
Dear Mr. Sicklick:





I am taking the liberty of writing to you rather than to Dr. Silver, as we have had correspondence in the past pertaining to Bonds donated by his Foundation.



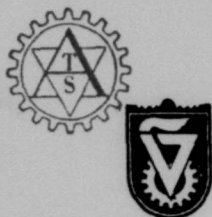

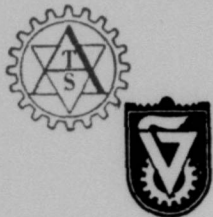
Dear Rabbi Silver:

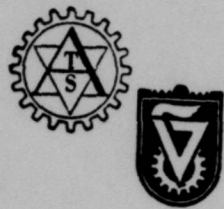

A reservation has been made for you at the Hotel Webster Hall. Please advise us here when you plan to leave Cleveland so that we can meet you at the station Tuesday.

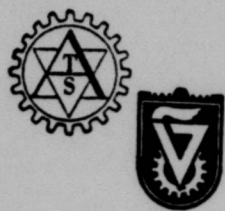


