Honorable Sir:-

The Cleveland Jewish community will hold a mass protest meeting on Monday evening, May 9th at eight o'clock to voice the sentiments of Cleveland Jewry against the suspension of Jewish immigration into Palestine.

The rights of the Jews under the Palestinian Mandate are seriously jeepardised by this act of the British Government which is dictated not by the economic situation in the country but by political considerations entirely.

The tremendous investments of life, labor and substance which the Jews have made in Palestine in recent years are being endangered by the present policy of the British Government and the Jews of the world are everywhere protesting.

I would appreciate very much if you would join with us on Monday evening in registering your sympathy with our just cause.

CLEVELAND JEWRY TO PROTEST SUSPENSION OF IMMIGRATION INTO PALESTINE

A city-wide prot st against suspension of immigration into Palestine will be held Monday evening, June 9th at the Jewish Center.

The order which prohibits the entrance into Palestine of thousands of Jewish settlers previously granted permission to enter, is being interpreted by the Jews of the world as an act endangering the Jewish Homeland of Palestine and as a gross interference with the rights of the Jews guaranteed by the Palestinian Mandate. This action has arroused the indignation and evoked the profound concern of the Jewish people throughout the world. To millions of Jews this decision seems contrary to the spirit and terms of the Mandate and inconsistent with the assurances granted by the British Government with respect to Jewish immigration.

The High Commissioner of Palestine had, himself, approved the immigration certificates to the new settlers but they have been revoked on purely political grounds.

Protest meetings are being held all over the country and in Europe. Mr. Felix M. Warburg, Chairman of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency recently addressed a protest in the name of the Agency, to the Jewish Embassador at Washington, for transmission to his government.

June 10, 1930 The Honorable Henry L. Stimson Secretary of State Washington, D. C. Dear Sir: At a meeting held in the City of Cleveland, on Monday, June 9th, 1930, at the synogogue of The Jewish Center, East 105th Street and Drexel Avenue, attended by many thousands of Jews representing all classes of the community, under the sponsership of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and presided over by Rabbi Harry S. Davidowitz, the following sets of resolutions were unanimously adopted: HEREAS the policies purused by the British Government since the August riots and especially its present suspension of Jewish Labor immigration into Palestine is contrary to the terms and spirit of the Mandate, and WHEREAS the said policy is inconsistent with the promises and obligations of the British Government to the Jewish people, and WHEREAS a continuation of said policy and a failure to revoke said order of suspension tends towards the encouragement of unstable conditions in Palestine, engenders feeling of hostility of one segment of the population toward the other and embitters the Jewish population of Palestine and of the world, and WHEREAS the arbitrary order of suspension of Jewish Labor immigration into Palestine is predicated upon conditions wholly unrelated to the economic possibilities of Palestine, but is purely political in character, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we join with the protest lodged with the British Government by The Jewish Agency and Dr. Chaim Weizmann, against the arbitrary suspension of Jewish Labor immigration certificates, after their approval by the High Commissioner, and THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Jews of Cleveland, assembled at this meeting, protest against the unwarranted suspension of immigration of Jewish Labor into Palestine and urge upon the

British Government to immediately revoke said order, also WHEREAS the British Government issued the so-called "White Paper" in which it accepts, generally, the findings of the Shaw Palestine Inquiry Commission and forwarded same to The Permanent Mandates Commission of The League of Nations, and WHEREAS the conclusion in the reports are contrary to the facts. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that to protest against the issuance of the said "White Paper" the conclusions therein end the forwarding of the same to The Permanent Mendates Commission of The League of Nations. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of these resolutions, adopted this evening, be forwarded to the British Colonial Office and to the Secretariat of The League of Nations in Geneva, Switzerland, and with Honorable Henry L. Stimson, Secretary of State. Pursuant to the adoption of the Resolutions same are forwarded to you with the request that they be handed to the Representative of the British Government. 
