My dear Rabbi Silver:

President Roosevelt has promised to help the united welfare forces of the country raise sufficient funds to carry on their indispensable services in American communities. Mr. Newton D. Baker has again accepted the national chairmanship of these forces to be known as the 1933 Mobilization for Human Needs. The thirty-three leading welfare organizations of the country have asked Community Chests and Councils, Inc. to direct and administer the Mobilization. As president of the association may I ask you to serve as a member of the National Citizens Committee of the Mobilization under Mr. Baker as chairman?


This committee itself will be a uniting of national leadership throughout the country to organize and sponsor this fundamental undertaking. As the President's and Mr. Baker's participation indicates, social welfare services require this year the strongest possible influences and support in order to maintain their essential contributions to our American civilization. The provision of hundreds of millions of government funds for material relief does not diminish but emphasizes the need for hospitals, nursing, child welfare, family care, and guidance and occupation of youth. Yet it will be more difficult both to persuade the public of these coordinate needs and for the public to provide adequate support.

These facts are the reason for this mobilization. It does not raise money but provides a barrage of national information and influence to back up the local storm troops that must secure the contributions. We have at our disposal all the great national channels of publicity, radio, press, advertising and platform. The funds for utilization of these facilities are provided by the communities themselves. You are asked to help furnish adequate auspices and leadership for the messages of increased and imperative need.

There will be but one meeting of the Committee and that in connection with the National Mobilization Conference to be held at Washington on September 15th. The President has invited the conference to hold its first session at the White House and will address community leaders from throughout the nation on their responsibility for meeting the indispensable human needs of their cities.

Will you not agree to serve on this National Citizens Committee and so strengthen and encourage the preeminent leadership that has already volunteered?
