

The Jewish delegation from the Soviet Union will be welcomed at a mass reception Thursday evening, July 8th at the Polo Grounds. This will be the first public appearance of the delegation.

It is the consensus of our committee that you more than anybody else would be the ideal spokesman for the National Jewish groups in this country. Other speakers invited to address this welcome reception: Secretary Harold L. Ickes, Madame I. Litvinoff, Mayor La Guardia, and Governor H. Lehman.

We feel that your participation in this first contact between the Jewish delegation of the Soviet Union and the Jews of this country would symbolize the desire on the part of American Jewery to build better and stronger ties of friendship with their Jewish brethern in the USSR.

We would deeply appreciate your decision at the earliest possible moment since the time is very short for so tremendous an undertaking.

My dear Mr. Brainin: In reply to your telegram permit me to send you the following message for the Souvenir Book: "I am happy to join the many friends of the Soviet Union in this country in welcoming Professor Solomon Michoels and Itzik Ferrer who have come here at an opportune time to bring greatings from our magnificent and heroic Ally, the Russian people, and to receive from us not only our expressions of profound admiration but our high hopes that our two great peoples may continue to work not only for victory in war, but for an enduring peace and a better world in the years which will follow the war. "The Jews of America are particularly proud of the way in which the Jews of Russia have fought against the barbarous Fascist hordes, and together with their fellow citizens have checked the cursed blight of Europe. We salute them through their distinguished emissaries who are visiting our shores, and we should like to convey through them our hopes that closer contacts may be established in the future between the Jews of the Soviet Union and those of the United States." Dear Rabbi Silver:

As you may know, a delegation from the Soviet Union has just arrived on our shores. Professor Solomon Michoels, President of the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee of USSR and Director of the Jewish State Theater in Moscow, and Lieutenant Colonel Itsik Feffer, noted Jewish poet, are the two guests.

Professor Michoels and Colonel Feffer are here to bring to the American people in general and to the American Jewish community in particular a first-hand account of the progress of the war in their country, and of the role the Jews of the Soviet Union are playing in it. In view of the renewed offensive on the Russo-German front, their visit is especially timely.

Professor Michoels and Colonel Feffer will be in Cleveland on Tuesday, July twenty-seventh. We should deeply appreciate your joining with us as members of the Cleveland Reception Committee to help make the visit of the delegation of our fighting Russian ally an impressive one. We are enclosing a card for your reply, but since time is short, we shall assume your acceptance if we do not hear from you to the contrary by July 22nd.

The program for the delegation includes a meeting at the Masonic Auditorium, 3615 Euclid Avenue, on Tuesday, July twenty-seventh, at 8:00 P.M., at which the speakers will include the two guests. as well as Mayor Frank J. Lausche and Mr. Edward J. Blythin. Complimentary reserved seat tickets are enclosed.
