A CALL TO PRAYER ON D-DAY

Issued by the Synagogue Council of America

The forces of freedom are marshalled against the forces of oppression.

The day of reckoning is nigh at hand. Humanity is facing the severest test in history. With God's aid the outcome is certain. With utmost faith in the justice of our cause and with confidence in the triumph of liberty over tyranny, we join our brothers in the armed forces of the United Nations in rededicating ourselves to the ideals for which we are fighting.

In manifestation of our spiritual unity with our armed forces, the Synagogue Council of America, representing all religious branches of American Jewry, calls upon Jewish religious leaders in the country to convoke their communities for a special Service of prayer and rededication at 8:00 P.M., following the announcement of the launching of the invasion of enemy-held Europe by the armed forces of the United Nations. Synagogues should remain open for prayer all day on D-Day. We do not know what day or hour the invasion will come, but the least we can do is to establish our spiritual kinship with our sons and brothers who will be plunging into the crucial battle of the war for human freedom.

The above call should be read from pulpits at weekly Sabbath services until D-Day and published in Congregational bulletins.
