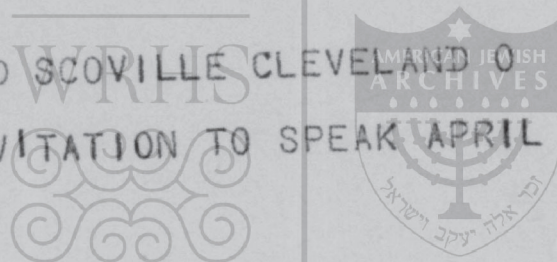

Thanking you for your courtesy and assuring you of a hearty welcome from the members of my congregation, I remain

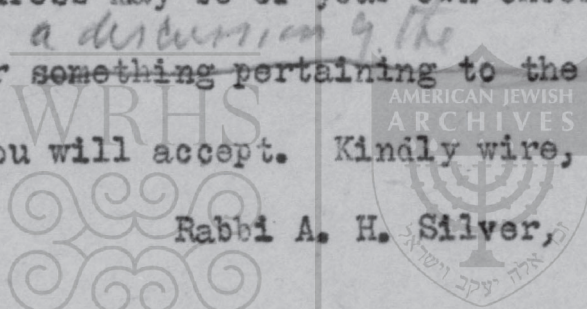

My dear Rabbi Silver:-


Your favor 31st ult.
