My dear Rabbi Silver:

You will be interested, I know in a beautiful plan which has been suggested by Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper, our Governor's wife. The plan would place in the Governor's mansion an Ohioania library, comprising the best books of Ohio writers in the fields of education, philosophy, history, science, finance, fiction, biography, art, music, poetry and drama.

It is the wish of Mrs. Cooper to place in this collection only those books which merit recognition and which contribute to the education, the culture and the beauty of our state.

In order to insure only the best for the library Mrs. Cooper desires that a committee, composed of recognized authorities in each field of writing assist her in the plans and selection. Mrs. Cooper would very much like to have you serve on this committee, representing the field of Hebrew Literature.

The work will be planned so that it need not take very much of your time. No doubt one meeting of the committee will be all that will be necessary, at which time a few general rules and plans may be considered. In most cases books relating to your particular field may be sent you for your opinion.

To have in the Governor's mansion a library featuring Ohio's authors is most inspiring and establishes a precedent in the recognition of writers and their books.

May I have your prompt and favorable answer to Mrs. Cooper's request that you serve on this important committee?

MINUTES

OF THE FIRST CALLED MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE  
SELECTED TO ORGANIZE AND ESTABLISH THE  
"OHIANA LIBRARY"  
IN THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION, COLUMBUS, OHIO,  
SATURDAY AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 5, 1929.

MRS. MYERS Y. COOPER,

HOSTESS

---

The meeting was called to order by Mrs. Depew Head of the Ohio State Library, who had been conferred with and delegated by Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper to interest and obtain the active cooperation of leaders in the various arts and sciences, in order to establish an Ohioana Library in the Governor's Mansion.

Present were: Mrs. E. B. Taylor, Mr. Merton L. Ferson, Dr. Carl A. Hamann, Dr. C. G. Williams, Dr. Ben Arneson, Dr. W. O. Thompson, Prof. Albert Algernon Atkinson, Mr. C. B. Galbreath, Mrs. Clara Keck Heflebower, Dr. Spurgeon Bell, Mr. Warren F. Perry, Rev. H. F. Brockman, Mrs. Depew Head and Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper.

Dr. Merton L. Ferson offered the motion to make Mrs. Head chairman of the meeting. Dr. Ben Arneson seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried. Mrs. Clara Keck Heflebower was appointed recording secretary.

Dr. W. O. Thompson, who was scheduled to appear at the dedication exercises of the Campbell State Park and could remain but an hour, was first called upon for suggestions. Dr. Thompson presented the plan to have the "Ohioana" a valuable collection of Gubernatorial Administration data which would be of distinctive service to the Governor, and all succeeding governors, who would in turn take patriotic pride in its further development, and which in years to come, would have a tradition of its own. This to include the Administrative History of the early Governors of Ohio - the Supreme Court and members of Congress. Not necessarily a duplication of what is found in State and other libraries. Also autographed volumes which might be of rare value.

Each member present was requested to express his or her idea what should be the scope of the library and how to proceed with the selection of the books of Ohio authors.

Mrs. C. B. Galbreath suggested to include valuable printed pamphlets, which might be bound and included in the collection.

Mrs. Head explained that it was Mrs. Cooper's idea to include all Ohio writers of historical works, novelists, playwrights, poets, musicians, books on sculpture, architecture, artists, etc.

Dr. Carl A. Hamann expressed the opinion that the breadth and scope would grow beyond the expectation of the promoters of the project.

Mrs. E. B. Taylor, who has been for several years compiling a list of Ohio writers, reported a list of about 500 writers, not all prominent writers - but indicate stages of progress in Ohio's development.

Dr. Merton L. Ferson inquired about law books, which have no particular literary value, but which are essential in practice -- and where to draw the line in this division.

Mr. C. B. Galbreath mentioned a very informal paper on literary women - "Centennial of 1903"; also several of Senator Foraker's addresses.

Dr. Spurgeon Bell suggested that technical matters and text books be eliminated unless of distinctive value. Not everything that had been written along this line to be included.

Mrs. Head explained that the General Public has no conception or knowledge of who the Ohio authors are, and what they have written, and that Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper's plan was to install a library in the Governor's Mansion which would preserve and promote the works of Ohio authors for their own prestige, as well as to acquaint people who are interested and those who call at the Mansion, with these achievements.

Rev. H. F. Brockman, observed that text books and technical books be eliminated; that this committee present would have to determine which were the distinctive books in each field. Culture, literature, poetry - as well as political and of educational value.

Dr. Arneson suggested that the ideas proposed particularly the one by Dr. Thompson for a library especially for governors - the ideas of others of the committee -- for books that would interest the General Public, should dovetail and be collected in this Chicana Library.

Dr. Ferson agreed with Dr. Arneson.

Mrs. Hefflebower proposed, that as it was Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper's idea to establish this "Chicana", - the library be named "The Martha Kinney Cooper Chicana Library" in honor of Mrs. Cooper.

Mrs. Head spoke at length on the fitness of the title, and the happiness of the committee to have the privilege to name the Library after the First Lady of Ohio -- this over the objections raised by Mrs. Cooper - who, with her usual modesty, wished to eliminate herself.

All members present upheld Mrs. Head's opinion, and voiced their hearty approval of the procedure.

Rev. Brockman made the motion seconded by Dr. Arneson, to call this collection in the Governor's Mansion - "The Martha Kinney Cooper Chicana Library".

Dr. C. G. Williams suggested we make a mistake to procure a library for a Governor. Most Governors choose their own library. If we wish an Chicana Library we should include all Ohio writers.

Dr. Warren F. Perry remarked that it would be limited in scope and usefulness if made a special library of use only to the Governors.

Mrs. Head reiterated that it should be made a collection of books of value for future generations.

Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper requested that a list of scientific and text books with authors' names and titles of volumes be included.

Dr. Spurgeon Bell suggested that books not only by Ohio authors, but by authors who have written valuable books on Ohio be included.

Discussion.

Mrs. E. B. Taylor reported that we have pioneer writers who were not Ohio born, but who settled here years ago, and who have contributed outstanding information of those days. Also that many people do not know that Albert Beveridge was born in Ohio as his mature years were spent in Indiana, and Hugh Bancroft also was an Ohioan.

Prof. Atkinson proposed not to exclude books written by others (not of Ohio) about Ohio and Ohio persons.

Rev. Brockman made the motion, seconded by Mrs. Taylor, that authors be listed and names of publications -- these to be card catalogued, and a list compiled.

Motion carried.

Dr. Hamann said: "Appoint a committee and go show"

Mrs. Head announced that this committee assembled - represented the various fields -- that they were authorities in their respective fields and should decide which books be included.

Mrs. Taylor offered for use of the committee the files of the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs - authors' list, which she had compiled to date.

Dr. Bell made the motion that we consider the Chicana Library a collection of outstanding books of all Ohio writers and distinguished books about Ohio.

Motion seconded by Dr. Arneson.  
Motion carried.

Discussion proceeded - and decided to postpone until a later date the number of books of authors - and fields of achievement. Mrs. Head suggested that the Library have a book plate, and that Dr. Henry Turner Bailey of the Cleveland School of Art be asked to design this book plate.

Mrs. Heflebower made the motion seconded by Dr. Williams that book plate be arranged for.

Motion carried.

Dr. Bell opened discussion about books on Ohio writers. He made motion to limit, and center the attention of the committee the first year to books only of Ohio writers.

Dr. Arneson seconded the motion,  
Motion carried.

Mrs. Taylor made motion to secure separate lists of authors born in Ohio, and those who lived and worked in Ohio.

Rev. Brockman Seconded the motion.  
Motion carried.

Dr. Bell moved to have general plan set forth to place publicity in an official leaflet available to all members of the committee.

Publicity leaflets might be printed by the University Press.

Dr. Person seconded the motion,  
Motion carried.

Mrs. Head announced that she would send mimeographed lists of committee members' names and addresses, to each member. Also stated what assistance the State Library would contribute to this project of the Chicana Library.

Dr. Arneson moved, seconded by Dr. Perry that Mrs. Head be appointed chairman of the Publicity Committee - with Dr. Bell and a third member to be chosen by them.

Dr. Hamann arose to have "duties clearly defined".

Mrs. Head suggested that one of the duties of the committee was to acquaint their own organizations what the Chicana Library is to be. To secure publicity in their own home town and to reach kindred groups. Have writers send in their books. "When the living writers hear of this library - we will hear from them." Secure all the books of value possible; send in lists and check preferences.

Resolutions passed:

1. To send Mrs. Taylor's list, mimeographed to each member.
  - a. Each member of committee to check those books in his field which he thinks worthy of a place in Chicana Library.
2. To send Publicity leaflets to each committee member.
3. To send in book lists to Mrs. Head - of books in own particular field and indicate choice.
4. To secure as many books as possible.
5. To secure books from authors.
6. " " " publishers.
7. " " " that may cost larger sums through the cooperation of city or state organizations, who from civic pride will assist in covering the expenses, in order to place it in this Chicana Library in the Governor's Mansion.

Mrs. Taylor made the motion that chairman appoint an executive committee to take up emergency matters. The chairman to be a member of said committee.

Dr. Arneson seconded the motion.  
Motion carried.

Next meeting at call of the chairman, Mrs. Head - or about a year from this date.

Meeting was adjourned, after which a light luncheon was served by Mrs. Myers Y. Cooper.

My dear Rabbi Silver:

Under separate cover we are sending you some publicity leaflets in re to The Ohioana Library, which Dr. Spurgeon Bell and I prepared. We hope these may be of value to you in interesting publishers, writers and organizations in The Ohioana Library.

We have been busy preparing a card index of Ohio writers and it has been some task. Almost 2000 names have been sent to us - 672 of these we have checked to date with their books. We hope to check up on the balance during this next month.

You will remember that we promised to send you a mimeographed copy of all Ohio writers compiled. With such a large number as we now have that hardly seems feasible at this time, when there is so much other work to be done. Perhaps a little later we can do so, if The Committee feels that such a list will be of value.

We shall be very glad to send you any information or any particular list of writers which you may desire.

Mrs. Cooper is very desirous of having a good sized unit of this Library established in the Governor's Mansion by April. To that end we are asking you to help in every way possible.

First. We should like for you to send us a list of all writers in your particular field, of whom you know that we can rightly claim for our Ohioana Library, giving us the names of their books - data in regards to them - etc.

Second. We are asking you to write to the authors or publishers of the books you list, tell them about our Ohioana Library and ask them to send one or two of the best books of each writer listed.


Third. If you know of Ohio writers not in your particular field, will you not try to interest them in the Ohioana Library?

We are finding splendid interest and cooperation on the part of writers and publishers that we have approached, and have received to date a very interesting, varied and worthwhile collection.

We are very proud to find that most of the men and women on our Ohioana Committee are writers themselves, and we hope to receive very soon the books of all the members of our Ohioana Committee. Please do not let your modesty delay you in sending your own books - and soon.

If you are in Columbus any time I hope you can find a few minutes to drop in at my desk and talk over our plans. My desk is in The Legislative Reference Library - across from the office of The Secretary of State.





My dear Rabbi Silver:-

The Martha Kinney Cooper Ohioana library inaugurates this year the plan of presenting awards at the annual meeting in October, for the best book in fiction and non-fiction, written by Ohioans in the year preceding the meeting. In other words the books published in 1942 will be judged this year.

The awards will be ceramic medallions designed by the Department of Fine Arts of Ohio State University.

Dr. Leland J. Gordon of Dennison University and Walter Havighurst of Miami University are being asked to serve with you. We should have your decisions by September first.


May I have your answer as to whether you can serve very soon as I have to be away most of July and want to complete plans before I go. Trusting that your answer will be yes--
