the like.

Awards Offered

We have set aside valuable prizes to be awarded to the individuals and Regions for outstanding work. Each booklet gives the details. Here I only want to point out to every one of our members that this campaign can lift our financial burden and enable us to complete Kfar Silver in the very near future. Success is within our reach

How to Use the Dollar Booklets for 'Building Kfar Silver in 1958'

In each of the Dollar Booklets, there are 18 contribution slips. The Hebrew number 18 also spells *Chai*, life. These booklets of one-dollar contributions multiplied by thousands in the hands of members can *spell life*—to the 320 youngsters who will be trained in modern agriculture at Kfar Silver, and to the barren stretches in Israel that they will make green and productive again.

Anyone can dispose of a booklet, or five or ten. The only secret about it is to have a booklet with you at all times and to invite everyone you meet to donate. Virtually no one will refuse a gift of one dollar to help a boy or girl in Israel become — as Kfar Silver's motto puts it — "a good citizen and a good farmer."

Deadline August 15

What is needed mainly in the District is a committee to get as wide a distribution of the booklets as possible and to push them vigorously. This is an activity that can keep on going right up to the deadline on August 15. At meetings, booklets should be available for distribution and solicitation should take place. Women, Young Judaeans, and Young Zionist groups can serve with special

and depends entirely on our sincere cooperation and effort.

I would like to conclude with a short reference to a parable in the history of our people: After the exodus from Egypt and Mount Sinai, Moses appealed to the people to bring their donations to build the Mishkan. We are told that the poor people turned in all their valuables, whereas the rich ones preferred to "wait and see." The Mishkan was built with the contributions of the masses right then and there.

effectiveness in street and door-to-door solicitation. Public affairs and home gatherings offer good opportunities for solicitation. Parlor meetings held for the purpose can furnish not only givers but solicitors. People going on visits or vacation should be enlisted and kept well supplied with booklets. Vacation hotels should be visited — often!

The dollar booklets are for the 'little fellow,' but the results can be big. A substantial sum raised by a Region or District may be designated for a specific purpose in Kfar Silver, subject to agreement. Also, the Region will get 20 percent of the moneys it raises, for its own treasury.

One of Four AZF Methods

Needless to say, a prospect for the Journal or for a sizeable contribution should be solicited for *that* instead of a dollar gift. The dollar booklet is part of a four-fold campaign procedure. The exercise of judgment as to the proper approach is assumed.

Completion of its construction program will enable Kfar Silver to increase its student body from its present enrollment of 108 to the planned capacity of 320. That is a compelling reason for pressing completion as soon as possible. But there's another reason too: Building costs rise each year. The sooner the construction program is finished, the less will be the total cost—and the greater will be the benefits for Israel's future.

Attractive awards are offered for the largest producers. The first prize is a free trip to Israel for two, and there are other valuable prizes, listed in each booklet. But your Committee appreciates that the greatest incentive which can be held out to Zionists is the *tremendous significance* of the project itself.

Prospects for Big Gifts Call for The Right Personal Approach

Experience has shown that of all the fundraising methods it is the individual visit, the face-to-face approach, that gets the largest contributions.

A prospect for a big donation must be "worked on" by a friend, a business associate, or a small committee. He has to be convinced of the importance of ZOA's work and the need for him to give a major contribution. He may have to be seen several times, but one good prospect may well give as much as the rest of a Region.

Every Region has such prospects who will respond if approached by the right person or persons and with the right "sales" talk.

In addition to contributions of which an annual "repeat" can be expected, or at least hoped for, there are the large gifts for specific purposes which in certain circumstances have the most appeal for individuals or

groups. A number such have been published in past issues of the Reporter. Among those current is the endowment by the Kaufman family, announced on page 3. Another is the project of the Connecticut Zionist Region to erect a synagogue at Kfar Silver in memory of Elias Polis, president of the Region, and his wife, Rebecca Polis.

The national committee for special gifts, in formation, is listed on page 4. Its personnel should be supplemented in each Region by the most influential members who will lend themselves to this work which has so great a potential. This should not be restricted to the campaign period, but should go on through the year. However, a special effort is urged, to begin immediately and to continue for the rest of this season.

The Personal Touch Is All-Important

The telephone rings, your secretary answers, and tells you that your friend Charlie wants to talk to you.

You immediately pick up the receiver and start chatting with him. You have known Charlie for years and you are glad to speak to him.

Now Charlie turns the conversation to the ZOA: He is collecting for the American Zionist Fund; won't you please make a contribution too?

Well, you cannot turn Charlie down. Besides, if he considers the cause deserving, that is good enough for you and so you make your contribution and give the ZOA your full support.

A visit or a personal letter from Charlie, or from any other friend of yours, would have resulted in the same reaction.

But — a stranger, an impersonal letter, would have had much less chance of success.




