Dear Dr. Silver:

It is my great pleasure to inform you hereby that the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Annual National Service Award has been bestowed upon you for the year 1948.

Each year our Fraternity presents this Award to the Jew or Jewess, who, in our opinion, has made an outstanding and exemplary contribution to the essential Jewish life of America. Indicative indeed of the true character and distinction of our Award is the roll of recipients of previous years: Miss Henrietta Szold, Rev. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. Cyrus Adler, Rev. Dr. Jonah B. Wise, Justice Felix Frankfurter, Dr. Albert Einstein, Mr. Lucius Littauer, Hon. Herbert H. Lehman, Henry Monsky, Esq., Mr. Louis Ginzberg, Hon. Samuel I. Rosenman, Hon. Bernard M. Baruch, Rev. Dr. Julian Morgenstern and Dr. Abram Leon Sachar.

I would have preferred, of course, to present this matter to you in person, and to enjoy the opportunity for discussion and exchange of views, but I trust you will realize that the elements of time and distance make it impracticable to do so. With your kind indulgence, therefore, I shall attempt to give you as adequate an explanation as is possible through the necessary medium of this communication.

Phi Epsilon Pi is an undergraduate Greek letter college fraternity, organized in 1904 and having a membership of approximately 8000 men in both undergraduate and alumni ranks. Undergraduate Chapters are established at thirty-three of the leading universities and colleges throughout the country. Alumni Associations are organized in thirty-two cities and communities from coast to coast. It will be of interest to you, I am sure, to know that we had an Undergraduate Chapter some years ago at the University of Cincinnati, from whose ranks a number of our members eventually matriculated at Hebrew Union College and are today occupying important pulpits in various parts of the country.

While our function may be termed as "social", (as distinguished from so-called "professional" fraternities) we pride ourselves on our

national "wider scope" program, which has pointed its efforts towards the greater development of a sense of regard and responsibility among our members, both undergraduate and graduate, for the achievement of the loftiest principles of learning and culture of the university institution itself, and for a broader and more universal understanding of Jewish consciousness translated into thought and action as members of the Jewish community.

In accepting our Award may we say, with complete sincerity, that you will be conferring a great honor upon us, and, in the light of our abovementioned program, your praiseworthy career will be an inspiration to our membership as a whole and to our undergraduate body in particular.

The Committee, which selected you for the Award this year, is composed of Mr. Jesse Acker of New York, Rev. Dr. Stanley R. Brav of Cincinnati, Mr. Philip S. Eisendrath of Los Angeles, Mr. Theodore T. Shafton of Chicago and the writer, acting as Chairman.

The Award for 1948, as per custom, will be announced formally on the occasion of the Annual Banquet of the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Grand Convention which will be held on the evening of December 30, 1948 at Hotel Carter in Cleveland, Ohio. If it is at all possible, we would be indeed greatly honored by your personal attendance at the Banquet, so that we might be able to present you with the scroll of the Award at the very same time that first public announcement is made. However, if it is too inconvenient for you to be present at the Banquet, we will be very happy to make formal presentation of the Award to you at a later date, the time and place, as well as the nature of the ceremony to be entirely in keeping with your own tastes and desires. On the other hand, if you can and will attend the Banquet, and so advise, we will communicate with you further and arrange for all the details incident thereto.

Because our Award has always been subject, of course, to the affirmative acceptance of the recipient, we will appreciate your advice, and in view of the fact that only about a month remains before public announcement will be made, we hope we may hear from you with the least

My dear Mr. Fushan:

Your letter of November 30th addressed to Mr. Harry Levy has been turned over to me for reply.

Dr. Silver was born in Lithuania in 1893. He received his A.B. from the University of Cincinnati in 1915 when he was simultaneously graduated from Hebrew Union College. In 1925 he received his D.D. from the Hebrew Union College, and in 1938, his Litt. D. from Western Reserve University.

Dr. Silver was rabbi of a congregation in Wheeling, West Virginia, from 1915 to 1917. In 1917, at the age of 2h, Dr. Silver became the rabbi of The Temple in Cleveland, the largest liberal synagogue in America.

Dr. Silver served as university preacher at Harvard, Cornell, University of Chicago, Syracuse, and Purdue. In 1919 he was decorated by the French government. He is the author of "Messianic Speculations in Israel", "Religion in a Changing World", and "Democratic Impulse in Jewish History".

Dr. Silver is married and has two sons - Raphael David, a junior at Harvard University, and Daniel Jeremy, a student at the Hebrew Union College.

He is at present Chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency and of the American Zionist Emergency Council.

I hope that this information will serve your purpose. I am enclosing two glossy prints of Dr. Silver which I shall appreciate your returning to me. The local newspapers all have cuts of Dr. Silver.



#### OF THE COMMITTEE OF JUDGES ON THE

PHI EPSILOE PI FRATEREITY 1948 ANEUAL NATIONAL SERVICE AWARD

To: The 1948 Grand Convention Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Hotel Carter Cleveland, Ohio December 30, 1948

Since the inception of the inter it 1935, our National Service Awards achievement of have each year discerned and recognized the true XXXXXXXX greatness in individuals of the American - Jewish community, who by their deeds have made vital, outstanding and exemplary contributions to the welfare and progress of the Jewish Community itself. Further, we have maintained that such interest in the well-being of the Jewish Community goes hand in hand with loyalty to country and with the responsibility of good American citizenship in its truest sense. The cuality of

Greatness may be found on both sides of religious, social, scientific or political thought, and Phi Epsilon Pi has only concerned itself with the intrinsic and essential values of individual stature, looking beyond disputed and mooted enuses for which the individual may champion one side or the other. The distinguished recipients of our Award have, for these past thirteen years, provided clear evidence of the flexibility of our humble judgment of individual greatness as it exists in our American - Jewish community. Let me put it in another way. Greatness in human stature may at times conform to pattern, but happily and more frequently it will black new and unfamiliar trails. Great men are therefore, in many instances, controversial figures, pioneering in new thoughts and objectives and pushing forward to new and larger horizons. Phi Epsile, Pi, I am happy to state, has expressed the true significances of its Annual National Service Award with an attitude of strict impartiality, and by adjudging the recipients solely or the yardstick of their influence for good, and their impiring testarship on the American -Jewish scene.

For the year 1948, Phi basilon Pi has selected a man who has captured the imagination of het only the American - Jewish Community, but of Jews and non-Jews throughout the world. #### NOT TO BE RELEASED BEFORE 10:00 P. M. (EST), DECEMBER 30TH, 1948

Cleveland, Ohio, Dec. 30. Rev. Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, former president of the Zionist Organization of America, was tonight named as the recipient of the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity's National Service Award for 1948.

The award is presented each year to the Jew who has made "the finest contribution to the essential Jewish life of America."

Presentation of the award, which is gymbolized by a suitably inscribed plaque, was made at the annual convention banquet of the Fraternity at the Carter Hotel here tonight. In accordance with the Fraternity's tradition, the name of the recipient of the award had been kept secret until the actual presentation.

The plaque was presented to Dr. Silver by I. F. Freiberger, chairman of the board of directors of the Cleveland Trust Company and a member of Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity.

Dr. Silver's address of acceptance was broadcast over a coast-to-coast radio hookup of the Mutual Broadcasting System.

Other speakers at the convention banquet were Thomas A. Burke, Mayor of Cleveland, and Bill Veeck, manager and part-owner of the world's champions Cleveland Indians. The 44th annual convention of the Fraternity opened at the Carter Hotel yesterday. Representatives of 33 active collegiate chapters and 32 alumni associations were in attendance.

The National Service Award was presented to Dr. Silver for his constant and unselfish activities in behalf of his fellow Jews throughout the world. A graduate of the Hebrew Union College in 1915, the Lithuanian-born rabbi simultane neously received his A. B. degree from the University of Cincinnati.

The fifth in a line of rabbis in his family, Dr. Silver's first pulpit assignment, immediately following his ordination, was to a congregation in Wheeling, West Virginia.

He served abroad in World War I at the request of the French and American governments, and in 1919 he was decorated with the order of "Officer de l'Instruction Publique" by the French government.

In 1917, Dr. Silver became the rabbi of The Temple in Cleveland, the largest liberal synagogue in America. He has occupied its pulpit ever since, and under his rabbinate, The Temple has become one of the foremost Jewish congregations in the world.

In 1925, he received his Doctorate of Divinity (D.D.) from the Hebrew Union College and in 1938 the degree of Doctor of Letters (Litt.D.) was conferred on him by Western Reserve University.

In 1939 he held the post of Dudleian Lecturer at Harvard University, and at various times Dr. Silver has served as university preacher at Harvard, Cornell, Chicago, Syracuse and Purdue Universities.

The publication of his book, "Messianic Speculations in Israel," in 1927 earned for Dr. Silver the highest recognition in the field of theological scholarship. His later works, including "Religion in a Changing World" and "Democratic Impulse in Jewish History" have won for him an important place in theological literature.

Dr. Silver is best known in Jewish life, however, as a leader in the Zionist movement. He did not adopt Zionism; he has grown up in it. He has devoted his entire life to the exercise of that leadership. For at least two decades, he has been the central figure in American-Jewish effort for the reconstruction of Palestine. One of the most outstanding orators in America, he has been probably the most articulate of American exponents of the Jewish Common-

wealth cause. He helped build an appreciation of Zionism and Palestinic Hebrew culture among his colleagues in the reform rabbinate and he helped also to integrate a respect for Zionism into American life.

A past president of the Zionist Organization of America and still one of its greatest spiritual forces, Dr. Silver has also served as the national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal and has held the post of national cochairman of the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees, Overseas Needs and Palestine. He also served as a member of the Near East Relief Committee.

Dr. Silver is presently the chairman of the American Section of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council.

Despite his many duties and obligations to the Zionist movement and its related projects, Dr. Silver has always managed to devote much time and effort to the betterment of the social conditions of his own community. These activities are many and varied, but illustrative of this side of his remarkable personality and vigor it is appropriate to mention that he is a member of the Executive Board of the Larger Regional Government of Cleveland and a member of the Consumer's League of Ohio.

Dr. Silver is married and has two sons, Raphael D., a junior at Harvard University, and Daniel J., a student at Hebrew Union College.



#### (INTRODUCTION BY ANNOUNCER)

This broadcast is coming to you over from the Hotel Carter in the city of Cleveland where delegates and guests attending the forty-fourth Annual Grand Convention of the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity are gathered at a Banquet in honor of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver. Dr. Silver is to be presented this evening with the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Annual National Service Award for the year 1948. Announcement of the Award is to be made by Mr. I. F. Freiberger, one of the leading citizens of the City of Cleveland, Chairman of the Board of the Cleveland Trust Company, and prominent member of the Fraternity ----- Mr. Freiberger.

#### (INTRODUCTION OF DR. SILVER BY MR. FREIBERGER)

Gentlemen of Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity, assembled in Grand Convention here in the City of Cleveland, Ohio -- and Ladies and Gentlemen of our radio audience:

To me has been assigned the welcome task and privilege to announce, on behalf of Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity, -- founded in 1904, with undergraduate chapters established at thirty-three of America's leading universities and a host of Alumni Associations organized in cities and communities from coast to coast, -- the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Annual National Service Award for 1948.

The Committee on the Award has, for the year 1948, selected for this honor and distinction none other than the eminent American rabbi and Jewish scholar, and the foremost exponent of the Jewish Commonwealth cause in America, and perhaps throughout the world: Rev. Dr. Abba Hillel Silver!

(APPLAUSE)

Beginning with 1935, Phi Epsilon Pi has each year bestowed this recognition upon the Jew or Jewess, who in its considered opinion and judgement, has made an outstanding and exemplary contribution to the essential Jewish life of America. In making these annual awards, it is interesting to observe that no steriotyped pattern has been followed. In fact all walks of life and fields of human endeavor have been explored and rewarded. For example, let me name the recipients of the Award in previous years: Miss Henrietta Szold, Rev. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. Cyrus Adler, Rev. Dr. Jonah B. Wise, Justice Felix Frankfurter, Dr. Albert Einstein, Mr. Lucius Littauer, Hon. Herbert H. Lehman, Henry Monsky, Esq., Mr. Louis Ginzberg, Hon. Samuel I. Rosenman, Hon. Bernard M. Baruch, Rev. Dr. Julian Morgenstern and Dr. Abram Leon Sachar.

To this distinguished company of former recipients of the Award the addition of Dr. Silver's illustrious career and record of achievement is indeed fitting, harmonious, and complimentary. Dr. Silver's

outstanding accomplishments are far too well known to require detailed enumeration here. Suffice it to say that his unbounded and fully demonstrated capacity for leadership in the Jewish pulpit, in Jewish culture and theological scholarship, in American-Jewish community affairs, in the American-Jewish effort for the reconstruction of Palestine, in the good fight for international recognition of the State of Israel, in the social progress of our public school system and in the welfare of community life in general for Americans of all faiths and national origins, -- yes, his inspiring leadership in so many enobling and humanitarian causes has stamped Dr. Silver as one of the truly great figures of our times.

At fifty-six, Dr. Silver still gives the impression of youth. His fighting spirit is young. His impact upon American Jewish life and the American community in general is the impact of youth. Moreover, underlying all, Dr. Silver is always a man of God! Despite his tremendous devotion to practical and material tasks, he has never permitted the "life of the hour" to destroy, for him and for the many who bask in the sun of his warm influence, "the life of eternity". In his own phrasing, he never suffers "the timely" to erase "the timeless".

We are happy with and honored by his presence here tonight to accept our humble tribute to his remarkable achievements. To you, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, I now present this engraved Certificate emblematic of the Phi Epsilon Pi Fraternity Annual National Service Award for the year 1948, and with it this modest honorarium which we know you will be delighted to present to the charity or project nearest your heart ----Dr. Silver. 
