Dear Rabbi Silver:

I would like to have you serve as a member of the Citizens Narcotics Advisory Committee of your county which I am organizing. John C. Baker, President of Ohio University, will serve as General Chairman. Governor Frank J. Lausche will serve as Honorary Chairman.

It is my intention to present to this Committee the results of our narcotics investigation in Ohio and to seek your advice in formulating legislation to be presented to the next General Assembly, which meets in January, 1955. Once a legislative program has been drafted and agreed upon, I want to enlist your support to accomplish the enactment of this program. The legislation will be designed to meet the threat posed by the growing illicit drug traffic and its toll in human misery.
